WHEREAS by "The Water Boards Act, 1904," the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to constitute the District of a Local Authority or the Districts of two or more Local Authorities, or any part or parts of such a District or Districts, a Water Area under such name as may be directed: And whereas under the provisions of the said Act the Governor is empowered by

Order in Council to constitute a Water Board to manage and control such Area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby constitute that part of the Roebourne Road District having the boundaries described in the Schedule hereto a Water Area, for the purpose of the said Act, under the name of the Roebourne Water Area, and does hereby appoint the Roebourne Road Board to be a Water Board, under the name of the Roebourne Water Board, for the administration of the Act within such Area.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 5th day of November, 1910.
