WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare, *inter alia*, that any West Australian waters shall be closed against the taking of any prescribed species of

fish by any means whatever, or against fishing generally, by any method of capture, during any specified time in any year: And for the more effectual conservation of the fish supply, and for the protection of the spawning and feeding grounds for immature fish, that the whole or any defined portion of any West Australian waters shall be closed against the use of fishing nets or fishing lines, or of either such methods of catching fish, for such term as the Governor shall think fit: And whereas it is deemed expedient :—

To prohibit during the months of November, December, and January in each and every year to take any female Crayfish carrying ova on the underside of the tail or abdomen in any portion of the sea; and also that during these said months it shall be unlawful to offer for sale, or have in possession any such female Crayfish:

Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—

It shall be unlawful for any person to take, or remove in any manner whatever, during the months of November, December, and January in each and every year, any female Crayfish carrying ova on the underside of the tail or abdomen, in any portion of the sea; and also that it shall be unlawful during the said months to offer for sale, or have in possession, any such female Crayfish.

Every person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and shall forfeit the implements used and all fish which shall have been taken.

WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare, *inter alia*, that any West Australian waters shall be closed against the taking of any prescribed species of fish by any means whatever, or against fishing generally, by any method of capture, during any specified time in any year: And for the more effectual conservation of the fish supply, and for the protection of the spawning and feeding grounds for immature fish, that the whole or any defined portion of any West Australian waters shall be closed against the use of fishing nets or fishing lines, or of either such methods of catching fish, for such term as the Governor shall think fit: And whereas it is desirable that the waters described in the several Schedules hereto should be declared closed, as hereinafter provided: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—

(1.) That all those portions of the West Australian waters defined in the First Schedule hereto shall, except as hereinafter provided, be closed against fishing generally, and by every method of capture (except by means of fishing lines not being long lines or bultows), from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to the 31st day of December, 1912, inclusive; and

(2.) That all those portions of the West Australian waters defined in the Second Schedule hereto shall be closed against fishing generally, and by every means of capture (except by means of fishing lines not being long lines or bultows), from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to the 30th day of April, 1912, and from the 1st day of November to the 31st day of December, 1912, inclusive; and

(3.) That all those portions of the West Australian waters defined in the Third Schedule hereto shall be closed against fishing generally, and by every means of capture (except by means of fishing lines not being long lines or bultows), from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to the 31st day of March, 1912, and from the 1st day of October to the 31st day of December, 1912, inclusive; and

(4.) That those portions of the West Australian waters defined in the Fourth Schedule hereto shall be closed against fishing generally (except for prawns) by means of any sunk net, or by means of any net containing or having attached thereto a bag, cod, or pocket, from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to the 31st day of December, 1912, inclusive; and

(5.) That those portions of the West Australian waters defined in the Fifth Schedule hereto shall be closed against the taking of crayfish, by any means whatever, from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to the 31st day of December, 1912, inclusive.

First Schedule.

A.

The Swan River and its tributaries from the Narrows at Mill Point, in Perth Water, upwards; the Swan River downwards from a line drawn from the shore end of Point Walter Jetty to the Southern extremity of Point Resolution; and that portion of the sea within a radius of a quarter of a mile from the Western extremity of the North Mole, Fremantle, and the Canning River and its tributaries from the Lower Canning Bridge upwards. Except for prawns (*vide* separate Proclamation of even date.)

B.

The Murray River, the Serpentine River, the entrance to Peel's Inlet, and the portion of the sea as follows:—

No. 1 Bank.

(Portion of the sea and entrance to Peel's Inlet.)
Bounded by a line starting from the most Westerly portion of Hall's Point, and extending North one-quarter of a mile; thence East to the sea-shore, and along it to the entrance to Peel's Inlet Southward and Eastward to a Point East of the East end of Creery Island; thence West to the said end and Westward along the South shore of the said Creery Island to its Southernmost point; thence Westerly to the South-East corner of Murray Location 5; thence in a general Northerly direction by the Western shore of the entrance to Peel's Inlet and the sea-shore to the starting point. Provided always, that such portion of the said waters which is situated North or North-West and seaward of the bar at the entrance to Peel's Inlet, near Mandurah, shall (except within a radius of a quarter of a mile from any opening for the time being through the bar), be open for fishing generally from the 24th day of March, 1912, to the 15th day of May, 1912, both days inclusive.

