PROCLAMATION

Friday, the 20th day of May, 1910,

the day appointed for the funeral of His late Most Gracious Majesty King Edward VII., a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the said State, in order to permit of the attendance of the public at the Memorial Services in connection with His late Majesty's funeral.
