WHEREAS by "The Circuit Courts Act, 1897," it is enacted that the Governor may, from time to time, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, declare that such portions of the State of Western Australia as he thinks fit shall form Circuit Districts, and shall assign a name to each of such Districts, and define the boundaries of the same respectively; and may, in like manner, increase or decrease the number of such districts, and may alter the name and boundaries of any Circuit District; and a sitting of the Supreme Court shall be held in every such District once at least every three months, at a time and place to be appointed by the Governor by the like or any subsequent Proclamation: And whereas by a Proclamation dated 22nd day of May, 1902, the then Governor declared by and with the advice of the Executive Council, that a portion of the State contained within the boundaries defined in the said Proclamation be constituted a Circuit District, to be known as the Eastern Goldfields Circuit District, and appointed the third Wednesday in June as one of the times at which a sitting of the Supreme Court should be held at Kalgoorlie, in the said District: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the time for holding the said sitting of the Supreme Court: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the fourth Wednesday in June next, in lieu of the third Wednesday in June next, as the time at which a sitting of the Supreme Court shall be held at Kalgoorlie in the said District.

When any shoot or opening used for drawing off ore from stopes worked on the shrinkage system, or ore, ore from stopes worked on the shrinkage system, or ore, mullock, rock, or sand from stopes in which such material has been used for filling, has become jammed or obstructed with ore, rock, mullock, or sand "hung up" in it, no person shall go up into it beneath the obstruction unless and until all other practicable means have been exhausted of causing the ore, rock, mullock, or sand to run or become free. By-law No. 29-Motor Vehicles. Amendment.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth do hereby repeal sections 26, 27, 28, and 29 of By-law No. 29, for regulating the licensing and use of Motor Vehicles.

CITY OF PERTH. By-law No. 33.

Motor Cars for Hire.

A By-law of the Municipality of the City of Perth made under Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 33, providing for the issue of licenses for the keeping and driving of Motor Cars for the carriage of passengers for hire.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth order as follows:—

1. In the construction of this By-law unless the con-

1. In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires, the word "Car" shall mean and include any motor car, automobile, or other carriage or vehicle propelled either wholly or partly by any volatile spirit, steam, or electricity, or by any other means than animal power.

- 2. No car shall be kept for the purpose of plying for hire unless and until a license shall have first been obtained for the same, and except during the currency of such license, and if any car shall be so kept the owner thereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.
- 3. No person shall act as a driver of any car plying for hire without having a valid and subsisting license from the Council so to act, which license the Council is authorised to grant on being satisfied that the person applying for the same is a person of good character and proper skill and fitness and competent to perform the duties of a driver.
- 4. An application for a license under this By-law for a car shall be made by the owner or his duly authorised agent in the form prescribed in Schedule "A" hereto
- 5. An application for a license under this By-law as "driver" of a car shall be made by the applicant in the form prescribed in Schedule "B" hereto.
- 6. The fees to be paid for licenses under this By-law shall be as follows:—
 - (a.) For a license for a car a fee of 10s. for each person (exclusive of the driver) which the car is licensed to carry, with a minimum fee of £2.
 - (b.) For a license as a driver of a car the sum of 10s.
- 7. Every license issued under this By-law shall expire on the 31st day of October next after the same shall be granted. Provided that in respect of any license granted after the 30th day of April in any year, the fee payable for such year shall be one-half of the annual fee for such license.
- 8. The Council, upon any application to license a car under this By-law, shall cause an inspection to be made of the car to which the same shall relate, and shall not grant a license unless such car shall be found to be in a fit and proper condition for public use.
- 9. The license for a car licensed under this By-law shall be in the form of Schedule "C" hereto.
- 10. No license shall be granted for any car, and no person shall cause or permit to be used or shall drive a car licensed under this By-law in any street or in any public place unless—
 - (a.) The car shall have two independent brakes in good working order, and of such efficiency that the application of either shall cause the two wheels on one of the axles to be so held that they shall be effectually prevented from revolving or shall have the same effect in stopping the car as if such wheels were so held.
 - (b.) The car shall be so constructed as to admit of its being at all times under such control as not to cause undue interference with traffic on any street or public place.
 - on any street or public place.

