APPLICATIONS are invited by the Commonwealth Public Service Commissioner from persons qualified for appointment to the following positions.

Applicants outside the Public Service are eligible for appointment to the Administrative and Professional Divisions, but are not eligible for appointment to Clerical or General Division vacancies, unless they were in the service of a State on 1st January, 1901, or have retired from the service of the Commonwealth or of a State.

Applicants who are officers of the Public Service of a State should state the date of their appointment to the service present position, and salary.

Applicants from outside the service should state their qualifications for the office they seek. Copies only of diplomas references, testimonials, or certificates should be forwarded. If the originals are required they will be asked for.

Date and year of birth should be stated, and applications must be in applicant's hand-writing.

Applications should be addressed to the "Commonwealth Public Service Inspector" of the State in which the vacancy exists, and in the case of officers of the Commonwealth Service be forwarded through the chief officer of the department to which the applicant belongs.

Minimum and maximum salaries where shown indicate the limits of the class or grade in which the position is classified. Subject to the provisions of the Public Service Act, appointments may be made at any salary within those limits. Successful appointees must comply with the life assurance provisions of the Public Service Act and Regulations.

WE, the Honourable Sir Stephen Henry Parker, Knight, Chief Justice of Western Australia, and the Honourable Robert Furse McMillan, Robert Bruce Burnside, and John Rooth, Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, do hereby, in exercise of the powers contained in "The Appellate Jurisdiction Act, 1911," the Ordinance 27 Victoriæ, No. 19, and "The Suprme Court Act, 1880," and of all other powers us in this behalf enabling, make the following rules, which shall come into operation on the publication thereof in the Government Court ment Gazette:

- 1. These rules apply only to Matrimonial Causes as defined by "The Appellate Jurisdiction Act, 1911," and may be cited as the "Matrimonial Causes Rules, 1912"; the rules regulating procedure in Divorce and Matrimonial Causes, which took effect on the 1st day of May, 1909, may be cited as the "Matrimonial Causes Rules, 1909," and the last-mentioned rules and these rules shall be read and construed together and have offert shall be read and construed together and have effect as one set of rules, and may be cited together as the "Matrimonial Causes Rules, 1909-1912."
- 2. In these rules ''Judgment'' includes ''decree'' and ''order.''
- 3. No appeal to the Full Court from a judgment, final or interlocutory, whether pronounced before or after the commencement of "The Appellate Jurisdiction Act, 1911," shall, if the judgment was pronounced in Chambers, be brought after the expiration of eight days, or, if the judgment was pronounced in Court, after the expiration of three months from the date of pronouncement, except by special leave of the Full Court.
- 4. When an appeal has been brought against any judgment, a wife, being appellant or respondent in the appeal, may, by leave of a judge, to be obtained on summons upon good cause shown, file her bill of costs for taxation as against her husband, being the respondent or appellant in the appeal, and the Taxing Master to whom such bill of costs is referred for taxation shall acceptain what is a sufficient guy of mount to be paid. ascertain what is a sufficient sum of money to be paid into the Central office or what is a sufficient security to be given by the husband to cover the costs of the wife of and incidental to the appeal, and shall thereupon issue an order upon the husband to pay or secure the sum within a time to be fixed by the Registrar.
- 5. When a decision in an appeal is against the wife no costs of the wife of or incidental to such appeal shall be allowed as against the husband, except such as shall be applied for and ordered to be allowed by the Full Court on the hearing of the appeal.
- Subject to the Matrimonial Causes Rules, 1909-1912, the practice and procedure now governing appeals and applications for new trials in civil cases in the and applications for new trials in civil cases in the Supreme Court, and in particular Rules 4, 5, 6, and 7 of Order XXXVII. and Order LVIII. (except Rules 9, 5, and 16) of the rules of the Supreme Court, 1909, shall, so far as practicable, apply, mutatis mutandis, to and in respect of appeals and applications for new trials in matrimonial causes.
- 7. Subject to these rules, the costs of and incidental to appeals in matrimonial causes shall be in the discretion of the Full Court.
- Order LXX. of the rules of the Supreme Court, 1909, shall apply to and in respect of matrimonial causes, and the Matrimonial Causes Rules, 1909-1912, and any amendments thereof or additions thereto shall have effect subject to that order accordingly as if such order were repeated therein.

THE ROADS ACT, 1911.

WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," No. 29, the Road Board of every District is empowered to make, publish, alter, and repeal Bylaws for any of the purposes of the said Act mentioned: It is therefore ordered by the Broad Arrow District Road Board that from and after the publication thereof in the Government Gazette, the following Special By-laws velating to the Registration of Camels and Goats, Licensing of Camel-drivers, Cycles, Motor Cars, etc., shall come into force.

The Broad Arrow District Road Board, in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Roads Act, 1911," and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the following By-laws:—

Camels to be registered.

1. No person shall own, keep, or use within the Broad Arrow Road District (hereinafter referred to as "the District") any camel unless such camel is registered for the time being at the office of the Road Board of the said District: Provided that no person shall be required to register a camel under this By-law during such time as the camel is duly registered in the office of some other Road District.

