WHEREAS it is provided by "The Electric Lighting Act, 1892," that any Municipal Council may, subject to the provisions by the Act, supply electricity for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the Act, within the limits of the Municipality, or within such other limits as the Governor may by Proclamation approve or allow: And whereas it is the desire of the Council of the Cottesloe Municipality that it may be allowed to supply electricity within the limits of the Road Districts of Cottesloe Beach and Peppermint Grove: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby approve and allow the supply by the Council of the Municipality of Cottesloe of electricity for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act, within the limits of the said Municipality, and also to Road Districts of Cottesloe Beach and Peppermint Grove.

WHEREAS it desirable for the purpose of adjustment to alter the boundaries of the Fremantle Municipal Dis-

trict and the Melville Road District as hereinafter provided: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," hereby orders that so much of the Fremantle Municipal District as is described in the Schedule hereto, shall, on the publication of this Order, be severed therefrom and annexed to the Melville Road District:—

Schedule.

The portions of Marmion Street and Carrington Street situated Northward and Eastward respectively of a line commencing at a point in the centre of Marmion Street opposite the South-West corner of Petra Street, and thence running in a straight line to a point in the centre of the intersection of Marmion Street and Carrington Street; thence running in a straight line South to a point opposite the South-West corner of High Road, and thence running in a straight line East to the South-West corner of High Road.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 28th day of May, 1912.

1. Add a new Rule to Order XLL as follows:—

8. Save as otherwise provided the service at any place of any summons or other process which requires the attendance of any party on the trial or hearing of an action or matter in a Local Court on a return day therein specified shall be effected the same number of days at least before the return day as would be limited for giving notice of defence in a summons in a personal action issued out of the same Court and served at the same place.

BY-LAW No. 75.

A By-law of the Coolgardie Road Board (hereinafter called "the said Board") made under the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," and numbered 75, prescribing and for regulating the manner of keeping and depasturing of goats, and the driving of goats over roads, and empowering the Board to seize, impound, or destroy goats found at large in public places, and also for prescribing the registration of all goats kept within any townsite and the fees for same.

1. No person shall keep any goats within any townsite situated within the District of the said Board unless he shall first have registered the same with the Secretary of the said Board, and shall have paid the fees set out in Schedule A hereto in respect of such registration, and every such person shall, so long as he shall continue to keep such goats, annually so register the same.

2. Every person so registering a goat as aforesaid shall attach and keep at all times attached to the neck of every goat so registered by him a metal disc or plate of the size and shape prescribed by the said Board, on which shall be inscribed the name or initials of the said Board, the year of registration, and the registration number, and also a wooden triangle, both of which shall be supplied by the said Board on application to such person at the time of his paying the necessary fees; provided that no new triangle shall be required to be obtained until the old one has been destroyed, lost, or worn out.

3. Every registration shall be in force from the date whereon the same is obtained until the 31st December next ensuing, and no longer.

4. No person shall keep or depasture any goat except in a place which is properly enclosed by a sufficient fence or wall, or securely fastened in such a way as to prevent any such goat from straying on to any road or adjoining other land.

5. No person having the ownership or care thereof shall suffer or permit any goat to stray, depasture, or be at large in or upon any street, roadway, reserve, public place, or public enclosure within the said Board's District.

6. Every goat found at large in or upon any street, road, reserve, or public place within the District of the said Board may forthwith be seized, impounded, or destroyed by the said Board, by any of its officers duly authorised by the said Board in that behalf.

7. The carcase of every goat destroyed as aforesaid shall forthwith be removed and buried by the said Board, in such place as the said Board shall from time to time set apart for such purpose.

8. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.
