WHEREAS by Section 3 of "The Electric Lighting Act, 1892," it is provided that any Municipal Council may, subject to the provisions of the Act, supply electricity for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the Act within the limits of the Municipality, or within such other limits as the Governor may by Proclamation approve and allow: And whereas it is desirable that the Council of the Midland Junction Municipality should be authorised to supply electricity within the district of the Guildford Municipality: Now therefore I, the Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the supply

of electricity by the Council of the Midland Junction Municipality within the district of the Guildford Municipality is approved and allowed, subject to the following conditions:—

- (a.) The above extension and supply shall be subject to any by-laws which may from time to time be approved under "The Electric Lighting Act of 1892," and the amendment Acts, and shall be maintained in an efficient state to the satisfaction of the Minister for Works.
- (b.) That in the event of the Government requiring the removal of the poles and cables, or any portion of the installation, the undertakers shall remove the same at their own expense upon receiving three months' notice in writing to that effect.
- (c.) The Government shall not be held responsible in any way for claims which may arise from any cause, either during the construction or working of the line.

The state of the shoot or opening shall then be reported to the manager or person for the time being in charge of the underground mining work, who shall be responsible for the methods adopted for freeing it.

67. (b.) Quarters will, when possible, be provided. In other cases rent allowances may be granted, at the discretion of the Minister. The allowances shall not exceed the following sums, except in the North-West or on the Goldfields:—

Schools of Class I.	..	£71 10s.
" " II.	..	£65 0s.
" " III.	..	£58 10s.
" " IV.	..	£52 0s.
" " V.	..	£39 0s.
" " VI.	..	£26 0s.

The sum to be granted in each case shall be fixed by the Minister, after taking into consideration the scale of rents in the particular locality, and the number of persons in the Teacher's family.

Reg. 67.—Delete present scale for "B" Provisional Schools and read as follows:—

"B" Schools below 15—Male, £90 to £100; Female £70 to £90.

In the case of schools more than five miles from a railway station the minimum shall be £100 for male teachers, and £80 for female teachers.

Reg. 71.—Delete present scale for unclassified assistants, and read as follows:—

Unclassified—Male £90 to £110; Female £70 to £90.

In the case of unclassified assistants employed away from their homes the minimum shall be £100 for male teachers, and £80 for female teachers.

Add to Regulation 145:—

"The Friday preceding and the Tuesday following the Monday on which the Anniversary of the Colony is celebrated shall also be school holidays."

Reg. 147.—Delete "An Inspector may grant a holiday not exceeding one day, within a fortnight after one inspection in each year."
