Michael and St. George, Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall

be lawful for the Governor. on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such proclamation. become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or become from in force. hereafter in force.

And whereas the Narrogin Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been used for a street or schedule hereunder which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of Narrogin, be declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council. do by this my proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.
