Regulation prohibiting Cutting of Timber on State Forest at Yuani.

Department of Lands and Surveys,

15530/08. Perth, 9th September, 1910. HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulation under the provisions of Section 161 of "The Land Act, 1898":—

No person shall, without the special permission in writing of the Minister for Lands or his agent (such permission only to be given where the timber or charcoal is required for use within the boundaries of the said State Forest), fell, cut, split, or remove any timber growing or standing or burn charcoal on the area of Crown land hereafter to be known and dis tinguished as Yuani State Forest, the boundaries of which are described hereunder:

Bounded on the North and West by lines starting from a point situate one mile West and one mile North from the centre of Yuani Lot 69, and extending East two miles and South two miles; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal. (Plan 42/300.)

Any person offending against this Regulation shall, on conviction, be subject to a penalty not exceeding £20.
