WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 19th day of December, 1911, made pursuant to "The Land Drainage Act, 1900," an area therein described was constituted a Drainage District for the purpose of the said Act, under the name of the Njookenbooroo Drainage District: And whereas under the provisions of Section 6 of the said Act the Governor may, on the constitution of any district, appoint by Proclamation six persons to be the first members of the Board for such District: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint

to be the first members of the Drainage Board for the said District until the third Thursday in December, 1912, under the name of "The Njookenbooroo Drainage Board of the District of Njookenbooroo.

On the North by Hertha Road; on the South by fore-shore of Herdsman Lake; on the West by Oswald Road; and on the East by King Edward Road.

- 2. I have to request that your Ministers will be so good as to cause the conditions of the Prize to be made known to those bodies and persons who are qualified to nominate candidates.
- 3. It will be observed that the names of candidates should be received by the Nobel Committee before the 1st of February, 1912.

NOBEL PEACE PRIZE.

All proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th, 1912, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified

Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the first of February of the same year.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) Members of Parliament and Members of Government of the different States, as well as members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) Members of the International Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) Members of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau; (e) Members and Associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) University Professors of Political Science and of Law, of History and of Philosophy; and (g) Persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, Section 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to Section 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

For particulars, qualified persons are requested to apply to the Office of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, Drammensvei 19, Kristiania.

THE METROPOLITAN WATER SUPPLY, SEWERAGE, AND DRAINAGE ACT, 1909.

Additional By-laws.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Department, 28th December, 1911.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following amendment to and additional By-laws, made by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, under the provisions of "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909."

The following By-laws are incorporated with and shall be read as one with the By-laws and Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th day of May, 1910:—

Sewerage Rate—Perth District.

No. 122. Subject to the provisions of Section 91 of "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," an annual sewerage rate shall be made and levied on all rateable land in the Perth District of tenpence in the pound on the net annual value.

Provided that a minimum rate of seven shillings and sixpence per annum shall be payable by the occupier or owner of any land (except unoccupied land on which no building is erected) the annual rate of which would not exceed seven shillings and sixpence per annum, and a minimum rate of three shillings and ninepence per annum shall be payable by the owner of any unoccupied land on which no building is erected, the annual rate of which would not exceed three shillings and ninepence.

Stormwater Rate-Perth District.

No. 123. An annual stormwater rate shall be made and levied upon all rateable land within the Perth District, upon the net annual value of all rateable land within such district, at the rate of fivepence in the pound per annum.

Provided that a minimum of two shillings and sixpence per annum shall be payable by the occupier or owner of any land (except unoccupied land on which no building is erected), the annual rate of which would not exceed two shillings and sixpence per annum, and a minimum rate of one shilling and threepence per annum shall be payable by the owner of any unoccupied land on which no building is erected, the annual rate of which would not exceed one shilling and threepence.

Sewerage Rate-Fremantle District.

No. 124.—Subject to the provisions of Section 91 of "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," an annual sewerage rate shall be made and levied on all rateable land in the Fremantle District of one shilling in the pound on the net annual value.

Provided that a minimum rate of seven shillings and sixpence per annum shall be payable by the occupier or owner of any land (except unoccupied land on which no building is erected), the annual rate of which would not exceed seven shillings and sixpence per annum, and a minimum rate of three shillings and ninepence per annum shall be payable by the owner of any unoccupied land on which no building is erected, the annual rate of which would not exceed three shillings and ninepence.

$Stormwater\ Rate - Fremantle\ District.$

No. 125. An annual stormwater rate shall be made and levied upon all rateable laud within the Fremantle District upon the net annual value of all rateable land within such district, at the rate of fivepence in the pound per annum.

Provided that a minimum rate of two shillings and sixpence per annum shall be payable by the occupier or owner of any land (except unoccupied land on which no building is creeted), the annual rate of which would not exceed two shillings and sixpence, and a minimum rate of one shilling and threepence per annum shall be payable by the owner of any unoccupied land on which no building is erected, the annual rate of which would not exceed one shilling and threepence.

Rates-How and when payable.

No. 126. All rates shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 14th day of January and the 14th day of July in every year.

Flushing Allowance.

No. 127. Every consumer of water who receives his supply of water through a meter and pays for such supply an amount exceeding the sum which he would be required to pay upon the rating of his premises, shall, out of such excess, be allowed, so far as such excess will admit thereof, a deduction equal to seven shillings and sixpence per annum in the Perth District, and five shillings per annum in the Fremantle District, on account of each water closet on his premises, the supply of water for the flushing whereof shall pass through and be re-corded by, such meter, except in the case of factories or premises having a range of privy closets receiving their water flush from one flushing cistern, in each of which cases the allowance or deduction shall be five shillings per annum in the Perth District, and three shillings and sixpence per annum in the Fremantle District, for each privy seat in such rauge.