Application for Registration.

Application for registration shall be made to the Secretary to the Board by writing in the Form "A" in the Schedule, and shall contain the particulars indicated thereby, and shall be signed by the applicant or his agent.

Registration Fees.

3. The following fees shall be payable on registration of camels plying for hire:—

In respect of every bull camel over three years of age—£1 per annum.

In respect of every camel used for packing-For every bull camel under three years of age-£1 per annum.

For every cow or gelding—10s. per annum.

In respect of every camel used for draught only (except bull camels over three years of age)-10s. per annum.

Provided that no registration fee shall be payable in respect of camels used solely by prospectors for prospecting purposes.

Certificate of Registration.

4. A certificate of registration shall be issued by the Secretary to the Board to the applicant in the Form "B" in the Schedule.

Duration.

Every registration shall expire on the 31st day of December in the year for which such registration is effected.

Registration Discs.

6. On the annual registration of every camel the Board will issue to the applicant a registration discinscribed with the name of the district and the registration number.

Every person in charge for the time being of such camel shall keep the disc attached to the neck of the camel.

$Came l\hbox{-} drivers\hbox{'} Licenses.$

7. No person shall drive any camel or camels within the district unless he is the holder of a camel-driver's license in force for the time being issued by the Board of the said district, or unless he is the holder of a license in force for the time being issued by the Board of some other road district.

Form of License.

S. A camel-driver's license shall be in the Form "C" in the Schedule, and the license shall be required to sign his name in the margin thereof before the license is issued to him.

$License \ \ Fee.$

9. The fee payable for a camel-driver's license shall be five shillings per annum.

Duration of License.

10. Every camel-driver's license shall expire on the 31st day of December in the year for which it was granted.

Transfer.

11. A camel-driver's license shall be transferable by endorsement at the office of the Board on payment of a fee of one shilling, the transferee to sign his name in the margin thereof.

License and Registration Certificate to be produced.

12. Every camel-driver shall produce his cameldriver's license and the certificate of registration for each and every camel in his charge whenever called upon so to do by any constable or officer of police, or any member or officer of the Road Board.

Limit of number of Camels to be driven.

13. No person shall at the same time drive or take the charge of more than eleven camels, whether draught or pack camels, or partly draught and partly pack camels.

Camels to give place to horses, etc.

14. Every camel-driver or other person driving or having charge of any camel or camels on any road or track, or at any well or watering place, shall, at the request of any person in charge of any horse or mule, forthwith remove any camel or camels which he is driving, or of which he is in charge, to a distance of not less than a quarter of a mile from such road, track well or watering place. track, well, or watering place.

Unregistered Camels may be destroyed.

Any unregistered camel found straying in any part of the Board's district may be seized and either sold or destroyed, after such camel has been advertised for three weeks in some paper circulating in the district; the owner shall be liable to pay the Board the cost and expense incurred, in addition to registration fees.

Penalty for suffering Camels to stray.

16. If any camel is suffered to stray, the owner thereof, and any person who, having been in charge thereof, has suffered it to stray, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Penalty for driving diseased Camels.

17. If any person drives or rides any camel suffering from any infections or contagious disease on any road within the district he shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws.

Public Watering Places not to be used by diseased Camels.

18. No camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall be allowed to water at any public watering place.

Any person who having, as owner or driver, or otherwise, the custody of any camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, permits such camel to water at any public watering place shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Diseased Camels may be destroyed.

19. It shall be lawful for any officer of the Board or any person acting with the authority of the Board or of any officer of the Board, to slaughter and destroy any camels found suffering from any infectious or contagious disease on any road.

Cycles and Motor Cars to be Licensed.

20. No person shall use any bicycle, tricycle, or motor car in the district unless such bicycle, tricycle, or motor car is licensed.

Provided that if a license is taken out for a bicycle, trievele, or motor car by any person in the district in which he resides he shall not be required to take out a license in any other district.

Form of License.

21. A bicycle, tricycle, or motor car license shall be in the form "D" in the Schedule, and application for the same shall be made to the Secretary to the Road Board at the office of the Board.

Fees.

The fee for every Bicycle or Tricycle shall be Five shillings per annum.

The fee for every Motor Cycle shall be Ten shillings per annum.

The fee for every Motor Car shall be One pound per annum.

Duration.

22. Every license for a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall expire on the 31st day of December in the year for which it was issued.

Number to be affixed.

23. Every licensee of a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall affix and keep affixed the license number on some conspicuous part of the bicycle, tricycle, or motor

Discs.

(Alternative 23. On the issue of every license for a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car, the Board will issue to the licensee a disc inscribed with the name of the district and the number of the license.

The licensee and every person for the time being in charge of the bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall keep the said disc attached to some conspicuous part of the bicycle, tricycle, or motor car.)

Riding on Footpaths prohibited.

24. No person shall ride or impel a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car of any kind upon any footpath within the district.

Lamp to be carried.

25. No person shall, between the hours of sunset and surrise, ride a cycle, tricycle, or motor car along any road unless there is attached thereto a lamp which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and at all times to be kept lighted.

