WHEREAS by "The Early Closing Act, 1902," it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation temporarily suspend the operation of the said Act, in so far as it applies to the closing time fixed or appointed for any shop or shops: And whereas it is expedient to exercise such power in manner hereinafter appearing: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation suspend the operation of the said Act (including all amendments thereof) during the fourth day of April, 1912, up till nine o'clock at night, in so far as it applies to the closing time of all shops situated in the Metropolitan Shop District and the Shop Districts constituted of the Municipal District of Albany and the Road District of Ravensthorpe, except such shops (not being chemists' or druggists' shops) as are mentioned in Schedule One of the said Act, and except registered small shops.
