Reg. 22.—Delete last paragraph and substitute the following:—

Head Teachers who have held the B1 Certificate for fifteen years, and have consistently obtained exceptionally good reports, shall be eligible for two additional increments of £10 each.

Head Teachers who were Head Teachers with the B1 Certificate before the year 1902 and who sat for the A Certificate Examination before the year 1915 may, if they have consistently obtained exceptionally good reports, and have satisfied the Department of their ability to conduct efficiently a school containing Classes VII. and VIII., be granted the A3 Certificate without examination. They will not be eligible to rise to any higher grade until the examination has been completed.

Reg. 37.—Alter first paragraph to read as follows:—

Quarters will, where possible, be provided for Head Masters; they may also be provided for Mistresses of schools of Classes VII. and VIII. Where quarters are not provided, rent allowances may be granted at the discretion of the Minister. The sum to be granted shall be fixed in each case according to the scale of rents in the locality and the number of persons in the teacher's family. Such allowances shall not exceed the following amounts, unless the Minister is satisfied that the circumstances are exceptional:—
