WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation declare, inter alia, that any Western Australian waters shall be closed against the taking of any prescribed species of fish by any means whatever, or against fishing generally, and by any method of capture, during any specified time in any year: And whereas it is desirable that the water known as "Capel River" should be declared closed as hereinafter provided: Now therefore I, the said Governor, ly and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—

That the waters of the Capel River with its tributaries shall be closed against fishing generally, and by every method of capture, except by fishing lines, not being long lines or bultows, from the date of this Proclamation.
