WHEREAS by Section 3 of "The Electric Lighting Act, 16002"; it is invested by the section 1 of the most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependence, etc., etc.

1892," it is provided that any Municipal Council may, subject to the provisions of the Act, supply electricity for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the Act within the limits of the Municipality, or within such other limits as the Governor may by proclamation approve and allow. And whereas it is desirable that the Council of the Midland Junction Municipality should be within the district of the authorised to supply electricity within the district of the Greenmount Road Board: Now therefore I, the Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the supply of electricity by the Council of the Midland Junction Municipality within the district of the Greenmount Road Board is approved and allowed, subject to the following extent

and conditions: (a.) The above extension and supply shall be subject to any by-laws which may from time to

ject to any by-laws which may from time to time be approved under the Electric Lighting Act of 1892 and the Amendment Acts, and shall be maintained in an efficient state to the satisfaction of the Minister for Works.

(b.) That permission be granted to the Midland Junction Municipality to erect the electric cable on poles along the York Road, from Bushby Road to the Western side of the Railway Reserve at York Road Crossing, a distance of about 61% chains.

(c.) The poles and cables to be erected in accordance with the data supplied in the Town Clerk's letter, dated 10th April, 1907, and to be subject to the approval of the Public Works Department.

Works Department.

(d.) The Government shall not be responsible in any way for the claims which may arise, either from the construction or the working of the line.

(e.) Provided that, in the event of the Minister for (e.) Provided that, in the event of the minister for Works requiring the removal of the poles and cables, or any portion, the Council shall remove same at their own cost, upon receiving three months' notice to that effect.

MUNICIPALITY OF BUSSELTON.

Building By-laws.

By virtue of the powers in that behalf vested in it by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Council of the Municipality of Busselton do hereby make the following By-laws to regulate building within the Municipality of Busselton, repealing all previous By-laws in reference thereto.

BY-LAW No. 1.

Plans and Specifications of Buildings.

Every person intending to erect, alter, or add to any building within the Municipality of Busselton shall, three days before commencing to erect, alter, or add to same, deposit with the Town Clerk for approval drawings showing the plans, elevations, and sections of such proposed buildings, additions, or alterations, together with full and complete specifications of the works proposed to be done, and together also with a plan of the locality showing the position of such building, and no person shall commence to erect, alter, or add to any such building until the Building Committee shall have signified their approval of such plans and specifications by the issue of a certificate of such approval, to be called a "Building License." A sufficient number of privies shall be provided for the workmen on all buildings or works in the course of erection or construction before the works are commenced. A duplicate copy of such drawings, and a locality plan showing the position to be occupied by such building, shall at the same time be deposited with the Town Clerk, to remain permanently in his custody. Every person who shall do any act contrary to or subversive of, or shall neglect or omit to do any act required to be done by any of these By-laws, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

SCHEDULE A.

Scale of Fees.

For every service performed which is required by the By-laws but not comprehended under any of the foregoing heads, such fee (not to exceed £5 5s.) as the Council by resolution duly arrived at may appoint and fix.

BY-LAW No. 2.

External Walls.

- 1. Materials of external walls of buildings within the Municipality must be built of brick or stone, wood and iron, or artificial stone, and such materials must be sound and subject to the approval of the Building Committee.
- 2. The party walls of brick buildings must have parapet walls with a damp-proof course at level of flashing, and a capping of 1 to 1 cement mortar and finished off with a pure cement wash to level of flashing.
- finished off with a pure cement wash to level of flashing.

 3. In the case of a terrace of shops and dwellings, or of dwellings only, the front room and that immediately behind it may be built to the full width of the allotment or tenement; all other rooms must have a clear space on one side of at least 4ft. 6in. (four feet six inches) in the clear between the dividing line of such tenements and the external wall of such rooms for the free admission of air and light. There will and must be 9ft. in the clear between the external walls of every other pair of such constructed terraces, and all windows and ventilators must open on to the light and air space herein provided for. No two or more dwellings or business premises will be permitted to have any yard or building in common save and except when in the occupation of the same tenant or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 3.

If any external wall or enclosure be at any time hereafter taken down or otherwise demolished for the height of one storey, or for the space equal to one-fourth of the whole surface of such external wall, then every part thereof not built in the manner and of the several materials by this By-law directed for external walls must be taken down, and the same must be rebuilt in such manner and of such materials for and in all respects as by this By-law directed for external walls hereafter to be built within the Municipality, and it shall be within the power of the Building Committee to enforce the rebuilding of same.

