BY-LAW 23.

Regulating the Deposit of Rubbish, etc.

In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Health Act, 1898," the Local Board of Health of the Guildford Municipality doth hereby make the following By-law: -

Part 1 of By-law 23 is hereby repealed.

By-law 23.

1. The occupier of every house or premises shall, on written notice from the Inspector, and within the time specified in such notice, provide such and so many receptacles of the material and of the dimensions as may ceptacles of the material and of the dimensions as may be required by the Local Board for the temporary deposit of house refuse. Such receptacles shall be constructed of 22 gauge plain galvanised iron, 22 inches in depth, 18 inches in diameter, with a handle made of three-eighths round iron rivetted on each side with four rivets—the tops to be neatly turned over on to a flat band of %sin. by ½in. iron and rivetted with, at least, four rivets—the bottoms to be knocked up and the seams grooved, and the bottoms and seams sweated with solder inside, and a conical cover made of 26 gauge plain galvanised iron with a handle rivetted on gauge plain galvanised iron with a handle rivetted on top with four rivets.
