The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by Section 15 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, reserve such land as may be from time to time required for quarantine stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purpose of the said Act: And whereas it is deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to reserve at North Fremantle as a quarantine station for tick cattle the land hereinafter described: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do hereby reserve as a quarantine station, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purpose of the said Act:---

All that parcel of land having a frontage of 500 feet to Swan Street, 500 feet to Clifton Street, and 800 feet to the railway line, situated at North Fremantle.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 30th day of July, 1912.

His Excellency the Governor. The Honourables—The Minister for Lands. The Attorney General. W. C. Angwin, M.L.A.

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Roads Act, 1911," that the Governor may, by Order in Council, divide or re-divide a Road District into Wards, and that when a District is divided or re-divided into Wards the Governor may from time to time determine the number of members for each Ward: And whereas it is desirable to re-divide the Tambellup Road District into Wards, in manner hereinafter appearing, and notice of the intention of the Governor to exercise this power has been published and served as provided in the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that the Tambellup Road District shall be, and the same is hereby re-divided as from and after the 30th day of July inst., into the Wards bearing the respective names and respectively bounded as in the Schedule to this order is set out: And further that each of such Wards shall be represented on the Road Board of the said District, and the number of members set opposite the name of such Ward in the said Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

North-West Ward.

Bounded on the North by that portion of Road Distriet boundary from East boundary of Location 1643 Eastward to intersection of Railway.

Bounded on the East by the Railway to the North boundary of Tambellup Townsite; thence Westerly along part of a North, a West, a Northern, and again a West boundary of same; thence along part of the East and part of South boundaries of Location 2308 to a surveyed road; thence along North-Western side of said surveyed road to North boundary of Location 758, along part of North and the West boundaries of same, the West boundaries of Locations 686 and 2704, and the East boundary of Location 2453.

NORSEMAN LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH

A BY-LAW made by the Norseman Local Board of Health on the 22nd July, 1912, under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911," regulating the keeping of pigeons.

No person shall within the district keep a (a.) pigeon or pigeons except in a closed cage or cote.

(b.) No person shall permit any pigeon or pigeons to stray, fly, or wander at liberty within the district.

(c.) Every person who shall offend against either of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (\pounds 10).

exists, and in the case of officers of the Commonwealth Service be forwarded through the chief officer of the department to which the applicant belongs.

Minimum and maximum salaries where shown indicate the limits of the class or grade in which the position is classified. Subject to the provisions of the Public Service Act, appointments may be made at any salary within those limits. Successful appointces must comply with the life assurance provisions of the Public Service Act and Regulations.

I' is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations for the granting of Leases of Town and Suburban Lands under "The Land Act, 1898," in lieu of those published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st March, 1912, which are hereby cancelled.

LAND ACT, 1898.

Regulations for the Granting of Leases of Town and Suburban Lands.

1. Every lease shall be granted for a term of 99 years, at a yearly rent equal to four pounds per centum of the capital value of the land as fixed from time to time as hereinafter prescribed: Provided that the minimum rent reserved by any lease shall be ten shillings.

2. The capital value of each lot shall be fixed by the Minister, and notified in the *Government Gazette*; and on the value so fixed the yearly rent shall be computed for the first ten years of the term of the lease, and thereafter, until a fresh valuation is made, as hereinafter provided. On every periodical revaluation, the yearly rent thereafter, and until a fresh valuation is made, shall be computed on the value fixed by such revaluation.

3. Fresh valuations may be made by the Minister from time to time during the currency of the lease, at intervals of not less than ten years, and notified in the *Government Gazette*: Provided that the value of all improvements made by the lessee shall be excluded from every such valuation. If any lessee is dissatisfied with any such valuation, he may require the question to be submitted to arbitration under the provisions of "The Arbitration Act, 1895."

4. Every application for a lease of land under these Regulations shall be in the form, or to the effect of the First Schedule hereto, and shall be lodged at the District Land and Survey Office of the District in which the and applied for is situated: Provided that an application may be lodged at such other office as for the time being is appointed by the Governor for the receipt of applications under "The Land Act, 1898." The applicant shall deposit with his application a lease fee of five shillings, and a sum equal to the instalment of rent of the lot applied for, payable in advance, pursuant to Section 136 of the said Act. Such deposit will be refunded in the event of the application being refused.

5. All applications shall be subject to the approval of the Minister: Provided that the provisions of "The Land Act, 1898," and its amendments relating to priority of applications, and the method of selection in the case of applications lodged at the same time, shall apply. Provided further that the Minister may at his discretion cause the leasehold interest in any lot or lots to be submitted to auction for sale at a premium.

6. If the lease of a lot is submitted to auction for sale at a premium, the purchaser shall, at the fall of the hammer, pay to the auctioneer a lease fee of five shillings and a sum equal to the instalment of rent of the lot purchased, payable in advance, pursuant to Section 136 of the said Act, unless the purchaser shall, as an applicant, have previously paid the same pursuant to Regulation 4. The purchaser shall also pay, on the fall of the hammer, ten per centum of the premium, and shall pay the balance thereof within thirty days thereafter.

7. If any purchaser makes default in payment of the purchase money, or any instalment thereof, the Minister may, by notice in writing to the purchaser, forfeit the purchaser's interest in the lease, and any payments previously made by him.

8. Every lease shall be in the form or to the effect of the Second Schedule, and the term thereof shall commence from the first day of the quarter in which the application was approved. 9. Every lease shall be granted and held subject to the provisions of "The Land Act, 1898," and any amendment thereof, and the regulations thereunder in force for the time being relating to the leasing of town and suburban lots.

10. Every lease shall be limited to the natural surface of the land demised, and the land below the natural surface to a depth not exceeding 40 feet, if situated within a goldfield or mineral field, and, if not so situated, not exceeding 200 feet.

11. All rates, taxes, and outgoings charged on the land, or payable by the occupier thereof during the said term, shall be duly paid by the lessee.

12. No person shall (without the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands first obtained) acquire or hold more lots under these Regulations than by the conditions under which the lots are thrown open for selection or submitted to auction may be prescribed

13. No lease shall be applied for or acquired by any Asiatic or African alien; and if contrary to this regulation any such alien shall acquire an interest in any lease, such lease shall thereupon become forfeited.

14. Every lease shall confer on the lessee, his executors administrators, or permitted assigns the right of renewal of the term thereof at its expiration (if in the meantime the lease is not surrendered or forfeited or resumed) at the rent and subject to the conditions prescribed by the Regulations in force at the time of such renewal.

15. No person under sixteen years of age shall be eligible to acquire a lease under these regulations.

16. If the capital value of any lot includes the value of improvements effected prior to the approval of the application, the Minister may, in his discretion, under the circumstances of any particular case, direct that the value of suck improvements shall not be included in the capital value on which the annual rent is based, but shall be paid for by the lessee by instalments or otherwise as the Minister may determine; and in such case, the Minister may, if he thinks fit, pay the value of such improvements, when received, or any part thereof, to any person by whom, as a previous owner or occupier of the land, such improvements may have been effected.






