*The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898.**Prohibition of Transport of Fruit and Tomatoes.*

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with Regulations under the Act, the bringing into any specified portion of Western Australia, from any other portion or specified portion of Western Australia, of any specified plant, fruit, fungus, parasite, insect, or other thing which, in his opinion, is diseased or likely to spread disease: And whereas in the opinion of the Governor the bringing into that portion of the State of Western Australia situated within a radius of forty (40) miles from Bridgetown of Tomatoes and the Fruit hereinafter specified is likely to spread the disease known as Fruit Fly in such portion of the said State: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit absolutely the bringing into that portion of the State of Western Australia situated within

a radius of forty (40) miles from Bridgetown from any other portion of the said State of Tomatoes and the Fruit specified in the schedule hereto.

This Proclamation shall have operation and effect on and from the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia.

Loquats, apricots, peaches, plums, nectarines, figs, pears, apples, quinces, plantains, guavas, persimmons, citrus.
