#### **PROCLAMATION**

(under 60 Vict., No. 22, Sec. 6)

By His Excellency Sir Gerald Strickland, Count della Catena, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc. WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT. G. STRICKLAND, Governor, [L.S.] 4915/10.

WHEREAS by "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893, Amendment Act, 1896" (60 Vict., No. 22), the Governor Amendment Act, 1896'' (60 Vict., No. 22), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to revest in His Majesty, as of his former estate, all or any lands whereof His Majesty may become the registered proprietor: And whereas His Majesty is now the registered proprietor of Avon Locations 52, 53, and k, and portions of Avon Locations m and 14, registered in the Office of Titles in Volumes 375, 321, 400, Folios 104, 60, and 26 respectively: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation revest in His Majesty, his heirs and successors, Avon Locations 52, 53, and k, and portions of Avon Locations m and 14 aforesaid, as of his former estate.

The Goldfields Water Supply Act, 1902. (2 Edw. VII., No. 33.) ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 30th day of November, 1910.

His Excellency the Governor. The Honourables—The Premier.

The Colonial Secretary. WHEREAS by Section 20 of "The Goldfields Water Supply Act, 1902," the Governor may, by Order in Coun-cil, constitute and define the boundaries of a Water Area for the purposes of the said Act, and may from time to time alter the boundaries of the Water Area: And whereas by Order in Council dated the 11th day of February, 1903, the boundaries of a Water Area were duly constituted and defined: And whereas the boundaries of the said Water Area were altered by Order in Council dated 26th June, 1907: And whereas it is desirable to further alter the boundaries of the Water Area as defined by the aforesaid Order in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and under the powers of the said Act, doth order that as and from this date the boundaries of the said Water Area shall be constituted and defined as follows:

The area of land described in the plan deposited in the office of the Minister for Works and marked "Plan of the Catchment Area of the Coolgardie Goldfields Water Supply '' (P.W.D., W.A., 6535), and coloured pink in the said plan, which area of land is referred to in ''The Coolgardie Goldfields Water Supply Construction Act, 1898'' (62 Vict., No. 19), as the "Catchment Area."

All land situated within the Reserve for Goldfields Water Supply, and numbered 8059 on Plan 1C/40 in the Lands Department.

All the land situated within a circle having its centre at the Midland Junction Post Office, and having a radius of five miles in length, but excluding the portion of such land South of a line commencing at the intersection of the said circle with the North-Eastern boundary of Location T; running thence South-Easterly along the said North-Eastern boundary of Location T to the centre of the Swan River; thence North-Easterly along the centre of the Swan River to a point West of the Western corner of Location 27; thence along the North-Western boundary of Location 28 to its intersection with the said circle.

All the land situated to the Westward of a line drawn North and South through the Swan View Railway Station, and situated within twenty (20) miles of the pipe main from Helena Weir to Mt. Charlotte Reservoir, Kal-goorlie, on either side of the said pipe main and through-out the length thereof.

All land situated within a circle having its centre at the Beverley Post Office, and having a radius of twenty miles in length.

All land situated within a circle having its centre at Southern Cross Railway Station, and having a radius forty miles in length.

All land situated within a circle having its centre at the Mt. Charlotte Reservoir, Kalgoorlie, and having a radius twenty-five miles in length.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

# At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 30th day of November, 1910.

The Colonial Secretary. WHEREAS by Section 20 of "The Goldfields Water Supply Act, 1902," it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute and define the boundaries of a Water Area for the purposes of the said Act, and may divide the area into districts, and define the boundaries of the districts: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and under the powers of the said Act, doth hereby revoke and cancel the Order in Council dated 11th December, 1907, and in lieu thereof doth order that as and from this date the said area shall be divided into the Districts specified in the Schedule hereto, with the several boundaries therein respectively hereto, with the several boundaries therein respectively defined.

#### THE SCHEDULE.

#### The Midland Water District.

All that portion of the Water Area situated to 1. the Westward of a line drawn North and South through a point twenty-seven chains West from the Swan View Railway Station to the boundaries of the Water Area.

#### The Mundaring Water District.

2. All that portion of the Water Area West of a line drawn at right angles to the pipe line at a point two miles West of Northam Town Hall, such line being where west or Northam from Hall, such the being extended to the boundaries of the Water Area on both sides of the pipe line, but excluding therefrom that portion of the Water Area comprised within the Midland Water District, Newcastle Water District, York Water District, and Beverley Water District respectively.