No. 2 Bank.

(Including the whole of the Murray and Serpentine Rivers, with their estuaries.)

Bounded by a line starting from a point on the Eastern shore of Peel's Inlet situated East of the Southernmost point of Goongoolup Island, and extending West through the said point for half-a-mile; thence North to the said shore of Peel's Inlet, and along it Southerly to the starting point. To include also the Murray River and Serpentine River, with their estuaries, tributaries, lakes, and lagoons the waters of which, at any time of the year, have access directly or indirectly to the sea.

C.

Koombana Bay, as follows:—That portion of Koombana Bay situated Southward of a line extending about 64 degrees from the junction of the stone causeway with the Bunbury Jetty, to a white post on the shore of North Bunbury.

D.

The waters of the Preston River, the Collie River, the Brunswick River, and the Capel River, with their tributaries.

E.

Toby's Inlet, as follows:—The whole of Toby's Inlet and that portion of the sea within a radius of a quarter of a mile from the mouth of Toby's Inlet.

F.

Kalgan River and King River, and portions of Oyster Harbour as follows:—

(1.) Kalgan River and King River and portion of Oyster Harbour, bounded by lines starting from Point Henty and extending Southward along the Western shore of Oyster Harbour about 20 chains; thence South-East to a point on the Eastern shore of Oyster Harbour aforesaid situate 15 chains Southward from Swan Point; thence Northward and Westward along part of the Eastern and Northern shores of the said Oyster Harbour to a point North from Point Henty; thence South to the starting point.

(2.) Entrance to Oyster Harbour: The North and South boundaries, being East and West lines passing through points situate 10 chains North and 10 chains South respectively from Emu Point; the East and West boundaries being the East and West shores of the said entrance.

G.

Denmark and Hay Rivers (near Albany), and portions of Wilson's Inlet as follows:—

(1.) Denmark River and that portion of Wilson's Inlet within a radius of half-a-mile from the mouth of the said Denmark River.

(2.) Hay River and that portion of Wilson's Inlet within a radius of half-a-mile from the mouth of the said Hay River.

H.

Taylor (Nannarup) Inlet (near Albany): The whole.

I.

Thompson's Bay, Rottnest Island, as follows:—From Point Phillip to Phillip Rock Beacon; thence to Duck Rock Beacon; thence to Bathurst Point.

J.

East and West of Geraldton Jetties as follows:—That portion of the ocean waters extending from a point 100 yards to the East of the Geraldton Railway Jetty to a point 100 yards to the West of the said jetty and half-a-mile seaward; and that portion of the ocean waters ex-

tending from a point 100 yards to the East of the Geraldton Esplanade Jetty to a point 100 yards West of the said jetty, and half-a-mile seaward.

K.

All portion of Western Australian waters known as the "Dead Water," situate in Sussex Location No. 11.

L.

Portion of Cockburn Sound as follows:—That portion of the ocean waters lying South of a line extending Eastward from the extreme end of Point John to a point on the sea-coast situate 20 chains North-Eastward of the shore and of the Rockingham Jetty.

M.

All that portion of Western Australian waters contained in the Vasse and Wonnerup Estuaries.

Second Schedule.

East and West of Busselton Jetty as follows:—

(a.) That portion of the ocean waters extending from the East side of the Busselton Jetty one mile and a-half along the foreshore and half-a-mile seaward.

(b.) That portion extending from the West side of the said jetty one-half mile along the foreshore and half-a-mile seaward during a period of six months.

Third Schedule.

North-West and South-East of a point locally known as the Fish Rock, in Geographe Bay, as follows:—

(a.) That portion of the ocean waters extending from the North-West of the Fish Rock half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile seaward.

(b.) That portion extending from the South-East of the said point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile seaward during a period of six months.

Fourth Schedule.

The Swan River and its tributaries.

The Canning River and its tributaries.

Fifth Schedule.

Rottneet Island: Within the sea limits of half-a-mile from the high-water mark.

