WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter bylaws for the control and management of such Reserves, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the Reserves set out in the Schod. deemed expedient that the Reserves set out in the Schedule, which have been set apart for the protection and preservation of Caves, should be placed under the control of the Hon. James Daniel Connolly, M.L.C., Colonial Secretary, as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserves under the control of the Hon. WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," it is provided that for the government of every municipality there shall be a council which shall consist, where the population of the municipal district is declared by the Governor to be under one thousand, of a mayor and six councillors, and that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, determine and alter, within the limits prescribed by the Act, the number of councillors assigned to any municipality: And whereas a petition, signed with the common seal of the Municipality of Day Dawn, has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, praying that, the population of the municipal district of Day Dawn being under one thousand, the number of councillors be accordingly reduced from nine to six: And whereas the said petition was published in the Government Gazette on the 15th July, 1910; Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby declares the population of the Municipal District of Day Dawn to be under one thousand, and orders that the Municipal Council of Day Dawn shall consist of a Mayor and six councillors.

#### AUDIT ACT REGULATIONS.

524/1910.

The Treasury, Perth, 31st August, 1910.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to cancel Regulations Nos. 7, 10, 11, and 18, and to approve in lieu thereof those hereunder; to take effect as from the 26th instant.

- 7. Except as otherwise provided, the full amount of all public moneys collected, deducting only charges legally payable therefrom, shall be paid in, where banking facilities exist, daily, or when so required by the Treasurer, to the credit of the State Public Account, and a duplicate bank receipt (Form No. 27) therefor, if so paid in (or cash where banking facilities do not exist), be remitted daily, or when so required by the Treasurer.
  - (a.) Ministerial accountants, when remitting their collections to the Treasurer, shall in the case of revenue forward Form 1, classifying the receipt according to the heads of revenue on the annual estimates, and in the case of trust funds or other receipts forward Form 4, setting forth the particulars and the account to be credited, together with all necessary bank receipts (Form 27).
  - (b.) Outstation receivers, when remitting their collections to the Treasurer or to the Ministerial accountants, shall forward a duplicate of each Ministerial Cash Book, with all supporting vouchers, together with the Bank receipt (Form 27). On the back of the bank receipt is to be recorded the total only of each de-partment's receipts, making up the aggregate of each day's collections banked.

- 11. On the twenty-sixth of each month (June excepted, for which read "thirtieth"), every Ministerial accountant shall prepare a monthly Receiver's Account (as per amended Form 3) embodying therein the outstation receiver's collections brought to account through him during the month and forward it signed and wit-nessed to the Treasurer for transmission to the Auditor General, and in the same form the Treasurer as collector shall prepare, sign, and transmit to the Auditor General monthly a statement of his collections, embodying the receivers' accounts for the month. If no moneys have been received, an account shall nevertheless be furnished with the word "Nil" written thereon. The Receiver's Account shall include trust and all other moneys, the name of the fund or account being specified, and included in the respective department's accounts. Outstation receivers will not be required to forward a monthly Receiver's Account. When any moneys have station receivers will not be required to lorward a monthly Receiver's Account. When any moneys have been received for the sale of public property, receivers shall support their remittances by the account sales and any other document relating to the sale. (Form 20.)
- Ministerial accountants shall keep a cash book in the form approved by the Treasurer, in which shall be entered daily on the one side the amount of his collections, and on the other side the disposal thereof.
  - (a.) Outstation receivers shall keep a separate cash book for each group of Ministerial Departments, in the form approved by the Treasurer, in which are to be posted daily moneys received on behalf of the respective depart-

SHARKS BAY PEARL SHELL FISHERY ACT, 1892.

Closing of Pearling Banks in Sharks Bay.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act, 1892," has closed those portions of the waters of Sharks Bay set out hereunder, from the dates specified until further notice, and has prohibited the gathering, collecting, or removal of any pearls or pearl shell from those portions so closed:

- From the 1st August, 1910, and until further notice, the waters from Cape Lesueur Northwards to Cape Peron, with a width of two miles from high-water mark.