BY-LAW No. 4.

Party Walls.

In reference to the component parts thereof: Every part of such party wall must be built of sound bricks or stone, or of such bricks or stone together laid in and with mortar or cement and in such a manner as to produce solid work, and as to the woodwork which it may be desired to connect with party walls of any building, the bearing ends of wooden beams, brestsummers, girders, trimming joists, and the ends of partition heads and sills, and the bearing ends of the main timbers of any roof and wood bricks may be laid into the substances of a party wall, but no such beam, brestsummer, girder, joist, partition, head, or sill, nor any part of a roof being wood, nor any wood bricks must be laid or placed within 2in. of the centre of any party wall, and no other woodwork of any kind must be laid into, placed upon, or be run or driven into any part of the substance of any party wall, but if the ends of timber be carried in iron shoes or stone corbels, then such iron shoes or corbels must be built into the wall at least one-half the thickness of such wall, and the top of every such party wall must be finished with one course of sound, hard bricks, set on edge in good mortar or cement or by a coping of any other properly secured and sufficiently waterproof and fire-proof covering.

BY-LAW No. 5.

Roofs, etc.

With regard to the roof, flat, and gutter of any building, any or every projection therefrom, and also balconies and shop fronts, they must be so arranged and constructed, and so supplied with gutters and pipes as to prevent the water therefrom dripping on to or running over the public way, and all such rain pipes, eaves, and gutters are to be made of metal.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Rooms.

1. With regard to rooms in any part of any building in reference to height thereof, every room used or intended to be used for the purpose of habitation must be at least the height of 10ft. from floor to the ceiling, with the exception of skillions, which must be 9ft. high in respect to new buildings, and 8ft. high in respect to additions to the buildings already erected.

2. Every room used for the purpose of habitation or for the assemblage of people for any purpose whatever shall be well and properly ventilated to the satisfaction of the Building Committee, by the insertion of air bricks below the floor and by openings in the sleeper walls, also by ventilators in the ceiling or at the top of the walls thereof, according to the size of such rooms. No room to contain less than 600 cubic feet air space when furnished.

BY-LAW No. 7. Brestsummers.

Each tenement must have a separate brestsummer if of wood, and the ends of any two brestsummers must be separated by not less than 4½in. brickwork. This applies to wooden brestsummers only. All brestsummers to be either of iron or jarrah wood.

BY-LAW No. 8.

Fireplaces.

Every fireplace constructed of iron shall be lined with brick or stone built up to the height of 3ft. from the level of the fire rest, and not less than $4\frac{1}{2}$ in. thick, and the hearth of every such fireplace or chimney must be laid and bedded wholly on brick or stone, or other incombustible substance. Such hearth to consist of a combustible substance. Such hearth to consist of a slab or slabs of brick, tile, stone, slate, iron, or other proper and sufficient substance at least 12in. longer than the opening of the chimney when finished, and at least 18in. in front of the arch over the same.

BY-LAW No. 9.

Wood and Iron Buildings.

The external walls of all wood and iron buildings must be built at least 4ft. 6in. from the dividing bounmust be built at least 4ft. Gin. from the dividing boundary of the property upon which the building is being erected and the adjoining property, and 15 feet from the frontage to street within the area bounded by West Street on the west, Stanley street on the east, Marine Terrace on the north, and Bussell Street on the south. The inside walls to be lath and plaster, metal, or T. and G. jarrah; no soft or other wood will be permitted.

BY-LAW No. 10.

Temporary Buildings.

With regard to the granting of permission for the erection of temporary buildings, special permission may be granted by the Building Committee for a period to be stated for the erection of temporary buildings; all the walls may be of wood or iron.

BY-LAW No. 11.

Verandahs and Balconies.

1. Awnings or verandahs to be erected over the footpaths are to be in accordance with the drawings and specifications approved of by the Building Committee and accordingly adopted by the Council. The minimum height is to be 8ft. 6in. clear from the footpath, and the posts must not be less than 5in. x 5in. if in jarrah. The verandah to be painted and kept in repair to the satisfaction of the Building Committee, who shall have the power to order such repairs to the verandahs generally as they may deem necessary. In the event of neglect or of the Building Committee observing the necessity of removal or repair, such must be commenced within seven days of receipt of notice from the Building Committee, and must be completed within fourteen days from such notice, or otherwise the verandah will be removed, expense to be borne by the owner or occupier, and to be recoverable from him in a summary manner before

Balconies.