Koombana Bay.

The Swan River.

That those portions of the Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereunder shall be closed against

the taking of prawns, by means of any net other than a hand-scoop net, from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to the 31st December, 1912, inclusive.

And I, the said Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act to make regulations for the purpose therein mentioned, do hereby declare that the length of nets to be used for prawning in the Swan or Canning Rivers in waters open for prawning shall not exceed 25 fathoms in length, and the mesh thereof shall not be less than one-half inch.

Schedule.

That portion of the Swan River extending downwards from a line drawn from Point Walter to Point Resolution and the Swan River extending upwards from the Narrows at Mill Point.

That portion of the Canning River extending upwards from a line drawn due South from Salter's Point.

WHEREAS by Section 139 of "The Roads Act, 1911," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of "The Permanent Reserves Act, 1899," the Governor may place any Public Reserve under the control and management of a Road Board, and that for the purpose of controlling or managing such Reserve the Board shall have all the power of a Board of Parks and Reserves appointed under "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," together with the powers conferred by "The Roads Act, 1911": And whereas it is expedient that Reserve No. 7080 (Common, Marble Bar) should be placed under the control and management of the Marble Bar Road Board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Roads Act, 1911," do hereby place the said Reserve under the control and management of the Marble Bar Road Board.

WHEREAS by Section 20 of "The Goldfields Water Supply Act, 1902," the Governor may, by order in Council, constitute and define the boundaries of a Water Area for the purpose of the said Act, and may from time to time alter the boundaries of the Water Area: And whereas by Order in Council dated the 11th day of February, 1903, the boundaries of a Water Area were duly constituted and defined: And whereas the boundaries of the said Water Area were altered by Order in Council dated 30th November, 1910: And whereas it is desirable to further alter the boundaries of the Water Area as defined by the aforesaid Order in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and under the powers of the said Act, doth order that as and from this date the boundaries of the said Water Area shall be constituted and defined as follows:—

All the land situated within a circle having its centre at the Midland Junction Post Office and having a radius of five (5) miles in length, but excluding the portion of such land South of a line commencing at the intersection of the said circle with the North-Eastern boundary of Location T, running thence South-Easterly along the said North-East boundary of Location T to the centre of the Swan River; thence North-East along the centre of the Swan River to a point West of the Western corner of Location 27; thence along North-Eastern boundary of Location 28 to its intersection with the said circle.

All the land situated to the Eastward of a line drawn North and South through the Swan View Railway Station and situated within fifty (50) miles of the pipe main from Helena Weir to Mt. Charlotte Reservoir, Kalgoorlie, on either side of the said pipe main and throughout the length thereof, but excluding therefrom that portion comprised in the Canning Reservoir Watershed Reserve 5913 and Victoria Reservoir Catchment Reserve 1774.

All the land situated within a circle having its centre at the Mt. Charlotte Reservoir, Kalgoorlie, and having a radius of fifty (50) miles.

NOBEL PEACE PRIZE.

All proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th, 1912, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person *before the first of February of the same year.*

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) Members of Parliament and Members of Government of the different States, as well as members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) Members of the International Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) Members of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau; (e) Members and Associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) University Professors of Political Science and of Law, of History and of Philosophy; and (g) Persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, Section 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to Section 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

For particulars, *qualified persons* are requested to apply to the Office of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, Drammensvei 19, Kristiania.

Amendment of By-laws.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the By-laws made under the provisions of Section 6 of 62 Viet., No. 19, "An Act to authorise the construction of Works for the Supply of Water to the Coolgardie Goldfields," and of Sections 105 and 106 of "The Goldfields Water Supply Act, 1902," by the Minister for Works, acting under the powers conferred by the aforesaid Acts and approved in Executive Council on 23rd December, 1908, and amended by Executive Council on 7th September, 1909, 8th December, 1909, and 18th May, 1910, being further amended by the addition thereto of the attached new by-law, to be numbered 85, and which shall take effect as from 1st January, 1912:—

BY-LAW 85.

Water rates shall be levied within the Southern Cross Water District upon the net annual value of all rateable lands within such District, at the rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum.

