## PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir Gerald Strickland,  
TO WIT. } Count della Catena, Knight Commander of  
G. STRICKLAND, } the Most Distinguished Order of St.  
Governor. } Michael and St. George, Governor in and  
[L.S.] } over the State of Western Australia and  
its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS by "The Insect-Pests Amendment Act, 1898," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by proclamation, appoint any specified ports to be the only ports of entry for plants or fruit or any specified plant or fruit: And whereas the term plant includes any vegetables and the term fruit includes the product of any plants: And whereas, to enable the regulations made under the said Act for the inspection of imported potatoes to be carried into effect, it is necessary to appoint certain ports to be the only ports of entry for potatoes: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the following ports, viz., the ports of Carnarvon, Geraldton, Fremantle, Perth, Hopetoun, and Esperance to be the only ports of entry for potatoes: Provided that permission may be granted by the Minister for Agriculture, in his discretion, to land potatoes consigned prior to the publication of this Proclamation to any port not being a port of entry.

Subject as aforesaid, this Proclamation shall have operation and effect on and from the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia.

## PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by proclamation, prohibit either absolutely, or except in accordance with regulations under this Act, the bringing into any specified portion of Western Australia, from any other portion or specified portion of Western Australia, of any specified plant, fruit, fungus, parasite, insect, or other thing which, in his opinion, is diseased or likely to spread disease: And whereas the bringing of potatoes into that portion of the South-West Division of Western Australia, described in the Schedule hereto, from other portions of Western Australia, is likely to introduce the disease known as Irish Potato Blight: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit absolutely the bringing of potatoes into that portion of the South-West Division of Western Australia described in the Schedule hereto from any other portion of Western Australia, except with the permission in writing of the Minister for Agriculture and subject to regulations made under the Act.

## *The Schedule.*

All that portion of the South-West Division of Western Australia lying to the South of a straight line commencing at the South-West corner of the Municipal District of Fremantle, and extending thence along the South boundary of the said Municipal District Eastward to the most Southerly point of the Municipal District of Beverley, and thence Eastward to the 119deg. meridian of East longitude.