Schedule of Prices at which Water will be supplied.

(Charitable Institutions.) Amendment of By-law 121.

The price of water supplied to charitable institutions including public hospitals shall be ninepence per thousand gallons in the Perth District, and sixpence per thousand gallons in the Fremantle District, unless a public laundry or other business is carried on upon the the premises, in which case the price shall be one shilling per thousand gallons in the Perth District and eightpence per thousand gallons in the Fremantle District.

GOLDFIELDS WATER SUPPLY.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the By-laws made under the provisions of Section 6 of 62 Vict., No. 19, "An Act to authorise the Construction of Works for the supply of Water to the Coolgardie Goldfields," and of Sections 105 and 106 of "The Goldfields Water Supply Act, 1902," and of "The Goldfields Water Supply Act Amendment Act, 1911," by the Minister for Works, acting under the powers conferred by the aforesaid Acts, and approved in Executive Council on 23rd December, 1908. proved in Executive Council on 23rd December, 1908, and amended by Executive Council on 7th September, 1909, 8th December, 1909, and 18th May, 1910, being further amended by the cancellation of By-laws No. 55 and No. 56 and the substitution therefor of the following By-laws No. 55 and No. 56, and that additions as shown hereunder be made to Schedule 1 referred to in By-law No. 58.

GOLDFIELDS WATER SUPPLY ACT, 1902. By-law No. 55.

Water rates shall be levied within the districts hereinafter mentioned upon the net annual value of all rateable lands, not rated as "country lands," within such districts at the rates stated, viz.:-

Midland Water District-Ninepence in the pound per annum.

Mundaring Water District-One shilling in the pound per annum.

Northam Water District-Tenpence in the pound per annum. Toodyay Water District-Two shillings in the pound per

annum. York Water District-One shilling and sixpence in the

pound per annum.

Beverley Water District—Two shillings in the pound per

Central Water District—One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum. Coolgardie Water District—One shilling and sixpence in

the pound per annum.

Kalgoorlie Water District-One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum.

Kanowna Water District-One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum. Boulder Water District—One shilling and sixpence in

the pound per annum. Bulong Water District—Two shillings in the pound per annum.

Water rates shall be levied on "country lands" (i.e., lands not situated within a municipal district, townsite, or suburban area) within the districts hereinafter mentioned, on the scale stated, viz.:—

Water District. Scale of Rates per annum. Mundaring On each piece or parcel of rateable land:— Northam Toodyay fixed sum of not exceeding York five pounds, and in addition . . Hereto a sum not exceeding Beverley Central fivepence per acre.

Subject to provision in Clause 3 of the Goldfields Water Supply Act Amendment Act for a higher rate in any area on application therefor by a majority of landholders.

By-law No. 56.

The minimum sum payable as rate on each separately assessed piece of land not rated as "country land" in every Water District, except in the Water Districts of Midland, Mundaring, and Northam, shall be one pound per annum.

The minimum sum payable as water rate on each separately assessed piece of land not rated as "country land" within the Water Districts of Midland, Mundaring, and Northam shall be ten shillings per annum upon vacant

land, and one pound per annum on all other land.

In the event of a dispute as to whether or not land shall be regarded as vacant, the decision of the Minister shall be final in every case.

Addition to Schedule 1 referred to in By-law 58.

A. For water supplied to lands in any Water District rated as "country lands" and, subject as hereinafter prescribed, not abutting on the thirty-inch main conduit from Mundaring to Kalgoorlie or on the main trunk extensions to Toodyay, Midland Junction, and York-Beverley respectively, the price of water allowed in return for the amount of rates paid or for minimum charges paid in lieu of rates, and the price of water supplied in excess of the quantity so allowed, shall be eight shillings per thousand gallons, and this price shall also be charged for water supplied to lands rated as "country lands" and served from any water main except the aforesaid main conduit and the three main trunk extensions, notwith-standing that such lands may be abutting on the aforesaid main conduit or main trunk extensions.

B. For water supplied to lands rated as country lands and abutting on and served from the thirty-inch main conduit from Mundaring to Kalgoorlie, and the main trunk extensions to Toodyay, Midland Junction, and York-Beverley respectively, the price in the respective districts shall be as specified in Schedule 1 as heretofore in force.