The minimum sum payable as water rate within the Southern Cross Water District on each separately assessed property shall be One pound per annum.

Every ratepayer in the Southern Cross Water District shall be entitled to consume on each separately assessed property for which he is rated that quantity of water which, if calculated at the price of Five shillings and tenpence per thousand gallons, would amount to the equivalent of the water rate paid on such property, provided that such water be taken during the period for which the rate is struck.

The provisions of the By-laws made under the above-mentioned Act and published in the *Government Gazette* of 31st December, 1908, except By-laws Nos. 55 and 58, shall apply to and shall be effective within the Southern Cross Water District.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 17 of 1911.

Between Metropolitan Timber Yards, Sawmills, and Woodworkers' Employees' Union of Workers (hereinafter referred to as "the union"), Applicant, and The Coastal District Timber Merchants' Industrial Union of Employers; Millars' Karri and Jarrah Company (1902), Limited; Whittaker Brothers; Bunning Brothers, Limited; Franklin & Finlay; and Port, Honey & Co. (hereinafter included under the designation "the employers"), Respondents.

AWARD.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Court") having taken into consideration the matter of an industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties, and having heard the union and the employers by their respective representatives duly appointed, and having heard the witnesses called and examined on behalf of the union and on behalf of the employers, and cross-examined on behalf of the said parties respectively, doth hereby order and award that as between the union and the members thereof and the employers and each of them the terms, conditions, and provisions contained in the schedule hereto shall be binding upon the union and the members thereof, and upon the employers and each of them and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be and they are hereby incorporated into and declared to form part of this award: And further, that the union and the members thereof and the employers and each of them shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing by the said terms, conditions, and provisions required to be done, observed, and performed and shall not do anything in contravention of the said terms, conditions, and provisions, but shall, in all respects, abide by and observe and perform the same: And the Court doth further order that the industry to which this award shall apply is the city sawmilling industry, and that it shall be deemed to have come into effect on the twentieth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and eleven, and that it shall remain in force until the twentieth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

1. *Hours.*—(a.) Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work for all workers in the industry except those hereinafter specifically provided for.

(b.) The hours of labour for stablemen shall be fifty-six per week, extending over seven days.

(c.) The hours of duty for night-watchmen shall not exceed seven days of twelve hours each week.

(d.) Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work for horse-drivers, such forty-eight hours to be exclusive of meal time and also of such time as is required for grooming, harnessing, and unharnessing the horses. Three-quarters of an hour, clear, shall be allowed for meals on the first four working days of the week, and one hour clear on Friday.

2. *Rates of pay.*—The following shall be the minimum rates of wage payable to the workers specified:—

3. *Horse-drivers.*—(a.) When the horse-driver is engaged driving two horses for more than eight hours in any one week he shall be entitled to be paid at the rate of 1s. 2½d. per hour for the whole of the time he is so engaged.

(b.) All drivers shall be entitled to the following holidays on full pay, namely:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Eight Hours' Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and New Years' Day. If required to work on any of the said days, the driver shall be entitled to double rate for such day.

(c.) Drivers having the feeding of horses shall be paid extra for feeding and stabling according to the following scale:—

4. *Stablemen.*—

(a.) Each stableman shall be allowed one Sunday off each month, in respect of which no deduction shall be made from his weekly wage.

(b.) If the stableman is required to live at the stables the employer shall provide reasonable accommodation for him, free of charge.

5. A night watchman, if called upon in the night time to do work other than that of tending to boiler fires shall be paid at the rate of 6d. per hour for the time so occupied, in addition to the night-watchman's wage.

6. *Overtime.*—Overtime at the rate of one quarter shall be paid for all time worked after the hour of 5 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, and after the hour of noon on Saturday of each week.

Provided that in the case of horse-drivers overtime shall not include time spent in harnessing and grooming the horse, and that overtime shall not be deemed to have commenced unless the driver shall be more than fifteen minutes late in returning to the yard.

(The Court is of opinion that, owing to the nature of the horse-driver's employment, there shall be a few minutes "give and take" on either side, hence the exemption in the latter portion of the foregoing proviso, but the said exemption is not to be deemed to confer upon the employer the arbitrary right of working the driver for an extra period of fifteen minutes per day).

