WHEREAS by "The Mining Act, 1904," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation alter or amend the boundaries of a Goldfield: And whereas it is desirable to alter the boundaries of the Phillips River Goldfield: Now therefore I, Sir Gerald Strickland, Governor of the said State, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Phillips River Goldfield by substituting for the existing boundaries the boundaries defined in the schedule hereto, inclusive of the Miners' Homestead Leases in the schedule mentioned.

*The Schedule.*

Bounded by lines starting from a point on the Southern coast, near Red Islet, South of the 125-mile post on the Southern section of the No. 1 Rabbit-proof Fence; thence North, passing about 3¼ miles East of Mainnerup Pool, on the Albany-Ravensthorpe Road, to the said 125-mile post; thence North-Westerly along the fence to the 100-mile post; thence East to a point South of cairn H26, on Koorarawalyee Rock; thence South along the West boundary of the Dundas Goldfield to a point West of the 75-mile post on the Esperance-Dundas Road; thence East along the South boundary of the Dundas Goldfield 77 miles; thence South to a point West of survey mark N24 on Mt. Ridley; thence West to a point North of survey mark C66, on the Albany-Esperance telegraph line; thence South to a point 2½ miles North of survey mark C66 on the Albany-Esperance telegraph line; thence West about 35 miles (passing about 1¼ miles North of the crossing of the Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe and the Albany-Esperance telegraph lines) to a point 1½ miles East and about two miles South from a cairn on No Tree Hill; thence South to the sea-coast at Culham Inlet; thence South-Westward along the sea-coast to the starting point; and also to include within the said Goldfield the following Miners' Homestead Leases, namely, Nos. 25, 45, 46, 160, 162, 186, 208, and 256, which shall continue portions of the Phillips River Goldfield.

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1911," it is enacted that the Governor may divide any District into Wards, and define the boundaries of and assign names to Wards, and may determine the number of members for each Ward: And whereas it is desirable to divide the Dardanup Road District into wards with the boundaries, under the names, and with the right to be represented on the Board by the number of members hereinafter set out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby divide the Dardanup Road District into four wards, with the respective boundaries and names, with the right to be represented on the Board by the respective number of members hereinafter appearing, that is to say:—

*North Ward.*—Bounded on the North by a line along the Northern boundary of Road District. On the East from North-East corner of Northern boundary in a Southerly direction to North-East corner of Location 5661. On the South from North-East corner of Location 5661 Westerly to South-East boundary of Location 61. On the West from South-East corner of Location 61 Northerly to North-East corner of Subdivision 26, then follow railway in Westerly direction to South-East corner of Location 49; thence Northerly to North-West corner of Northern boundary of Road District. Number of members, two.

*East Ward.*—Bounded on the North by a line running Easterly along South boundary of North Ward. On the South along the South boundary of Location 1992 to North-West corner of same; then Northerly to North-East corner of Location 1596; then Westerly following the Northern boundaries of Locations 1596, 477, 543, 701. On the West following the Eastern boundaries of Locations 6104, 1516, 1049, 1211, 1575, 2029, and Subdivisions 9, 10, 11, 12, and South and East boundaries of Location 302, joining Southern boundary of North Ward. Number of members, three.

*South Ward.*—Bounded on the North by a line starting from the Western boundary of Road District at Location 308, proceeding in an Easterly direction to South-East corner of Recreation Ground; thence Northerly to Dardanup Station; thence Easterly to North-East corner of Location 302. On the East by a line following Western boundary of East Ward, continuing down to South-East corner of Location 247. ## BEVERLEY ROAD BOARD.

The Beverley Road Board, in exercise of the power conferred by Subsections 11, 14, 52, and 54 of Section 179 of "The Roads Act, 1911," hereby make the following By-laws for the purpose of regulating the use of and providing for the annual registration of Motor Vehicles:—

1. No traction engine, and no vehicle driven by any power other than horse or hand power and having on the wheels any bars, spikes, or other projections, shall be allowed to travel on the roads within the district without the approval of the Board being first obtained in writing, and any person found driving or using such traction engine or vehicle without the requisite permission shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £10, and the owner of any such traction engine or vehicle shall make compensation to the Board for any damage caused thereby to any road, bridge, or culvert.

2. An annual license fee of £1 shall be paid to the Board for every motor cycle and £2 for every motor car, as defined by Section 5 of the Act. Any person using an unlicensed motor car in the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10. Provided that any person licensed for some other district in which he resides shall not be required to take out a license under this By-law in respect of the same motor car.

3. The Board will issue to every holder of a motor car license special registration discs bearing a number together with the letters B.R.B., and the holder shall affix such discs in a conspicuous place on the front and rear of such vehicle. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Regulation 19 (d):—

"They are willing to supplement the Grant from the Department so that the Teacher, after paying all charges for board and lodging, shall have at least £30 per annum over. On the Goldfields the sum must be at least £40 per annum."

Regulation 21:—

"The Grant to Teachers engaged in such schools shall be at the rate of £7 per annum, or on the Goldfields £8 10s. per annum, for each pupil in average daily attendance. In addition to such grant they may be allowed, where necessary, a sum of £10 per annum as forage allowance. The salary will be paid on the average of the previous month."
