The Land Act, 1898. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 4th day of January, 1911.

Present:

His Excellency the Governor. The Honourables—The Premier. The Attorney General.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 13183 (Lot 127, Leonora) should vest in and be held by the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Leonora, for the pur-

pose of a Band Room site: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Leonora, for the aforesaid purpose; subject, nevertheless, to the powers reserved to me by Section 41 of the said Act.

Extension of the Area of the District of the Merredin Local Board of Health.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 17 of "The Health Act, 1898," the area of any District defined for the purpose of a Local Board of Health may from time to time be extended, altered, or contracted by the Governor in Council, and whereas it is desired to extend the District of the Merredin Local Board of Health: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, on the recommendation of the Central Board of Health, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby extend the area of the Merredin Local Board of Health to include that portion of land embraced within the undermentioned boundaries:

Bounded on the East by a portion of the Eastern boundary of the Merredin townsite and its prolongation Northward to a point 20 chains North of the Eastern Goldfields ward to a point 20 chains North of the Eastern Goldheids Railway Reserve; on the North by a line parallel to the Northern boundary of the said Railway reserve and 20 chains distant therefrom; on the West by the South-Western boundary of Reserve 8228 (Pumping Station No. 4) and its prolongation North-Westward to a point 20 chains distant from the Eastern Goldfields Railway Reserve; and on the South by a line 20 chains distant from and parallel to the Southern boundary of the said Railway Reserve.

MUNICIPALITY OF NORTH PERTH.

Whereas by "The Health Act, 1898," and the Acts amending the same, the Local Board of Health has power to make By-laws and power to repeal By-laws: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the said Act and the Acts amending the same, the Local Board of Health doth hereby repeal Subclause (a) of By-law 112, and substitute therefor the following:-
