WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1892," the Governor may, from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, declare that any animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof: And whereas it is deemed desirable that the opossum shall be strictly preserved throughout the State: Now therefore I, Sir Gerald Strickland, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the opossum shall be at all times strictly preserved throughout the State for two years commencing from September 1st, 1910.

Skinner Street (closed) Cemetery, Fremantle. Proposed By-laws and Regulations under Section 14 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897" (61 Viet., No. 23), and Section 10 of "The Cemeteries Act Amendment Act, 1902," for the management of the closed Skinner Street Cemétery, Fremantle.

By virtue of powers vested in them, the Board of Trustees make the following By-laws and Regulations:-

- 1. N.B.-All applications, payments, etc., shall be made at the office of the Board. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees as set forth in Schedule an-nexed are to be paid at the time when the applications are made or orders given for the specified works.
- Any person desiring to erect any headstone, monument, kerb, railing or enclosure on the grave of any person or persons already buried there at the time of application shall make application for permission for same on prescribed form, abide by the regulations hereinafter set forth, and pay the scheduled fees.
- 3. All applications for interments for which the necessary sanction of the Governor-in-Council and of the Trustees shall first have been granted actually or by implication, shall be made on the form provided in time to allow at least six (6) working hours' notice being given to the Caretaker prior to the time fixed for the burial; such form to contain name, age, late place of residence, and other particulars as required on the form.
- 4. Every coffin shall have, at the foot thereof, a stamped lead plate bearing name of deceased in legible characters.
- No interment shall be allowed which does not provide for three (3) feet of covering over the coffin.
- No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery without a certificate that the death has been registreed by the District Registrar of Deaths or a Coroner's order for burial.
- 7. No interment shall take place on any day except between the hours of 1 and 5 p.m., and no vehicle will be allowed to enter the Cemetery gates.
- Every new erection over graves shall be placed on suitable foundations, if required, to the full depth of the grave to the satisfaction of the Board, and all rubbish, etc., to be removed immediately after completion; failing which the Board shall have power to remove same and recover the cost thereof from the person or persons responsible therefor.
- If, in the opinion of the Board, it is deemed advisable to exhume a body or bodies from the closed Cemetery for re-interment in the new Cemetery, it shall be lawful (in the absence of any next of kin able or willing to bear the expense) for the Board to defray the necessary costs out of the Old Cemetery funds. The Board shall be empowered to receive and expend all Treasury grants, and all voluntary donations or subscriptions, on improvements of the Cemetery at their discretion ..

- 13. Children under ten (10) years of age shall not be admitted unless in charge of some responsible person.
- No dogs will be admitted in the Cemetery. dogs found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 15. Any persons violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, or any erection or in any way infringing "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," or its Amendment, or any By-law or Regulation made for protecting the Cemetery, shall be liable to prosecution.
- 16. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the Cemetery grounds any trade, business, or calling either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatever.
- 17. No person employed by the Board shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whilst in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be be pecuniarily interested in any work other than that for which he receives payment from the Board.
- 18. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued to gardeners or other approved persons by the Board; such licenses to be renewed annually.

Subject to the direction of the Board, the Secretary shall exercise a general supervision over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery.

Special By-laws for controlling Railway Well, Town Tank, and other Water Supplies under Board's control. HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws by virtue of Section 117 of "The Roads Act, 1902":—

- 1. No person shall bathe in any tank, spring, or other water situate within any reserve specially set apart for purpose of water supply.
- 2. No person shall encamp upon any land specially set apart for purpose of water supply, or permit any animal to remain on such land any longer than is necessary for the purpose of taking water.
- 3. No person shall bring or deposit, into or upon any reserve specially set apart for the purpose of water supply, any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome thing, or wash or cleanse within any such reserve any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any other material or thing whatsoever.
- 4. Any person who shall cause or permit the water 4. Any person who shall cause or permit the water of any mining shaft, or of any sink, sewer, drain, or cesspit, or other filthy water, to find its way into any stream, catchdrain, tank, reservoir, dam, lake, lagoon, soak, spring, or other water situate within any such reserve aforesaid, or shall do any act or thing whereby the water shall be fouled, shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty imposed by these regulations.
- 5. The Board may at any time restrict the water in any of the dams, tanks, etc., for human consumption only, by affixing a notice to that effect in a conspicuous place at the dam or tank in question.