2. Verandah posts not less than 6in. x 6in. jarrah, 2ft. in the ground, or 4in. iron columns or fixed in other suitable foundation, with a sole plate to be in one length equal to the extreme length of the balcony of 9in. x 2in. jarrah. Top plate not less than 9in. x 2in. oregon or jarrah. Beavers not less than 6in. x 3in. oregon and not more than 4ft. 6in. apart. Joists not less than 4in. x 2in. with 1ft. 6in. centres. Floor T. and G. 4in. x 2ii. with lft. 6in. centres. Floor T. and G. 11/4in. thick. Verandah posts not less than 4in. x 4in. Rafters 4in. x 2in. Top plate 6in. x 2in. All plates to be bolted to posts. The floor of baleony shall not be less than 10ft. from surface of footpath.

3. No baleony supported wholly from cantilevers or corbelled out from the wall will be permitted unless specially authorised in writing by the Council.

BY-LAW No. 12.

Notice to remove Dangerous Buildings.

When any building shall, in the opinion of the Building Committee, be ruinous, or dangerous or unfit for human use or habitation through defects in its construction or surroundings under the meaning of Clause 317 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Buildor The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906, the Editoring Committee shall give notice to the owner thereof to remove or renovate the same, and every such owner shall comply forthwith with such order, under a penalty of not more than £20 per month for non-performance.

BY-LAW No. 13.

Prohibiting use for human habitation.

No building or any part thereof not originally built as and for a dwelling-house within the limits of this Municipality, whether built before or after the adoption of this By-law, shall be converted into or used as a dwelling-house without the previous consent of the Council, who may grant such consent upon and subject to such conditions as they may see fit, or in their discretion may refuse the same.

BY-LAW No. 14.

Builder to keep responsible man in charge.

Any builder or person erecting any building under these By-laws shall at all times during the working hours and during the progress of such work be himself or keep a responsible man on the scene of the work, to take any orders from the Building Committee relative to such building, and the plans and specifications of such build-ing shall at all times be thereon in the custody of such person for production to the Building Committee, and any infringement of this By-law shall subject the person guilty to a penalty of £5 for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 15.

Contractor's sheds.

Nothing in these By-laws shall prevent any contractor or builder erecting a temporary office, sheds, and workshops of wood and iron on any building site during the building operations, provided that special application be made to and permission be granted by the Building Committee.

BY-LAW No. 16.

Chimneys, domestic and factory.

Every chimney shaft or flue hereafter built, raised, or repaired, must be carried up in brick or stonework all round at least 4in. thick to a height of at least 3ft. round at least 4in. thick to a height of at least 3ft. above the highest part of such portion of roof, flat, or gutter adjoining thereto, measured at the point of junction. And as to any chimney shaft (except that of a steam engine, brewery, distillery, or manufacture) the brick or stone of such shaft or flue must not be built higher than 8ft. above the slope or flat or gutter of the roof which it adjoins, measured from the highest point of junction, unless such chimney shaft shall be built of increased thickness or be built with and bonded to another chimney shaft or be otherwise rendered secure. And as to the chimney shaft for the boiler secure. And as to the chimney shaft for the boiler furnace of any steam engine or for any brewery, distillery, or manufactory, such shaft may be erected of any height so that it be built in such a manner and of such strength and dimensions as shall be satisfactory to the Building Committee upon special application in to the Building Committee upon special application in each case.

BY-LAW No. 17. Chimney-pots.

As to earthen or metal chimney-pots, tubes, funnels, or cowls of any description whatever: If such pot, tube, or cowis of any description whatever: If such pot, tube, funnel, or cowl be higher than 4ft, above the brick or stonework of the flue upon which the same shall be placed, then it must be fixed two feet at the least into the brick or stonework of the flue on which it shall be placed or otherwise fixed to the satisfaction of the Building Committee.

BY-LAW No. 18.

Disputes.

If any dispute shall arise between the Building Committee and the person or persons respecting the meaning or operation of any of the conditions of these By-laws, the question shall be referred by the Building Committee to the Council for their adjudication.

BY-LAW No. 19.

Power to enter and remove.

And generally, where anything shall have been done or omitted to be done in contravention of these Regulations, it shall be lawful for the Building Committee, at their discretion, to enter on the premises and remove or cause to be removed any buildings or other thing which have been erected in contravention thereof, or to do or been done any act or thing which should have been done in pursuance thereof, and the cost of such doing shall be borne and paid by such owner or other person in addition to any penalties to which he may be liable in respect thereof under these Regulations.

