CITY OF PERTH.

Amendment to By-law No. 3 for the Regulation of General Traffic.

4541/10.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth do hereby order as follows:—

1. The following sections shall stand as part of By-law No. 3, viz.:—

13. (a.) The driver of any vehicle and the rider of any horse upon any public street shall:—

When about to stop raise his whip or hand or give some intelligible signal of such his intention, so that the same may be visible to any person immediately following.

Upon the Traffic Inspector or Police Constable holding up his hand or otherwise giving an order or direction, stop so long or proceed in such manner and direction as such Traffic Inspector or Police Constable shall deem necessary to allow a free space between any vehicles or for cross traffic or for any other like purpose.

13. (b.) No person shall:—

Upon any public street drive a vehicle or ride a horse at a pace faster than a walk, whilst passing on the near side of any tramcar for the time being stopped for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers;

Tie any horse to any verandah post, or street tree; Tie any horse to any other post except with a head strap or neck rope.

13. (c.) Subject as hereinafter provided, the person in charge of a vehicle or a horse upon any public street shall at all times be in such a position as to have full control over the same: Provided that it shall not be an offence against this section for any such person to be absent if he has left some competent person temporarily in charge of such vehicle or horse, or to be so absent for a period not exceeding 15 minutes at one time, for some necessary purpose, if he has made due provision for the control of his horse or vehicle.

13. (d.) The person in charge of any vehicle or animal upon any public street shall at all times keep the same, whether moving or stationary, as near as practicable to the footpath on the left or near side of such street and parallel thereto.

13. (e.) Any person who is in charge of any vehicle or animal upon any public street and is about to turn to the right into another street shall not begin to turn such vehicle or animal until he has passed the centre of the street into which he is about to turn.

13. (f.) No person shall leave any vehicle constructed to be drawn by a horse in any street without a horse attached thereto.

13. (g.) No person shall drive any vehicle through a public street with any horse or horses attached to the rear thereof unless such horse or horses is or are attached to such vehicle with a suitable headstall or neck-collar, and in no case shall there be more than two horses attached to the rear of any vehicle.

2. Section 35 of By-law No. 3 is hereby repealed, and the following section is substituted in lieu thereof:—

35. No person shall drive, propel, or be in charge of any vehicle (other than a motor car, motor cycle or bicycle), upon any street or public way between sunset and sunrise without having a lamp burning brightly, securely fixed on the off side of such vehicle at least one foot higher than the hub of the front wheel, which lamp shall show a white light to the front and a red light to the rear, and shall be so fixed as to give an unobstructed view of the light to other users of the street or way.

Amendment of By-law No. 32 for the Regulation of the Use of Bicycles.

4542/10.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth do hereby order as follows:—

1. The following sections shall stand as part of By-law No. 32, viz.:—

13. (a.) Every person riding a machine upon any public street shall—

When about to stop, raise his hand or give some intelligible signal of such his intention, so that the same may be visible to any person immediately following.

Upon the Traffic Inspector or police constable holding up his hand or otherwise giving an order or direction, stop so long or proceed in such a manner and direction as such Traffic Inspector or police constable shall deem necessary to allow a free space between any vehicles or for cross traffic, or for any other like purpose.

At all times keep the same as near as practicable to the footpath on the left or near side of such street.

Before turning to the right into another street pass the centre of the street into which he is about to turn.

13. (b.) No person shall ride a bicycle upon any public street without keeping at least one hand upon the handle-bar of such bicycle.