- (a.) The well on Reserve 5105 is restricted to town and travelling public for watering stock on such reserve, and no water shall be taken or carted therefrom without having first obtained a permit of the Board in writing, at a cost of one shilling-as per Schedule A.
- (b.) No person shall remove water therefrom for purpose of sale or profit without first obtaining a license from the Board, at a cost of two shillings and sixpence, as per Schedule B., and deposit a sum of £1 with Board, from which payment for water will be deducted at the rate of sixpence per 100 gallons or part thereof.
- (c.) Such permits or licenses will be issued by the Board at and during their pleasure, and remain in force only during such time as the conduct of the holder is satisfactory to the Board, and may be cancelled by them at any time.
- (d.) All persons in charge of stock watering on reserve shall control same, and provide access to well for persons obtaining water, and promptly comply with instructions of Board or its officers.
- (e.) No person shall bring in or unto any reserve any animal suffering with any disease.

Amendment of Regulations.

Education Department,

Perth, 1st June, 1910.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to revoke the following Regulations of the been pleased to revoke the following Regulations of the Education Department, namely, Regulations 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, 80, 81, 83, 84, 85, 86, and 92, as amended on the 25th of March, 1910 (vide Government Gazette of 1st April, 1910), and Appendix VIII., as amended on the 8th February, 1910 (vide Government Gazette of 11th February, 1910), and to make the following Regulations and Appendix in place thereof and Appendix in place thereof.

> CECIL ANDREWS Inspector General of Schools.

- 73. Monitors may be employed to serve in Schools where the average attendance is at least 30. They may be of two classes—Junior Monitors and Senior Monitors.
- 74. Candidates for the office of Monitor must be not less than 14 or more than 18 years old. They must be free from any bodily infirmity likely to impair their usefulness, and must be of good moral character. On appointment a satisfactory medical certificate must be furnished, on the form provided by the Department, and an agreement entered into. The first three months of appointment will be on probation.
- Candidates will, as a rule, be required to pass the examination prescribed for Candidates for Junior Moni-torship (see Appendix I.). Applicants whose age, qualifications, experience, etc., make them eligible to sit for the Senior Monitors' Examination may do so by special permission of the Department.
- 76. Candidates who have passed the Adelaide University Preliminary Examination may be excused from sitting in the Examination for Candidates for Junior Monitorship for those subjects in which they have passed.

Candidates who have passed the Junior or Senior Adelaide or some other equivalent University Examination, not more than one year previously, are eligible to be appointed Monitors without examination; they will, however, be required to serve one month on trial without salary. If their age is suitable, they may, at the discretion of the Department, be admitted to sit at the following Senior Monitors' Examination.

- The remuneration of Monitors shall consist of (a) instruction to be given by the Head Teacher or by the staff of the Normal School, and (b) an annual salary. The Head Teacher will be responsible for seeing that the time prescribed for study is properly allocated, and the work diligently done, and for giving instruction and assistance.
- 78. Salaries shall be paid to Monitors at the following rates:

Before a Monitor can draw the Senior salary he must have passed the examination prescribed for Senior Moni-

An additional sum not exceeding £5 per annum for Juniors or £10 for Seniors may be granted to Monitors in the Goldfields and Special Schools where the cost of living is very high.