BY-LAW No. 20.

Bench-marks, etc.

All survey levels, bench-marks, or other marks denoting the same shall be carefully preserved, and any person remarks or ablituating at severing or partition son removing or obliterating, or causing or permitting same to be removed or obliterated shall be liable to a penalty of £10, and to pay all costs incurred in replacing

BY-LAW No. 21.

Mutual and parapet walls.

All walls erected within 2ft. of the boundary of allotment must have parapet walls with copings, the walls in every case being carried up as per By-law No. 4.

BY-LAW No. 22.

Cornices, etc.

No cornice or other ornament shall project beyond the alignment of the street more than 18in., and must not be lower than 15ft. above the level of the pavement.

BY-LAW No. 23.

Cellars and Lights, etc.

No cellar will be allowed under the pavement of the street, and authority for fixing prismatic or other lights on the pavement must be obtained in writing from the Building Committee before being fixed.

BY-LAW No. 24.

Stables.

All stables to be erected must be of brick, stone, artificial stone, jarrah, or iron, with a proper cobble stone, gravel, cement, asphalt, or wood floor (such floor must be been in newfact and in the last must be kept in perfect repair), and have such a pitch outwards that all liquid will drain off freely and cleanly. A proper manure bin with close-fitting lid on hinges must be provided for all manure in all business premises. At the entrance to every stall a proper drain must be provided to carry off all liquid matter. All loose boxes must also be provided with a proper drain running along the sides next to the walls and have one or more outlets. These drains must discharge into some approved receptacle.

BY-LAW No. 25.

Plans.

All plans of buildings and also of alterations must be examined and passed by any one member of the Council and the Building Committee, and approved of, and such approval certified to on the original drawings by such Councillor examining same and the Building Committee.

BY-LAW No. 26.

Subdivision of land.

Any person desirous of subdividing or re-subdividing land shall deposit with the Council a plan of the proposed subdivision, together with a tracing of the same. Should the Council agree to pass such plan, the tracing shall become and remain the property of the Municipality of Progretary pality of Busselton.

Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 10$.

- 7. Bonuses for the destruction of wild dogs, within the district of any Vermin Board, shall be paid through the Board of the District in which the wild dogs are destroyed.
- 8. Wild dog scaips must be handed to the Secretary of the Vermin Board, and the Secretary shall in the presence of a member of the Board totally destroy such scalps by fire.
- A scalp shall consist of a strip of skin from the tip of the mose to the tip of the tail, not less than two inches wide, and including the ears. No other evidence inches wide, and including the ears. shall be recognised.
- 10. The Board may grant for every wild dog scalp such bonus as to the Board may seem fit.
- 11. For each wild dog scalp, for which the Board pays a bonus of ten shillings or upwards, the Department of Agriculture may refund to the Board five shillings.

BY-LAWS OF THE WILUNA ROAD BOARD. BY-LAW No. 1.

Interpretation.

In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them respectively, that is to say:—

"District."—The locality or area for the time being under the control of the Wiluna Road Board.

- "Board."-The Wiluna Road Board.
- "Chairman."-The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
- "Member."—A member of the Board.
- "The Act."—"The Roads Act, 1902," and all amendments thereto, or which may come into force hereafter, as far as the Act allows.

"Road" or "Reserve."-A road or reserve, as the

- case may be, under the control of the Board.

 "Footpath" or "Footway" shall include any part of a road set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made, or kerbed, or otherwise.
- "Cycle Track" shall mean any part of a road set apart for the sole use of persons riding bicycles.
- "Person" shall include the plural, and also a body corporate.

BY-LAW No. 2.

Duties of Secretary.

The duties of the Secretary shall be:-

- (a.) To attend all Board meetings.
- (b.) To attend all Committee meetings.
- To take notes of minutes and prepare reports of committees.
- (d.) Conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officers instructions, as directed by the minutes.
- (e.) Answer all questions on the Board's business. •
- (f.) See that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance sheets prepared and published yearly in the Government Gazette, and at least one newspaper circulating in the district, and any other duties specified under the Roads Act.
- (g.) Supervise the preparation of the rate books and the Board's electoral list; to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to the elections; also to attend all courts of revision or appeal; to make the necessary arrangements for the elections; to issue instructions to the supervisors in accordance with the Board's resolu-
- (h.) Summon the members to Board and Committee meetings.
- (i.) Keep all books entered up to date, in accordance with instructions issued by Minister, and additional instructions of Board.
- (j.) Check all accounts sent in to the Board, and see all accounts for works have stated in them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the collector or other of the Board's officers, and to see that the counterfoils of the receipt book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all money com-ing through the hands of the Board's officers, and payable to the credit of the Board.
- (k.) Report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.