 (c.) The car and all fittings thereon shall be in such a condition as not to cause or be likely to cause danger to any person in the car or any street or public place.
- 11. If any person shall acquire a car licensed under this By-law during the currency of the license thereof, he shall, upon production of the license, and upon payment of the sum of 5s., be entitled to have a license issued to him in respect of such car for the balance of the term for which the original license was granted.

 12. The license for a driver of a car licensed under this By-law shall be in the form of Schedule "D" to this By-law shall be in the form of Schedule "D" to convert the property of th
- 12. The license for a driver of a car licensed under this By-law shall be in the form of Schedule "D" to this By-law, and shall be issued in duplicate. One copy of such license, to be called the "original," shall be lodged by the driver with his employer at the time of his being employed, to be retained by such employer during the time of such employment, and the other copy, to be called the "duplicate," shall be retained by the driver, who shall not lend or part with the same.

 13. The owner of a car licensed under this By-law shall always have an efficient silencer attached to such
- 13. The owner of a car licensed under this By-law shall always have an efficient silencer attached to such car in full and efficient working order, and always connected with the proper portion of the engine of such car, so as to reduce by at least 40 per cent. the noise which would otherwise result from the working of the engine of such car, and shall not in any case have attached to such silencer or otherwise connected therewith any device or machinery whereby such silencer may be rendered inefficient or unworkable or its efficiency in any way lessened.

 14. The owner of any car licensed under this By-law
- 14. The owner of any car licensed under this By-law shall, when required by the Traffic Inspector or any police constable, furnish the name and address of the person driving such car at any particular time.

- 15. The licensed driver of a car licensed under this By-law shall be constantly in attendance on the same, whilst it is standing on a public stand or plying for hire.
- 16. The licensed driver of a car licensed under this By-law shall not suffer any unlicensed person to drive the same whilst plying for hire.
- 17. No person under the age of 17 years shall be licensed under this By-law as a driver of a car.
- 18. No driver of any car licensed under this By-law shall allow more than the number of persons for which such car shall be licensed to be carried in or by the same, and no person shall enter such car after he shall be informed by the driver that the same has already the full number of passengers.
- 19. The driver of any car licensed under this By-law shall stop the same upon demand by the Traffic Inspector or other duly authorised officer of the Council, to enable such Inspector or officer to count the number of passengers, or to ascertain the name of any person who may be offending against this By-law.
- 20. No driver of any car licensed under this By-law shall, except whilst on an appointed stand, permit his vehicle to stand or loiter in any part of the City longer than may be absolutely necessary for taking up or setting down passengers, and no such driver shall wilfully, wrongfully, or forcibly prevent or endeavour to prevent the driver of any other licensed vehicle from taking a fare.
- 21. No driver, except upon request of a police constable, shall carry in or upon any car licensed under this By-law any person in the state of intoxication, or any person who so noisily conducts himself as to occasion annoyance to any passenger, or to disturb the public peace.
- 22. The driver of any car licensed under this By-law having agreed to convey a fare to any given point shall do so by the most direct route available and without delay.
- 23. No driver shall smoke whilst driving any car licensed under this By-law conveying any passenger.
- 24. No person shall drive a car licensed under this By-law in any street or way between sunset and sunrise unless there shall be attached thereto two lamps, so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light in the direction in which the said car is proceeding, or intending to proceed, and one lamp so constructed and placed as to exhibit a red light from the rear of such car; and all such lamps shall, during such time as aforesaid, and whilst such car is in such street or way, be kept lighted, and shall show a light sufficiently clear and strong to afford adequate means of indicating the approach and position of such car.
- 25. No person shall drive a car in any street or way unless there is attached thereto a proper bell, horn, or other instrument which shall be capable of giving audible and sufficient warning of the approach and position of such car.
- 26. Every driver of a car licensed under this By-law shall, whenever necessary, by sounding a bell, horn, or other instrument, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach and position thereof.
- 27. No person shall drive a car licensed under this By-law upon any footpath, except when crossing to or from any premises at a regulation crossing place.
- 28. No person shall drive a car licensed under this By-law backwards for a greater distance or time than the necessity of the case or the purposes of safety shall require.
- 29. The driver of any car licensed under this By-law shall, if an accident occur to any person, or to any horse or carriage, owing to the presence of the car in the street, stop and remain stationary for a reasonable time, and shall give his name and address if required by any constable or officer of the Council, or by any person acting on behalf of the person injured, or of the owner of the property damaged.
- 30. Every person driving a car licensed under this By-law who shall meet or overtake any animal which shall become restive or alarmed, shall stop such car, and shall remain stationary as long as may be reasonably necessary.
- 31. The driver of a car licensed under this By-law, whilst driving the same in or along a street or way, shall keep the same on the left hand or near side of street or way.