- 80. Senior Monitors in their second year will be required to sit for the "C" Examination. Those who fail to pass may, if the Department is satisfied as to their competency, be appointed as unclassified teachers.
- 81. Junior Monitors will assist teachers in the Schools during five half-days in each week: the other five half-days will be devoted to study. Senior Monitors will be employed in teaching during eight half-days in each week: the other two half-days will be devoted to study.
- In country schools, when the attendance warrants the appointment of a Monitor, and a suitable applicant, under Regulations 74, 75, and 76 is not obtainable, a temporary "Monitor on Supply" may be appointed if the Inspector's report is satisfactory. The salary will be within the limits of the scale set out in Regulation 78, but the exact amount will be fixed by the Department. Appointments made under this Regulation will, of course, lapse when a suitable person is obtained, unless the appointee has qualified in the meantime, and is of suitable age. Monitors on Supply may be employed in the School during the whole week, unless they are preparing to sit for a Departmental Examination. Those preparing for an examination must be given at least two half-days in each week for their studies. The Head Teacher will be responsible for giving them instruction, and for supervising and directing their studies.
- A limited number of candidates who have passed the Examination for Candidates for Junior Monitorship will be selected for a course of two years in the Perth Normal School. They will not be attached as Monitors to any State School. They will not receive any salary, but will be provided with the necessary books free of charge, will be provided with the necessary books free of charge, and will have their necessary daily travelling expenses, if any, paid. Their parents or guardians will be required to sign an agreement, binding the selected candidates to enter the Training College, if the Department wishes them to do so, or, if not chosen for the Training College, to serve the Department, if required, for not less than three years from the expiration of their course in the School. Selected candidates whose homes are outside the Metropolitan District way at the discretion of the Mini-Metropolitan District may, at the discretion of the Minister, be granted a lodging allowance of £20 per annum. At the end of the two years' course in the Normal School the scholars will be employed as Full Time Monitors with salaries at the rate of £36 per annum for females and £50 per annum for males. Those selected for the Training per annum for males. Those selected for the Training College may enter the College in the following September, if their practical skill is considered satisfactory. wise they may be required to wait until a subsequent year. The salaries of those who do not enter the College will, during the following year, if their service is satisfactory, be at the rate of £45 per annum for females and £60 per annum for males. They may be allowed to sit for the "C" Examination in the second year of their Monitorship.
- 85. Monitors may be appointed to Manual Training Classes. Such Monitors shall be subject to the usual conditions, except that they shall be required, in addition, to pass an examination in Woodwork, and that a special curriculum shall be specified in Practical Plane and Solid Geometry and Scale and Art Drawing. They may be Geometry and Scale and Art Drawing. They may be allowed to omit Geography, History, Music, and Drill. At the expiration of their engagement these Monitors shall be required to here. required to pass an examination equivalent to that of the City and Guilds of London Institute, as well as the prescribed portion of the "C" Examination. They may then be employed as Teachers in Manual Training Classes, but shall attend lectures for further instruction in Manual Training. Half-time Manual Training Monitors shall receive their general instruction in the State School to which the Manual Training Centre is attached.
- Monitors may also be appointed to Cookery and Laundry classes. Such monitors shall be subject to the usual conditions, except that Senior Monitors shall be required, in addition, to pass an Examination in Domestic Economy, Elementary Physiology, Cookery, and Laundry Work. They may be allowed to omit Geography, History, Music, Geometrical Drawing, and Drill. At the expiration of their engagement these Monitors shall be required to pass a special examination in Domestic Economy, including Elementary Chemistry, Elementary Physiology, Elementary Botany, Cookery, and Laundry Work, both in theory and practice, as well as the prescribed portion of the 'C'' Certificate. They may then be employed as Teachers in Cookery and Laundry Classes. Junior Monitors shall receive their general instruction in the State tors shall receive their general instruction in the State School to which the Cookery and Laundry Centre is attached.

92. The Final Examination at the Normal School and the Senior Monitors' Examination will be the Entrance Examinations for the Training College. Candidates who have not been in the Normal School or served as Monitors, and who gain a sufficiently high place in the Examination, will be required to attend a State School for three months without pay, and to give evidence of their fitness for the profession before entering the College. The Minister may, in special cases, allow other persons to attend the Training College as boarders or day-boarders at their own expense.

Evidence of teaching capacity may be required.

The minimum age at which candidates may enter the College is 17 years, and the course of training will, as a rule, be for two years. Scholarships will be provided to defray the cost of training of those highest on the examination list, who will receive board, lodging, and tuition free. Should winners of Scholarships be residing with parents or friends they may become day-boarders, and, in addition to free tuition, may receive a money Scholarship towards their maintenance of £30 per annum.

Appendix VIII. GOVERNMENT EXHIBITIONS. Regulations.

1. The Exhibitions will be divided into Senior and Junior Classes.

Five Senior Exhibitions, of the value of £25 each, will be offered for candidates of either sex who have not reached the age of 18; and Eight Junior Exhibitions of the value of £15 each, tenable for one year, will be offered for candidates of either sex between the ages of 14 and 16 years.

- 2. The course of examination for seniors and juniors will be, respectively, that laid down for the Senior and Junior Adelaide University Examinations, or equivalent examinations conducted by examines appointed by the Education Department. Candidates for the Senior Exhibitions may also take any subject or subjects in the Adelaide Higher Public Examination, and the marks received (subject to the provision in the following clause) will be added to the marks obtained in the Senior Examination.
- 3. Only seven subjects in the Senior and Junior Examinations respectively will be taken into consideration. If a candidate sits for a larger number of subjects, the seven in which he obtains the best results will be counted.
- 4. Candidates must not be less than 14 nor more than 18 years of age on the first day of November in the year in which the examination is held, and must have resided in the State for two years on the first day of the month in which the examination is held.
- 5. A preliminary examination will be held by the Department, in the previous month, in the following subjects:—

English.
English Composition.
Arithmetic.
Dictation.

- 6. The Department will pay the fees for the first ten junior candidates and for the first six senior candidates who pass the preliminary examination.