- (1.) To pay into the bank within twenty-four hours after receipt, to the credit of the Board, all money received by him on behalf of the Board, with the exception of moneys granted by Government, which are paid into Treasury Book.
- (m.) Have the bank pass-book made up in readi-Have the bank pass-book made up in readiness for the meeting of the Board, and to produce it at each meeting thereof, and to any member of the Board desiring to see it at any time during office hours. No money shall be paid into bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except by or through the Secretary, who shall give all receipts on printed forms.
- (n.) Unless otherwise ordered by the Board, take charge of all deeds, records, books, and papers of the Board and be responsible for the safe custody of same.
- (o.) Readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all other matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board, and not herein speci-
- (p.) That the Secretary shall provide a fidelity guarantee in an approved society for the sum of £200.

BY-LAW No. 3.

Supervisor's Duties.

The duties of the Supervisor shall be:-

- (a.) To promptly attend to all instructions received through the Secretary.
- (b.) To prepare proper plans and specifications for all works and improvements as regards roads, bridges, culverts, buildings, or premises under the control of the Board situate within the district; examine all materials to be employed in such works, and to see the same faithfully and properly executed and performed; lay out such work as to height, lines, levels, and dimensions, and watch the progress and formation thereof; submit all specifications and plans to the Board before tenders are called.
- (c.) To see that the works of cleaning and repairing all public roads and footways are properly carried out.
- (d.) To see that no labourers are engaged but those who are able-bodied and sober, and to immediately discharge any labourer guilty of dis-obedience, insubordination, and found incap-able of performing the duties allotted to him.
- (e.) To see that all drains, sewers, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency.
- (f.) To see that all officers under his control carry out their duties efficiently, and to report any departure therefrom.
- (g.) To attend all Board and committee meetings, if required.
- (h.) To specially examine all roads throughout the district at least twice a year, if instructed by the Board to do so.
- (i.) To render to the Secretary, when required, reports and accounts of all matters under his control; to supply monthly, or oftener if required, to the Board returns of all work completed or in progress, with remarks thereon.

BY-LAW No. 4.

Appointment of Officers.

No permanent appointment shall be made to an office under the Board until applications have been called from persons competent to fill such appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

BY-LAW No. 5.

Meetings and Proceedings.

Notice shall be given, in writing, by the Chairman or Secretary, of ordinary meetings at least seven days before such meetings, and also for every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding six days. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence, or if after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers or members present, as the case may be, shall preside.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—"ordinary" and "special." Ordinary meetings are those called by the Chairman or Secretary as often as seems proper for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Board. Special meetings are those called to consider special business, the nature of which shall be notified on the notice paper summoning the meeting. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called.

BY-LAW No. 7.

Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board, Wiluna, on the third Thursday in the month, at 8 o'clock p.m., unless otherwise arranged by resolution carried to that effect at the preceding ordinary meeting of the Board.

BY-LAW No. 8.

A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business shall be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless at least three of the Board, inclusive of the Chairman, or member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present.

BY-LAW No. 9.

Any three members may require the Board room to be cleared of strangers, and the Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall immediately give directions to have the orders executed.

BY-LAW No. 10.

At all meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present), such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

BY-LAW No. 11.

The first business of all meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting aloud, with a view to their confirmation.

BY-LAW No. 12.

Minutes of Meetings.

A rough minute book shall be kept in which every item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the Secretary, who shall, within 24 hours thereafter, enter the same into the minute book prescribed by the Act. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of a clerical error.

BL-LAW No. 13.

Order of Business.

The order of business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say:—

- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and special meetings (if any).
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
- (c.) Reading of correspondence (in and out), and taking such action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
- (d.) Presentation of petitions or memorials, and committee reports, and consideration thereof.
- (e.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.
- (f.) General business.
- (g.) Passing of accounts for payment.

BY-LAW No. 14.

Petitions.

Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only, and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures, and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall

acquaint himself with the contents thereof and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature and prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

BY-LAW No. 15.

Tenders.

Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose.

BY-LAW No. 16.

Orders of Debate—Speakers must not Digress.

A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

BY-LAW No. 17.