#### The Northam Water District.

3. All that portion of the Water Area bounded by a circle having as its centre the Northam Town Hall, and the radius of which shall be two miles.

#### The Newcastle Water District.

4. All that portion of the Water Area comprised within the boundaries hereunder described :-

Starting at the intersection of the 30in. main with the Newcastle main in the Northam Commonage; thence going Westerly to the intersection of a circle (having as its centre the Newcastle Post Office, the radius of which is nine miles), and the Clackline-Newcastle Rail-way; thence Westerly and round said circle to the inter-section with the North-Eastern corner of Avon Location 'T1; thence South-Easterly to the North-Eastern corner of Avon Location 1753; thence in a Southerly direction to point of commencement.

#### The York Water District.

5. All that portion of the Water Area comprised within the boundaries hereunder described:---

Starting at Burlong Pool, on the Avon River; thence along the South boundary of Avon Location C1, and continuing in a South-Westerly direction to the Western boundary of Avon Location d; thence along the boun-daries of said Location d to its South-Western corner; thence in a South-Westerly direction to the North-Eastern corner of Avon Location 2502; thence South-Eastern to the North-Western corner of Avon Location 4016; thence North-Easterly along Road No. 1096 to its inter-section with the Northern boundary of Avon Location u; thence along North boundaries of Location u and t to the Avon River; thence in a Southerly direction and along the Avon River to the intersection of the Greenhills Railway; thence along said railway to Greenhills Station; thence along the Greenhills-Belmunging Road to the North-Western corner of Avon Location 2069; thence in a North-Westerly direction to the South-Western corner of Avon Location 448; thence to point of starting.

6. All that portion of the Water Area contained within a circle having its centre at the Beverley Post Office, and having a radius of twenty miles, but excluding therefrom the portion comprised within the York Water District.

#### The Central Water District.

7. All that portion of the Water Area between the Eastern boundary of the Mundaring Water District and the Western boundary of the Coolgardie Water District, but excluding therefrom that portion of the Water Area comprised within the Northam Water District, the South-ern Cross Water District, the Bullfinch Water District, Newcastle Water District, York Water District, and Beverley Water District respectively.

#### The Southern Cross Water District.

8. All that portion of the Water Area comprised within a circle, the centre of which shall be the Southern Cross Railway Station, and the radius of which shall be seven miles in length.

### The Bullfinch Water District.

9. All that portion of the Water Area comprised within a circle having as its centre the 22-mile peg on the road from Southern Cross to Golden Valley, and having a radius of sixteen miles, but excluding therefrom the portions of the Water Area contained within the Southern Cross and Coolgardie Water Districts.

#### The Coolgardie Water District.

10. All that portion of the Water Area situated East of a line drawn North and South through the Southern Cross Railway Station, extending to the boundaries of the Water Area on both sides of the pipe line and West of a line drawn at right angles to the pipe line and tross gari Railway Station, extending to the boundaries of the Water Area on both sides of the pipe line, but ex-cluding therefrom that portion of the Water Area comprised within the Southern Cross Water District.

### The Kalgoorlie Water District.

11. All that portion of the Water Area East of a line drawn at right angles to the pipe line at Mungari Rail-way Station, and extending to the boundaries of the area on both sides of the pipe line, but excluding there-from those portions of the Water Area comprised within the Boulder, Kanowna, and Bulong Water Districts.

#### The Boulder Water District.

12. All that portion of the Water Area bounded by a line starting at a point on the boundary of Water Area due South of Lakeside Railway Station, and passing thence due North to Lakeside Railway Station; thence North-Westerly along railway to the intersection of railway with the boundary of Boulder townsite, between Gold Mining Leases 16E and 31E; thence following the said boundary Northerly, North-Westerly, and by irregular line South-Westerly to most Westerly point of Boulder townsite; thence by straight line to most Southerly point of Sommerville Suburban Area; thence due South to boundary of Water Area; thence along last-mentioned boundary to the starting point, but excluding therefrom those portions of the Water Area comprised within all gold mining leases that are or may be supplied with water from the Kalgoorlie and Boulder Mines Water Trust.

#### The Kanowna Water District.

13. All that portion of the Water Area bounded by a circle having as its centre the railway station at Kanowna, and the radius of which shall be five miles in length.

