Whereas by Section 267 of "The Health Act, 1911-12," it is provided that the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a Local Authority under any of the provisions of the said Act, and that a under any of the provisions of the said Act, and that a Local Authority may, of its own motion by resolution, adopt the whole or any portion of such by-laws: And whereas Model By-laws have been prepared in accord-ance with the provisions of the said section, and pub-lished in the *Government Gazette* on the 20th day of November, 1914: Now, therefore, it is resolved and de-termined by the Maylands Local Board of Health, be-ing a Local Health Authority within the meaning of the said Act that with the alterations specified here. the said Act, that with the alterations specified hereunder such Model By-laws be adopted for the health district of Maylands, Alterations:-

Part I., By-law 1 (k.) .- Delete this paragraph and insert in lieu thereof :-

(1.) A service door constructed of 18 gauge sheet iron shall be provided in the rear wall of the convenience; frame to be so constructed that the door will slide vertically in grooves of the frame, through which the pan must be withdrawn.

By-law 34.—Insert after the word "district" the words "except in areas, as defined by the Board." By-law 37, paragraph (b).—Insert after the word "confined" the words "except homing pigeons, which may be let out for exercise.'

By-law 46, paragraph (b).—Insert after the word 'and,' in the fourth line, the words 'if so required.'' By-law 53, paragraph (b).—Delete this paragraph. Part II., By-law 15.—Delete the words in the last two lines 'Any such certificate shall be approved and ordeneed by the medical officer 'i' endorsed by the medical officer.' Part IX.-Delete.

UNIFORM CAMEL BY-LAWS.

George V., No. 29.

Yilgarn District Road Board By-laws.

WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," the Road Board of every District is empowered to make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws for any of the purposes of the said Act mentioned : It is there-fore ordered by the Yilgarn Road Board that from the date after the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*, the following special By-laws relating to the registration of camels and licensing of camel-drivers and the seizure, sale, or destruction of unregistered or diseased camels, and the control of camels at wells and watering places, shall come into force.

YILGARN ROAD DISTRICT.

Special By-laws for the registration of Camels and the. Licensing of Camel Drivers.

The Yilgarn Road Board, in exercise of the powers con-ferred by "The Roads Act, 1911," and of every other auth-ority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the following By-laws :-

Camels to be Registered.

1. No person shall own, keep, or use within the Road District (hereinafter referred to as "the District") any camel, unless such camel is registered for the time being at the Office of the Road Board of the said District, provided that no person shall be required to register a camel under this By-law during such time as the camel is duly registered in the Office of some other Road District.

Application for Registration.

2. Application for registration shall be made to the Secre-tary to the Board by writing, in the Form "A" in the Schedule, and shall contain the particulars indicated thereby, and shall be signed by the applicant or his agent.

Registration Fees.

3. The following scale of fees shall be payable on regis-tration of camels plying for hire :----In respect of every bull camel over three years of age £1

per annum.

In respect of every camel used for packing : For every bull camel under three years of age-15s. per annum.

For every cow or gelding, 10s. per annum. In respect of every camel used for draught only (except bull camels over three years of age), 5s. per annum.

Provided that no registration fee shall be payable in respect of camels used solely by prospectors for prospecting pur-poses upon the production of a certificate to the Board from a Warden or Mining Registrar. Provided that the registration fee for any bull or stallion

camel not plying for hire or being worked shall be £1.

Certificate of Registration.

4. A certificate of registration shall be issued by the certary of the Board to the applicant in the form "B" Secretary of the Board to the applicant in the form in Schedule, on payment of prescribed License fees.

Registration Discs.

5. On the annual registration of every camel, the Board will issue to the applicant a registration disc inscribed with the name of the district and the registration number.

Every person in charge for the time being of such camel shall keep the disc visible and attached to the neck of the camel.

Camel Drivers' Licenses.

6. No person shall drive any camel or camels within the District unless he is the holder of a camel driver's license in force for the time being issued by the Board of the said District, or unless he is the holder of a license in force for the time being issued by the Board of some other Road District.

Form of License.

7. A camel driver's license shall be in the Form "C" in the Schedule, and the licensee shall be required to sign his name in the margin before the license is issued to him.

License Fee.

8. The fee payable for a camel driver's license shall be 5s. per annum.

Duration of License.

9. Every registered camel driver's license shall expire on the thirtieth day of June next ensuing.

Transfer.

10. A camel driver's license shall be transferable by indorsement at the offices of the Board on payment of a fee of one shilling, the transferee to sign his name in the margin thereof.

License and Registration Certificate to be produced.

11. Every camel driver shall produce his camel driver's certificate of registration and license for each and every camel in his charge whenever called upon so to do by any constable or officer of the police, or any member or officer of the Road Board.

Limit of number of Camels to be Driven.

12. No person shall at the same time drive or take the charge of more than eleven camels, whether draught or pack camels, or partly draught or partly pack camels.

13. In all cases of camels meeting or overtaking a horse or bullock team, or a vehicle of any description, the person in charge or the driver of such camel shall, when within two hundred yards of the team or vehicle take the camels off the road, and at least twenty feet from the centre thereof.

14. No camel-owners, drivers. or persons in charge of amels, shall allow any camel to remain at a well or pool more than half an hour for the purpose of watering, or allow any camel to camp within 300 yards of any well or natural surface water, nor allow any camels to camp less than 100 yards from any road.

Unregistered Camels may be destroyed.

15. Any unregistered camel found straying in any part of the Board's district may be seized and either sold or de-stroyed, after such camels have been advertised for three weeks in some paper circulated in the district; the owner shall be liable to pay to the Board the cost and expense incurred, in addition to registration fees,

Penalty for suffering camels to stray.

16. If any camel is suffered to stray, the owner thereof, and any person who having been in charge thereof has suffered it to stray, shall be guilty of an offence against these Bylaws.

Penalty for driving Diseased camels.

17. If any person drives or rides any camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease on any road, reserve or camping place, within the district, he shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Public Watering Places not to be used by Diseased Camels.

18. No camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall be allowed to water at any public watering place.

Any person who having, as owner, driver, or otherwise, the custody of any camel suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, permits such camel to water at any public watering place, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Diseased camels may be destroyed.

19. It shall be lawful for any police constable or any person acting with the authority of the Board to slaughter and destroy any camels found suffering from any infectious or contagious disease on any road.

20. No camel driver shall permit his camels to camp within 300 yards of any gate on any road in the District.