Motions and Amendments.

A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn unless by consent of the Board.

BY-LAW No. 18.

One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion in the reverse order in which they were moved.

BY-LAW No. 19.

A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.

BY-LAW No. 20.

In submitting a motion or amendment the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

BY-LAW No. 21.

When an amendment is carried the motion amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendments may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

BY-LAW No. 22.

No member shall speak twice on the same subject except by way of explanation, or to an amendment, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the last motion; nevertheless, any member who may have been misunderstood or misrepresented shall be allowed to explain immediately before the mover rises to reply, but not after; and after the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall immediately be put to the vote.

BY-LAW No. 23.

Appointment of Committee.

The Board may at any time appoint three or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the Bylaws or a resolution of the Board. The quorum of a committee shall comprise three members.

BY-LAW No. 24.

Finance Committee and Finance Accounts.

A Finance Committee shall consist of the Chairman and two or more members appointed by the Board for the purpose of examining all accounts, bills, and vouchers. Such committee shall meet at some hour previous to every ordinary meeting, but within 24 hours of the meeting.

BY-LAW No. 25.

All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Finance Committee prior to the ordinary meeting, and, after being certified as correct, shall be paid by cheque.

BY-LAW No. 26.

An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys received, from whatever source, shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, with the exception of moneys granted by the Government, which shall be paid to the Board's credit at Treasury, as provided for by to the Board's credit at Treasury, as provided for by Section 124. No account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman and one or more members of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary. All moneys belonging to the Board shall, within 24 hours after they come into the hands of any officer, servant, or clerk, be paid to the Secretary.

BY-LAW No. 27.

Urgent Works.

The Chairman, with one member, or in the absence of the Chairman, any two members, may, in the case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding ten pounds. Any one member is empowered to authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding two pounds ten shillings in cases of very urgent necessity, upon "declared roads," but shall in every case report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

BY-LAW No. 28.

Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any committee, or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure and a breach of this By-law by such person.

BY-LAW No. 29.

Nuisances.

- (a.) Abattoirs and slaughter-houses shall mean and include the buildings and places commonly called "abattoirs" or "slaughter-houses," and every building or place used for slaughtering cattle or animals of any description.
- (b.) Piggeries shall mean and include the buildings and places commonly called "piggeries," and any building or place used for the enclosure or housing of not less than ten pigs.
- (c.) Any person who shall establish or carry on within the district of the Board, without the consent in writing of the Board, any of the undermentioned trades, businesses, or occupations, that is to say:-

Manure works. Works for boiling down meat, bones, blood, or offal.

Bone mills and bone manure depôts.

Fellmongeries, tanneries, and wool-scouring establishments.

Glue factories.

Piggeries.

Soap or candle works.

Abattoirs or slaughter-houses.

Storing, drying, or preserving bones, hides, hoofs, or skins;

shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

- Any person who shall carry on, without the con-(a.) Any person who shall carry on, without the consent in writing of the Board, any other noxious or offensive trade, business, or occupation, or who, without such consent, shall add to, or assist, or extend any building or premises used for the purpose of such trade, business, or occupation shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.
- (e.) Prior to the granting of any consent mentioned in paragraphs (c) or (d), notice of intention to apply for the same shall be given in writing to the Board, and posted at the Board's office 14 days previously; and any person, whether a resident in the district of such Board or not, may state to the Board his objections thereto.
- (f.) No person shall keep or cause to be kept any swine or pigstye within one hundred feet of any house or running water without the consent of the Board, and no piggery shall be kept within five chains from any Government road in the district of the Board, or so as be a nuisance to any person or injurious to the public health.

Any person who commits a breach of this paragraph of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not exceeding twenty pounds.

BY-LAW No. 30.

Any person who shall:-

- (a.) Deposit or cast, or allow to remain upon any road or public place, the carcase of a dead animal, or any refuse, or offensive matter; or
- (b.) Cause or permit any foul or offensive liquid matter to flow from any land, house, or premises owned or occupied by him, in or upon any road or footpath, or road; or
- (c.) Injure or pollute any well or watering place which shall have been made or constructed by or under the control of the Board,

shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

BY-LAW No. 31.

Any member of the Board or any officer, acting under instructions from the Board, may, from time to time, visit and inspect any butcher's shambles, slaughterhouse, or yard, or other place for the purpose of ascertaining if the same is kept cleansed, and the same must be kept thoroughly clean, to the satisfaction of such member or officer of the Board.