- 32. The driver of a car licensed under this By-law shall, when passing any other vehicle or any animal proceeding in an opposite direction along any street or way, keep such other vehicle or animal on his right.
- 33. No person shall drive a car licensed under this By-law—
 - (a.) Across the intersection or round the corner of any streets or ways at a speed exceeding four miles an hour.
 - (b.) Within the area bounded on the East by the East side of Pier Street, on the West by the West side of King Street, on the North by the North side of Wellington Street, and on the South by the South side of Hay Street, at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour.
 - (c.) Within any other portion of the municipality at a speed exceeding twelve miles an hour.
 - (d.) At any time or in any portion of the municipality recklessly or negligently, or at a speed, or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to the nature, condition, and use of the street or way, and the amount of traffic then upon, or which might be reasonably expected to be on such street or way.
- 34. No driver of a car licensed under this By-law shall, when on such vehicle, be in a position in which he cannot have control over the same, nor shall he quit the car without having stopped the machinery and taken due precautions against its starting in his absence, or allow the car to stand on such street so as to cause an unnecessary obstruction.
- 35. No person shall drive any car licensed under this By-law in any street or public place abreast of, or side by side with more than one other vehicle, except when taking part in a duly authorised parade or procession.
- 36. Every driver of a car licensed under this By-law when taking up or setting down passengers in any street, or when waiting for any such purpose, shall act under the direction of any officer of the Corporation or police constable who may be on duty in such street.
- 37. The Traffic Inspector or other authorised officer of the Council may, at any time, order the driver of any car licensed under this By-law to remove such car from any public stand or street in the municipality, if the same shall, in his opinion, be so dirty or otherwise in such a condition as to be unfit for public use.
- 38. No person shall use or drive a car licensed under this By-law in the said municipality unless there shall be fixed in a conspicuous position in the front and on the back thereof a rectangular plate in an upright position, upon which is inscribed the licensed number of the said car, together with the distinguishing letter of the municipality, in characters of not less than 3½ inches high, and of corresponding breadth, painted in white on a red ground, so that the inscription upon such plates shall be easily distinguishable from in front or behind, as the case may be; and no person shall use or drive any such car in the said City between sunset and sunrise unless the said plates shall be so illuminated that the inscriptions thereon shall easily be distinguishable.
- 39. No driver of any licensed car shall carry or permit to be carried in or upon such car any person other than the hirer thereof, except with the consent of such hirer
- 40. No owner or driver of any licensed car shall, at any time, without having in each case previously obtained the written consent of the Council, place, or suffer or permit to be placed, on the outside of such car for advertising purposes any notice, advertisement, or printed bill, or any name, letter, device, design, picture, or number.
- 41 The following stands are hereby appointed as stands for cars licensed under this By-law, viz.:—
 - (1.) A stand in the centre of St. George's Terrace, beginning at a point 81 feet West of the West side of Barrack Street, and extending Westwards for a distance of 79 feet, then after a break of 51/4 chains extending a further distance of 4 chains.