#### The Bulong Water District.

14. All that portion of the Water Area having as its centre the Post Office at Bulong, and the radius of which shall be nine miles in length.



#### COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 19 of 1910.

Between the Bunbury and District Branch of the Metropolitan and South-Western Amalgamated Certificated Engine-drivers' Union of Workers of Western Australia, Perth (hereinafter referred to as "the Union"), Applicant, and Millar's Karri and Jarrah Company (1902), Limited, the Timber Corporation, Limited, W.A. Jarrah Sawmills, Limited, Sexton & Drysdale, Whittaker Brothers, Bunning Brothers, and Franklin & Finlay (hereinafter included under the designation "the Employers"), Respondents.

#### AWARD.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as "the Court") having taken into consideration the matter of the dispute between the above-named parties, and having heard the Union and the Employers by their respective representatives duly appointed, and having heard the witnesses called and examined on behalf of the Union and the Employers respectively and crossexamined on behalf of the parties respectively, doth hereby order and award that, as between the Union and the members thereof and the Employers and each of them, the terms, conditions, and provisions contained in the Schedule hereto shall be binding upon the union and every member thereof, and upon the employers and each of them, and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be and they are hereby incorporated into and declared to form part of this award: And further, that the union and every member thereof, and the employers and each of them, shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing by the said terms, conditions, and provisions on the part of the union and the members thereof, and on the part of the employers and each of them, respectively required to be done, observed, and performed, and shall not do anything in contravention of the said terms, conditions, and provisions, but shall in all respects abide by and observe and perform the same: And the Court doth further order that the industry to which this award shall apply is the industry of Engine-driving on Bush Sawmills, and that it shall have effect over the South-West Industrial District of the State, and further that it shall operate from and inclusive of the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, until the thirty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, and thenceforward from year to year, subject to the right of any party interested to apply to amend, alter, or revise the same.

#### THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE TO.

1. The minimum rate of wages which shall be paid by an employer or accepted by a workman employed in any of the capacities hereinafter mentioned shall be as follows:—

Locomotive engine-drivers-1s. 6d. per hour.

Stationary engine-drivers:-

- In charge of a mill engine where a second-class certificated driver is by law required—11s. 4d. per day of 8 hours. (Early and late attendance if required, 1 hour extra or 1s. 5d. per day.)
- In charge of a mill engine where a third-class certificated engine-driver is required by law—10s. per day of 8 hours. (Early and late attendance if required, 1 hour extra or 1s. 3d. per day.)
- In charge of a workshop engine, or a steam crosscut saw, or a mill winch— 9s. per day of 8 hours (inclusive of early and late attendance if required, 1 hour extra.)

The firing of the boiler shall be deemed portion of the stationary engine-driver's duty, but in case the boiler of the mill engine shall be so situated as to render it unpracticable or undesirable, in the opinion of the Inspector of Boilers, to apply this condition, then the wage of the mill engine-driver may be reduced to such sum not less than 10s. per day as may be mutually agreed upon by the manager of the mill and the secretary of the union or his deputy.

Provided that no reduction in wage shall be made in the case of the driver of a workshop engine, or a mill winch, or steam crosscut saw, to which steam is supplied from the main mill boilers.

2. (a.) In the case of the locomotive engine-driver, ten consecutive hours per day, or sixty per week, excluding any time absent from the engine for meals, shall be the recognised working time, and all time the locomotive engine-driver is engaged in excess of ten hours in any one day shall be considered overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(b.) In the case of stationary engine-drivers, forty-eight hours shall constitute the week's work. The said hours may be so arranged as to provide for not more than four hours fifteen minutes work without interruption on Saturday, and eight hours forty-five minutes work on all other week-days, with an interruption of one hour for meals.

All work beyond the hours above-mentioned (save and except such time as may be required for early and late attendance hereinbefore provided for) shall be considered as overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter. Each day's work shall stand by itself, but should the overtime in any one week exceed four hours, the excess shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

3. Work performed on Sunday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, and Eight Hours' Day shall be calculated and paid for at the rate of time and a half.

4. Each locomotive engine-driver shall be allowed one hour for early and late attendance and be paid for it.

Each locomotive engine-driver shall be supplied with the services of a competent fireman of not less than eighteen years of age.