BY-LAW No. 32.

No person shall poison, kill, or maim any horse, cow, No person shall poison, Kill, or maim any horse, cow, camel, pig, bullock, dog, or other animal, and leave the same in any part of the district without making proper provision for the burial or burning of the carease thereof, and any person so doing shall commit an offence against the By-laws, and, upon conviction, shall pay a penalty of not exceeding ten pounds, and shall pay all expenses attending on the proper burial or burning of any such animal any such animal.

BY-LAW No. 33.

- (a.) The following acts, omissions, or neglects are hereby forbidden to be done, or allowed to be done, and any person or persons guilty of the following offences shall, on conviction thereof, pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds:-
 - (b.) Riding or driving cattle or horses or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any carriage or cart upon or along any footpath or cycle track.
 - (c.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other material upon any footpath, channel, surface drain, or road without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.
 - (d.) Burning any shavings or other material or matter in any footway, road, or open or public
 - (e.) Leaving any inflammable or other material or other matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
 - (f.) Damaging or destroying any dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, or gate under the control of the Board, carelessly leaving any tap connected with water tanks running, thereby letting the water escape from such tanks and waste, bathing in any dam or well, or in any way polluting the water contained in such tanks, well or dam as to render it unfit for human consumption.
 - (g.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, printing on, or otherwise defacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamppost, or gate, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
 - (h.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or road, without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.
 - (i.) Neglecting to clean any private yard, way, passage, or avenue by which neglect a nuis-ance by offensive smell or otherwise is caused.
 - (j.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bow and arrow, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any road, or allowing any cart or animal upon any footpath, placing goods upon any footpath, or otherwise obstructing any footpath.

- (k.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile in any road to the damage or danger of any person.
- (1.) Having any awning upon or over any footpath in any road not being eight feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway without permission of the Board.
- (m.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any road without the permission of the Board, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such **B**oard.
- (n.) Furiously or negligently driving or riding along any road.
- (o.) Making any cellar door or other opening from the footway of any road without the consent of the Board.

BY-LAW No. 34.

General Regulation of Traffic.

Every person having the care or conduct of any carriage shall keep the same on the left side, or near side, of the road, except in case of actūal necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or carriage passing or attempting to pass his carriage.

BY-LAW No. 35.

No person having the care or control of a horse or other animal, or of any vehicle, shall allow the same to remain in any road of the district, or to obstruct any portion of such road for a longer period than necessary for loading or unloading the vehicle, provided that where suitable bridle posts are provided the horses may be securely fastened thereto for any period not exceeding sixty minutes, but immediately upon the request of any officer or member of the Board or police constable such shall be removed.

BY-LAW No. 36.

Any person leading an entire or stallion shall, on passing any vehicle or equestrian, keep on the right side of the road, and the attendant must be on the near side of the stallion.

BY-LAW No. 37.

To prevent trees falling across any road or track.

No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or track or reserve under the jurisdiction of the Board without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading, and any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

BY-LAW No. 38.

No person shall set fire to any standing tree upon or near to any road or track, and any offender shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

BY-LAW No. 39.

To prevent accidents from riding, etc., on bicycles, etc. Throughout this By-law, the expression "cycle" means a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, and the expression "cyclist" means a person riding a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.

(a.) No person shall ride or impel a cycle upon any footpath within the district.

- (b.) No person shall, between sunset and sunrise, ride a cycle within the district unless there is attached thereto a lamp which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and at all times to be kept lighted.
- (c.) Every cyclist shall carry a bell, which shall be rung as a signal whenever any person on foot or on horseback or vehicle is being approached or passed.
- (d.) No person shall leave any cycle in or on any road or footpath so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle immediately upon being requested to do so by any constable or officer or member of the Board.
- (e.) No person shall pass, at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour, any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.

- (f.) When a cyclist shall meet a horse or animal, and such horse or animal shall become resttive, or appear likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist shall dismount, and shall remove his bicycle to a reasonable distance from the centre of the road, and shall remain dismounted until such horse or other animal has been passed.
- (g.) No person shall ride any cycle round the corner formed by the junction of any roads in the district, or across the intersection of any of the said roads, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

BY-LAW No. 40.

To prevent obstructions on the footpaths.

No person shall permit any box, case, coal, sand, firewood, goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles, or unpack any goods, cases, or merchandise, or allow any effects to remain on any part of a road or on any part of a footpath within the district, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing and removing same.