 The cars upon this stand shall face Eastwards,

and each car taking up a position on the stand shall take up its position at the rear of the rearmost car then upon the stand, and as soon as any car leaves the stand the cars standing at the rear of such car shall immediately close up.

- (2.) A stand for one car only in the centre of St.

 George's Terrace, beginning at a point 33
 feet East of the Eastern side of Barrack
 Street.
- (3.) A stand in the centre of St. George's Terrace, beginning at a point 80 feet East of the Eastern side of Barrack Street, and extending Eastwards one chain.
- (4.) A stand in the centre of St. George's Terrace, beginning at a point five feet West of the Western side of William Street, and extending Westwards three chains.
- 42. Cars licensed under this By-law shall take their places upon the appointed stands in the order of their arrival there, and when any car shall be called or driven off any stand, the driver of the car immediately behind shall draw the same up to the place thus vacated, and the drivers of the cars in the rear shall follow up in like manner. Provided that after every fourth car on any stand there shall be left a space of eight feet for foot passengers to pass through, and after every eighth car a space of eighteen feet for vehicles to pass through.
- 43. Whenever at any theatre, place of entertainment, or public meeting, the Traffic Inspector shall deem it necessary so to do, he may appoint temporary stands for engaged and disengaged cars respectively, and every driver of a car licensed under this By-law shall take such place upon any such stand as the Traffic Inspector shall direct
 - 44. No licensed driver shall-
 - (a.) Place his car upon a temporary stand appointed for engaged cars unless his car is actually engaged.
 - (b.) Accept an engagement whilst his car is standing upon a temporary stand appointed for engaged cars
- 45. Should the Traffic Inspector at any time be of opinion that it is necessary to move any car from any appointed stand or place, it shall be lawful for him to direct the driver of the same to move to any place he shall deem fit, and any driver who shall refuse to obey such directions shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- 46. The driver of any car licensed under this By-law shall at all times, whilst plying for hire, or whilst on any stand, act under the directions of the Traffic Inspector, and any driver who shall refuse to obey such directions shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- 47. Every car licensed under this By-law standing on a public stand shall be deemed to be plying for hire, and the driver thereof shall immediately upon demand, and upon the tender of the amount legally chargeable, take any fare if not previously engaged.
- 48. If at any place other than on a public stand the driver of a car licensed under this By-law shall solicit engagement by word of mouth or sign, he shall immediately upon demand, and upon tender of the amount lawfully chargeable, take any fare then offering.
- 49. The rates and fares which may be lawfully charged by the driver or owner of any car licensed under this By-law for the hire thereof shall be those set out in Schedule "E" to this By-law.
- 50. It shall be the duty of the owner and driver of every car licensed under this By-law to fix or cause to be fixed and to keep fixed inside such car in such a conspicuous position as to be easily seen by any passenger therein, a copy of the table of rates and fares for the time being chargeable under this By-law printed in clear and legible characters.
- 51. No licensed driver shall demand from any passenger more than the fare or rate fixed by this By-law, and if any person pay such driver on demand any sum exceeding the legal fare, he may recover the same summarily, and such driver shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- 52. Any passenger by a car licensed under this By-law who shall refuse to pay the legal fare or rate payable by him in accordance with this By-law shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- 53. Every person travelling by any car may take with him ordinary personal luggage belonging to him not exceeding in weight 28lbs. without any charge being made for the carriage thereof, but shall pay a sum not exceeding 6d. for every 28lbs. or fractional part thereof in excess of such weight irrespective of the distance the same may be carried.

54. The Town Clerk may, by notice in writing, require any driver licensed under this By-law against whom a complaint has been made of committing an offence against this By-law to attend before the General Purposes Committee of the Council to show cause why his license should not be suspended or cancelled, and if he shall fail to attend pursuant to such notice or to show good cause to the contrary, the said Committee may, by notice in writing in the form of Schedule "F" to this By-law suspend or cancel the license of such driver

55. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.
