Strictly Preserving Cockatoos in Certain Portions of the Gascoyne Magisterial District.

(The Game Act, 1892.)

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1892" (Vict. 55, No. 36), the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to declare that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times

strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State, or in any one or more portions thereof: And whereas it is deemed desirable that Cockatoos shall be strictly preserved within those portions of the State hereinafter more particularly described: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that Cockatoos shall be at all times strictly preserved in those portions of the State situated in the Gascoyne Magisterial District, and more particularly described in the Schedules hereto:—

First Schedule.

Bounded on the West by the sea-coast; on the North by a line extending from the sea-coast Eastward ten miles North of any portion of the Gascoyne River to the Eastern boundary; on the East by a line running due North and South three miles to the East of the junction of the Gascoyne River and the Lyons River, and on the South by a line extending from the Eastern boundary Westward ten miles South of any portion of the Gascoyne River to the sea-coast.

Second Schedule.

Bounded on the West by the sea-coast, and on the North by a line extending from the sea-coast Eastward ten miles North of any portion of the Minilya River to the Eastern boundary; on the East by a line running due North and South through the source of the Minilya River, and on the South by a line extending from the Eastern boundary Westward ten miles South of any portion of the Minilya River to the sea-coast.
