PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Gerald Strickland, Count della Catenn, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the Claremont Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of Claremont be declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, 2321/10. said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

By-laws.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Meekatharra, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

- 1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule "A" shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.
- 2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Secretary. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at least six working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be headed in in such time as to allow of at least six work. be handed in in such time as to allow of at least six working hours as above.
- 4. The undertaker shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened, as and when required by the Trustees.
- 5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the undertaker.
- 6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 4 feet 6 inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.
- 7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

- 8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from the District Registrar of Deaths, that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial, is handed to the Secretary.
 - The hours of burial shall be as follows:-From 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.;

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

- 10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.
- No hearse, mourning coach, bicycle, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

 13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.
- 14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower border, or any erection, or in any way infringing these By-laws, commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 16. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.
- 17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any work shall be liable to summary dismissal.
- 18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein is proposed to inter therein.
- 19. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.
- 20. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.
- 21. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.
- 22. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.
- 23. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.
- 24. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."
- 25. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.
- 26. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

- 27. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.
- 28. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Secretary.
- 29. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than four inches broad thall he provided to expect the expectation. shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.
- 30. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workmen permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees, commits an offence against these By-
- 31. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—
 - (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
 - (b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.
 - (c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.
 - (d.) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.
- No person not being an undertaker licensed by the Trustees shall undertake or conduct any funeral in the cemetery, unless by special permission first obtained from the Trustees and payment of the prescribed fee.
- 33. The license of any undertaker may be cancelled by the Trustees for any breach of these By-laws.
- 34. All graves required by the undertaker who contracts with the Government for pauper burials shall be supplied by himself, and shall be dug in such place as the Trustees shall direct.
- Any person committing a breach of these Bylaws shall thereupon be forthwith removable from the cemetery by the Trustees or secretary and shall be treated as a trespasser and may be proceeded against accordingly in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.
- 36. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the case of a continuing breach, not exceeding One pound for every day during which such breach continues.
- All fees may be recovered and all proceedings under these By-laws may be taken before two justices in petty sessions except when otherwise provided for.
- 38. The Secretary as referred to in these By-laws means the person for the time being employed by the Trustees as such for the cemetery, and such a person shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery and to the carrying out the enforcement of these By-laws, and the direction of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

ROADS ACT, 1902. KATANNING ROAD BOARD.

Special By-laws for controlling Railway Well, Town Tank, and other Water Supplies under Board's con-

His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws by virtue of Section 117 of "The Roads Act, 1902":—

- 1. No person shall bathe in any tank, spring, or other water situate within any reserve specially set apart for purpose of water supply.
- 2. No person shall encamp upon any land specially set apart for purpose of water supply, or permit any animal to remain on such land any longer than is necessary for the purpose of taking water.
- any reserve specially set apart for purpose of water supply, any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome thing, or wash or cleanse within any such reserve any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any other material or thing whatsoever. 3. No person shall bring or deposit, into or upon
- 4. Any person who shall cause or permit the water of any mining shaft, or of any sink, sewer, drain, or cesspit, or other filthy water, to find its way into any stream, catch-drain, tank, reservoir, dam, lake, lagoon, soak, spring, or other water situate within any such reserve aforesaid, or shall do any act or thing whereby the water shall be fouled, shall for each such offence be liable to the penalty imposed by these regulations.
- 5. The Board may at any time restrict the water in any of the dams, tanks, etc., for human consumption only, by affixing a notice to that effect in a conspicuous place at the dam or tank in question.
- 6. (a.) The Well on Reserve 5105 is restricted to Town and travelling public for watering stock on such reserve, and no water shall be taken or carted therefrom without having first obtained a permit of the Board in writing, at a cost of one shilling, as per Schedule A.
- No person shall remove water therefrom for (b.)purpose of sale or profit without first obtaining a license from the Board, at a cost of two shillings and sixpence, as per Schedule B, and deposit a sum of £1 with Board, from which payment for water will be deducted at the rate of sixpence per 100 gallons or part thereof.

- (c.) Such permits or licenses will be issued by the Board at and during their pleasure, and remain in force only during such time as the conduct of the holder is satisfactory to the Board, and may be cancelled by them at any time.
- (d.) All persons in charge of stock watering on reserves shall control same, and provide access to well for persons obtaining water, and promptly comply with instructions of Board or its officers.
- (e.) No person shall bring in or unto the reserve any animal suffering with any disease.