This clause shall not be deemed to apply to night-watchmen or stablemen.

7. *Payment.*—All wages shall be paid weekly, immediately on the completion of the week's work.

8. *Record.*—Each employer shall keep a record of the time worked, and the wages paid to each worker, including overtime, and the said record shall be available at least once in every month during working hours to the Secretary or other person appointed by the union.

9. *Under-rate workers.*—A worker who is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate, which shall be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the worker's union.

If, within seven days' after being notified in writing, of the workers' desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed, the said secretary and worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply, in writing, to the nearest resident or police magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage.

The worker shall give such secretary two days' notice, in writing, of his intention to apply to the magistrate, and the said secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application.

The magistrate may fix the rate of wage, and his decision shall be final.

Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by an employer for such wage for a period of six calendar months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until fourteen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the secretary of the union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause.

Provided always that the employer shall not employ more than one such incompetent worker to every four fully paid workers or fraction of the first four.

10. *Apprentices.*—(i.) Apprentices to the machining branch of the industry shall, unless bound by indentures, be engaged under the terms hereinafter set forth. All indentures shall be forthwith registered in the manner hereinafter provided for (Form 1 in Appendix hereto) with the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration.

(ii.) They shall not exceed in number one to every four machinists or fraction of the first four employed by each employer or firm of employers for the twelve months previous to engaging the apprentice.

(iii.) The term of apprenticeship to the machining branch of the trade shall be four years. A probationary period of six months previous to being bound shall be lawful. Such probationary period shall be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship.

(iv.) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to the apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice, to complete his term with another employer, but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced. (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto.)

(v.) In the absence of indentures apprentices shall be bound for the term and on the conditions herein provided and subject to the following provisions:—

(a.) Any employer taking an apprentice shall give notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration in the form hereinafter provided (Form 1 in Appendix hereto), and shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall, subject to the provisions of sub-clause (xii.) hereof, pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.

(b.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 6 in the Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the wages prescribed by this award according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration of such transfer in the form hereinafter provided (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon any employer to find any apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall, nevertheless, give him a certificate for the time actually served.

(c.) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.

(d.) When an apprentice is discharged for cause, the employer shall send a notice in writing of the discharge and the cause thereof, to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration (Form 3 in Appendix hereto.)

(vi.) The minimum weekly wage payable to an apprentice to the machining branch of the timber industry shall be:—

(vii.) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself for examination by the Board of Examiners, hereinafter constituted, at the expiration of each period of twelve months of his service. Notice of his intention to submit himself for examination shall be given by the apprentice to the clerk of the Court of Arbitration at least fourteen days before the termination of each twelve-monthly period, and may be given in the Form numbered 4 of the Appendix hereto. Every such notice shall be accompanied by a fee of 2s. 6d

(viii.) Upon the receipt of such notice the clerk of the Court of Arbitration will furnish the apprentice with an examination certificate in the Form 5 of the Appendix hereto.

(ix.) The clerk of the Court will notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates desirous of submitting themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all respects to facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(x.) The examination will be held during the month of August in each year on a date to be fixed by the Board of Examiners. The Board of Examiners shall consist of two persons skilled in the machining branch of the industry, one to be nominated by the union and the other to be nominated by the employers. Failing nomination by either or both of the parties referred to, a board of examiners may be constituted by the Court. In the event of a disagreement between the members of the Board the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them or nominated by the Court or President thereof at the request of either member, and the decision of such third person shall be final and conclusive. The Board of Examiners will examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(xi.) The Board will report to the Court in writing as to the result of each examination. Every apprentice shall be bound to produce to the Board of Examiners his examination certificate hereinbefore referred to, and the same shall be kept by the examiners and returned to the apprentice with the necessary endorsement at the conclusion of the examination.

(xii.) It shall be lawful for the employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing to the apprentice in accordance with the scale set forth in Subclause (vi.) hereof from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.

(xiii.) If the Board of Examiners reports to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this award under Section 83 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(xiv.) Such fees shall be paid by the clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.