Bell to be used.

26. Every bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall carry a bell or other instrument suitable for giving warning of approach, which shall be used as a signal whenever any person on foot or horseback or vehicle is being approached or passed.

Roads and Footpaths not to be obstructed.

27. No person shall leave any cycle, tricycle, or motor car in or on any road or footpath so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his bicycle, tricycle, or motor car immediately upon being requested to do so by any officer or constable or member or officer of the Board.

Speed.

28. No person riding on a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall pass, at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour, any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.

To dismount on meeting restive horse.

29. When a cyclist or motorist meets a horse or other animal, and such horse or other animal becomes restive, or appears likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist or motorist shall dismount and remain dismounted until such horse or other animal has been passed.

Speed on turning corners.

30. No person shall ride any cycle, bicycle, or motor car round the corner formed by the junction of any roads or streets in the district, or across the intersection of any of the said roads or streets, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

Goats to be registered.

31. No person shall own, keep, or use within the Broad Arrow Road District any goat unless such goat is registered for the time being at the office of the Road Board of the said district.

Provided that no person shall be required to register a goat under this By-law during such time as the goat is duly registered in the office of some other Road District.

Application for Registration.

32. Application for registration shall be made to the Secretary of the Board by writing in the Form "E" in the Schedule, and shall contain the particulars indicated thereby, and shall be signed by the applicant or his agent. his agent.

Fee.

The following fee shall be payable on registration of goats:—Sixpence for every goat.

Duration.

33. Every registration shall expire on the 31st day of December in the year for which registration is effected.

Penalties.

34. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of the foregoing By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and any person guilty of an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Court"), having taken into consideration the matter of the above-mentioned dispute, and having heard the union and the employers by their respective representatives duly appointed, and having heard the witnesses called and examined by and on behalf of the union and the employers and cross-examined on behalf of the parties respectively, doth hereby order and award that as between the union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them, the terms, conditions, and provisions set out in the schedule hereto shall be binding upon the union and members thereof, and upon the employers and each of them, and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be and they are hereby incorporated into and declared to form part of this award: And, further, that the union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them, shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing by the said terms, conditions, and provisions required to be done, observed, and performed, and shall not do anything in contravention of the said terms, conditions, and provisions, but shall in all respects abide by and observe and perform the same : And the Court doth further order that this award shall apply to the industry or calling of bread-carting, and that it shall come into operation on the twenty-ninth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and twelve, and shall remain in force for the period of twelve calendar months from the said date: And, further, that it shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of fourteen miles from the General Post Office of the City of Perth.

The Schedule hereinbefore referred to.

Hours: Fifty-four hours of labour, inclusive of the time necessary for stabling and loading, but exclusive of the time occupied for meals, shall constitute the week's work, except for the week during which any holiday occurs, when the week's work shall consist of forty-five hours.

2. Commencing Time: The day's work shall be deemed to commence at the time the bread-carter arrives at his employer's premises, and to terminate when he finally leaves them for the day; but the hour of commencing shall not be before 6 a.m. on any day

Overtime: Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-quarter for all time during which the bread carter is engaged in excess of the fifty-four hours per week;

or in excess of forty-five hours during a week in which any holiday occurs.

4. Wages: The minimum rate of wage to be paid to a bread-earter shall be Two

pounds sixteen shillings per week.

5. Wages payable Weekly: Wages shall in all cases be paid weekly.

6. Meal Times: A bread-carter shall be allowed at least one hour a day for meal time.

7. Holidays: There shall be no deduction of pay made in respect of the statutory monthly holiday, nor in respect of Christmas Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, or Eight Hours' Day, which days shall be observed as holidays: Provided, however, that the holiday on Eight Hours' Day is granted conditionally on an agreement being arrived at between the operative bakers, the bread-carters, and the employers; failing such an agreement then the day following Eight Hours' Day shall be observed as a holiday and shall be paid for.

Any bread-carter called upon to work on Good Friday or Christmas Day shall, in addition to his ordinary weekly wage, be paid at double time rate for work done on those

Sunday Work: Sunday work shall consist of attendance on horses only.

A bread-carter employed to do Sunday work shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half for the time he is engaged in such work..

9. Boarding or Lodging: Except in the case of parent and son, a bread-carter shall not board or lodge with his employer or on his premises.

10. Shortages: A bread-carter shall not be held responsible for shortages in money or bread, unless notified by the employer or his authorised servant in respect of same within twenty-four hours of such appearing in his delivery book or bread book. Sundays and holidays shall not be reckoned in calculating the twenty-four hours.

11. Time and Wages Book: A time and wages book shall be kept at each bakery, which shall show the name of each bread-carter, the time he starts and finishes work each day, the number of hours worked, the amount of overtime worked, the wages paid and the employee's signature for same.

The employer and the employee shall be jointly responsible for the proper posting of

the book daily.

The book shall be supplied by the union and shall be open to the inspection of the representative of the union during working hours.

12. Shipping Trade: The provisions of Clause 2 hereof, as to starting time, shall

not apply to deliveries to ships at Fremantle.
