The Control of Trade in War Time Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this
30th day of September, 1914.

WHEREAS by the Control of Trade in War Time Act it is provided that the Governor, on the advice of a Royal Commission (which the Governor was thereby authorised to appoint), may by Order in Council fix

the maximum prices that may be lawfully charged for the necessaries of life: And whereas Wheat has been proclaimed to be a necessary of life within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas the Royal Commission appointed under the said Act has advised the Governor to fix the maximum price that may be lawfully charged for fair average quality wheat as hereinafter set out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the advice of the Royal Commission appointed under the said Act, doth hereby fix, until further order, the maximum price that may be lawfully charged for fair average quality wheat at four shillings and sixpence per bushel free on rails in Perth, with parity of value at sidings.
