- 1. No person shall use any bicycle, motor cycle, or motor car within the Municipality of Norseman unless such bicycle, motor cycle, or motor car is licensed.
- 2. A license shall be in the form "A" in the Schedule, and application for the same shall be made to the Town Clerk.
- 3. The fee for each license shall be as follows:—For each bicycle or motor cycle, 5s. per annum; for each motor car, 20s. per annum.
- 4. Every license for a bicycle, motor cycle, or motor car shall expire on the 31st day of December in the year for which it was issued.
- 5. On the issue of every license for a bicycle, motor cycle, or motor car, the Town Clerk will issue to the licensee a disc or plate inscribed with name of the municipality and the number of the license. The licensee shall keep the said disc or plate attached to some conspicuous part of the bicycle, motor cycle, or motor car.

Any person offending against any portion of this By-law shall be liable for any one offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Boulder order as follows:-

By-law No. 75 published in the Government Gazette of 10th October, 1902, is hereby amended by deleting Clause 102, and substituting the following therefor:—
'No person shall drive, ride, or impel a motor car, bicycle, or other velocipede at any time from half an hour after sunset until half an hour before sunrise, along any street in the municipality (except on the four nights immediately preceding the night of full moon and on the night of the full moon and after the expiry of one hour from the time the moon has risen on each of the four nights immediately following the night of the full moon), unless there shall be attached to such motor car, bicycle, or other velocipede a proper lamp which when lighted will exhibit a white light in the direction in which such motor car, bicycle, or other velocipede is proceeding, and sufficient to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such motor car, bicycle, or other velocipede."

A By-law of the Municipality of Boulder made under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 89.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors order as follows:—

1. Clause 15 of By-law No. 70 of the municipality

- 1. Clause 15 of By-law No. 70 of the municipality published in the *Government Gazette* of the 24th March, 1898, is hereby repealed.
- 2. No person shall remove or cause to be removed from one part of the municipality to another or from outside the municipality to any part within the municipality any building without the consent, in writing, of the Building Surveyor first had and obtained, which consent shall be in the absolute and uncontrolled discretion of the Building Surveyor, and on such conditions as he thinks proper.
- 3. No person shall erect or construct, or cause to be erected or constructed, within the municipality any building wholly or in part covered on the outside with hessian or canvas, or any other inflammable material, without the consent, in writing, of the Building Surveyor first had and obtained, which consent shall be in the absolute and uncontrolled discretion of the Building Surveyor, and on such conditions as he thinks proper.
- 4. In the event of any of the conditions imposed by the Building Surveyor as in the two preceding clauses mentioned not being strictly adhered to and performed (of which the Building Surveyor shall be the sole judge), he may in his absolute and uncontrolled discretion revoke or cancel such consent.
- 5. The application for the consent mentioned in Clauses 2 and 3 of this By-law, as the case may be, shall be made to the Building Surveyor three clear days before it is proposed to remove or erect or construct any building, in the prescribed form, setting forth the full particulars of the building proposed to be removed, erected, or constructed, the place from which it is to be removed, and where it is to be deposited or where it is to be erected or constructed, as the case may be.
- 6. In the event of such consent to the removal as aforesaid being given, a sum to be fixed by the Building Surveyor shall be deposited at the office of the Building Surveyor as security for any damage that may be done to any road, street, right-of-way, or footpath, and in the event of any damage as aforesaid being done (of which damage the Building Surveyor shall be the sole judge), the whole or any part of the sum so deposited may be retained by the Council to cover the cost of repairing and making good such damage.

 7. If it is proposed to convey such building under
- 7. If it is proposed to convey such building under the electrical light wires erected in the streets, the Electrical Engineer shall also be notified of the proposed route by the person proposing to remove or to cause to be removed such building three clear days before doing so, and a sum to be fixed by the Electrical Engineer shall be deposited by such person as security for any damage that may be done to the electric light wires or poles or supports, and in the event of any damage being done to the electric light wires or poles or supports (of which damage the Electrical Engineer shall be the sole judge), the whole or any part of the sum so deposited may be retained by the Council to cover the cost of repairing and making good such damage.
- 8. In the event of the sums so deposited as mentioned in the two preceding clauses not being sufficient to cover the amount of damage, the sum expended by the Council in repairing and making good any road, street, right-of-way, or footpath, or the electric light wires or poles or supports, in excess of such deposit, shall be paid by the person removing or erecting or constructing the said building or by the person causing the same to be removed or erected or constructed, as the case may be, in the discretion of the Council.
- 9. In no case whatever shall any buildings containing any room used or intended to be used for the purpose of habitation, which is less than ten feet from the floor to the top of the wall-plate, be removed from outside the municipality to any part within the municipality.
- 10. No person shall creet, construct, or build, or cause to be erected, constructed, or built, any building in which any room used or intended to be used for the purpose of habitation is of a less height than ten feet from the floor to the top of the wall-plate.
- 11. In the case of all buildings having walls constructed of wood, wood and iron, hessian, or other inflammable material, whether removed from one part of

the municipality to another or from outside the municipality to within the municipality, or hereafter to be built, erected, or constructed, no external wall of any such building shall be built, erected, or constructed on any lot unless the same is distant two feet at least from the dividing line of the lots on either side. Where two or more such buildings are placed on land in the same possession, or occupation, or control, the external walls shall be distant at least four feet, and the external wall of each building shall be distant at least two feet from the dividing line between the said buildings. Where any building has been already built, and the position of such building is altered on the same block on which it has been erected, the Building Surveyor may direct that the external walls be kept two feet away from the dividing line or four feet from the wall of any other building, and that no additions to such building be allowed with external walls within the prescribed distances set out under this clause.

12. Any person who shall do any act contrary to, or who shall omit or neglect to do any act required to be done by, or shall offend against this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds; and if any person shall remove or cause to be removed, or creet or construct or cause to be erected or constructed, any external wall of any building contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, it shall be lawful for the Council to give notice in writing, under the hand of the Town Clerk, to such person, requiring him to forthwith remove or alter such external wall or walls of such building so that the provisions of this By-law shall be complied with, and upon failure of such person to comply with such requisition within one month after service of such notice it shall be lawful for any two or more Justices of the Peace, upon due proof of the service of such notice and of non-compliance therewith, by order in writing under their hands to empower the Council to pull down and remove such external wall or walls of such building, and to do all necessary works for carrying into effect such removal or alteration, at the expense of the owner of such building, and all expenses incurred by the Council in executing any such removal or alteration shall be paid by such owner to the Council.
