WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Mining Act, 1904," it is lawful for the Governor by Proclamation to alter or amend the boundaries of a Goldfield or District: Now therefore I, Sir Gerald Strickland, Governor of the said State, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers in me vested in that behalf by the said Ordinance, do hereby alter the existing boundaries of the Yilgarn Goldfield as hereunder:—

YILGARN GOLDFIELD.

Bounded by lines starting from a point North of cairn H26, on Koorarawalyee Rock, and West of cairn NB1 at Wangine Soak; thence South along the West boundary of the Coolgardie and Dundas Goldfields, and passing through a cairn H26, on Koorarawalyee Rock, to a point East of the 100-mile post on the Southern Section of the No. 1 Rabbit-proof Fence; thence West to the said 100-mile post; thence North-Westerly and Northerly along the fence to the 123-mile post on the Northern section of the fence; thence South-South-Easterly about 96 miles to the starting point. Excluding an area near Southern Cross bounded by lines starting from the South-West corner of Agricultural Lot No. 1, and extending 360deg. 12,888 links; thence 270deg. 11,204 links; thence 300deg. 4,524 links to the East boundary of the Southern Cross to Mt. Jackson Road; thence 342deg. 29min. 779.8 links; thence 341deg. 25min. 5,993 links; thence 358deg. 53min. 5,523 links; thence 24deg. 15min. 5,310 links; thence 90deg. 39,255 links; thence 180deg. 40,000 links; thence 270deg. 16,000 links; thence 315deg. 11,400 links to starting point.

BY-LAWS OF THE GUILDFORD LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

BY-LAW 23.

Regulating the Deposit of Rubbish, etc.

In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Health Act, 1898," the Local Board of Health of the Guildford Municipality doth hereby make the following By-law:—

Part 1 of By-law 23 is hereby repealed.

By-law 23.

1. The occupier of every house or premises shall, on written notice from the Inspector, and within the time specified in such notice, provide such and so many receptacles of the material and of the dimensions as may be required by the Local Board for the temporary deposit of house refuse. Such receptacles shall be constructed of 22 gauge plain galvanised iron, 22 inches in depth, 18 inches in diameter, with a handle made of three-eighths round iron rivetted on each side with four rivets—the tops to be neatly turned over on to a flat band of $\frac{5}{8}$ in. by $\frac{1}{4}$ in. iron and rivetted with, at least, four rivets—the bottoms to be knocked up and the seams grooved, and the bottoms and seams sweated with solder inside, and a conical cover made of 26 gauge plain galvanised iron with a handle rivetted on top with four rivets.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The District Fire Brigades Act, 1909," it is provided that a sum equal to the whole of the estimated annual expenditure of the Board in each fire district shall be contributed in the prescribed portions by the Colonial Treasurer, the local

authorities whose districts are within or partly within the fire district, and the insurance companies insuring from fire property situated within the district: And whereas the local authorities, being municipalities, are liable to contribute three-eighths of such annual expenditure; but the Governor may exempt any local authority, being a municipality, from liability to contribute, and no road board whose district is within or partly within a fire district is liable as a local authority to contribute towards such three-eighths of the annual expenditure unless the Governor so orders: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the ninth day of February, 1910, the Municipalities of Broome, Cossack, and Roebourne were exempted from liability to contribute, and it was ordered that the Road Boards of the road districts of Bayswater, Black Range, Kalgoorlie, Perth, and Ravens-thorpe should be liable to contribute towards such three-eighths of the annual expenditure, subject nevertheless to such restriction to a prescribed area of their several districts as might be thereafter ordered: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the fourth day of May, 1910, it was ordered that the Road Boards of the road districts of Claremont, Cottesloe Beach, Esperance, Greenmount, Meekatharra, Melville, Peppermint Grove, Swan, and West Guildford should be liable to contribute: And whereas on the eighth day of June, 1910, the Governor in Council determined the eleventh day of June, 1910, as the date on which payments of contributions towards the annual expenditure of the Board should commence, the first quarterly instalment to the thirty-first day of March to be payable forthwith and the subsequent quarterly instalments to be payable on the thirtieth day of June, the thirtieth day of September, and the thirty-first day of December, 1910, and such determination was notified in the *Government Gazette* on the tenth day of June, 1910: And whereas it is desirable that the liability of the Road Boards mentioned in the first column of the schedule hereto should be restricted to the areas described in the second column of the said schedule, the amount of the contribution of each local authority to be determined by the Board under the provisions of Section 44 of the Act: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby order that the Road Boards mentioned in the schedule hereto shall, as local authorities within the meaning of the Act, be liable under the provisions of Section 43 (subject to the restriction of the liability to a prescribed area, as set forth in the schedule) to contribute towards the said three-eighths of the annual expenditure of the Board to an amount to be determined in respect of each local authority by the Board under the provisions of section 44 of the said Act.