BY-LAW No. 41.

To prevent damage to footpaths and any other road property.

No person, without having first obtained the written consent of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any footpath, gutter, drain, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, plant, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings, or other property of the Board or under the control thereof.

Any person who commits an offence against this Bylaw shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

BY-LAW No. 42.

No person shall damage or destroy by means of horse team, wagon, dray, or any other means, any road or portion of a road under construction or repair, and any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

BY-LAW No. 43.

Any person who:-

- (a.) Cuts or removes, without the consent in writing of the Chairman of the Board, timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road; or
- (b.) Without the consent aforesaid, erects upon a road, so as to encroach thereon, any structure, or deposits on any road any earth, sand, gravel, stone, timber, or other material; or
- (c.) Draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the waterside of a road, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or
- (d.) Shall drive three or more horses in single file;
- (e.) Draws upon a road timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material, when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle, to drag or trail upon a road, a whim, or timber carriage, any portion of which or any portion of chains attached thereto, or any portion of any other attachment trails or drags upon a road

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 44.

No person shall dig for or remove any gravel from any reserve under the control of the Board without first obtaining permission from the Board, and paying any fee or license that may be decided upon.

BY-LAW No. 45.

The owner of any cattle, sheep, horse, pig, or other animal straying on any road within the district of the Wiluna Road Board between sunset and sunrise shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

BY-LAW No. 46.

The owner of any bull, bull camel, stallion, straying on any road within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

Any bull camel straying whilst "in season" shall be destroyed, and the owner be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

BY-LAW No. 47.

- (a.) No person shall keep or use within the district any camel without having registered same with the Board as hereinafter stated.
- (b.) The owner of any packing camel other than bull camel used or kept within or passing through the district shall pay a yearly registration fee of ten shillings per camel.
- (b2.) The owner of any draught camel other than a bull camel shall pay a yearly registration fee of five shillings.
- (c.) The owner of any bull camel used or kept within or passing through the district shall pay a yearly registration fee of one pound per camel.
- (d.) Numbered discs supplied by the Board must be attached to the necks of all licensed camels.
- The driver or attendant of any packing camel shall pay a yearly license fee of ten shillings, and shall not drive or attend any number of camels exceeding ten.
- (f.) The owner, driver, or attendant of any camels shall, on demand of an officer or member of the Board, produce his license or registration receipt, and shall give any information respecting the registration of the camels as the officer or member may require.
- (g.) Any driver or attendant of camels driving or attending camels not attached to a wheeled vehicle shall, on the approach, or on being overtaken by a wheeled vehicle or horse, pull off the road a distance of at least twenty feet therefrom, and there remain stationary until such vehicle or horse shall have passed.
- (h.) Any person neglecting to comply with this By-law (47) shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds; and further, shall be adjudged to pay the full fee for any registration or license by this By-law required.
- (i.) The onus of proof of any license having been obtained, or any registration effected, shall in the first instance lie on the accused, and any person found in charge of any camels may for the purpose of this Bylaw be presumed to be the owner until and unless he proves that some other person resident within the State is the owner.
- (j.) Any camels remaining unregistered after the date fixed by the Board for registration of same may be seized by order of the Board and sold, and the registration fees, together with all expenses incurred, may be deducted by the Board from proceeds of such sale, and the balance, if any, paid over to the person owning the camels when seized.
- (k.) All registration and license fees are due on the first of January of each year, and are payable to the Board or the Board's authorised collector on or before the first of February of each year.

BY-LAW No. 48.

That the owners of all dogs shall pay a yearly registration fee as prescribed by "The Dog Act, 1903." Numbered disc with registered number of owner will be supplied by the Board.

BY-LAW No. 49.

The yearly license fee on all bicycles used within the district shall be two shillings and sixpence.

BY-LAW No. 50.

All wheeled vehicles to carry a light between the hours of sunset and sunrise if within a four-mile radius of any townsite.

BY-LAW No. 51.

The owner of every vehicle or engine which, together with its load, shall weigh more than five tons, shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for any damage done.

BY-LAW No. 52.

Penalties.

Where any person by these By-laws, or any of them, is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same, and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be summarily recovered.

BY-LAW No. 53.

Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and where not otherwise provided shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds for every such offence.

It is hereby resolved by the Road Board of the Wiluna District, subject to any By-law, and with the approval and confirmation of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the above By-laws shall be in force within the said Wiluna District from the date of publication thereof in the Government Gazette.
