WHEREAS by Regulation 2 of the Building Regulations contained in the Second Schedule of "The Roads Act, 1911," as amended by "The Roads Act Amendment Act, contained in the Second Schedule of 'The Roads Act, 1911,' as amended by "The Roads Act Amendment Act, 1912," it is provided, in reference to buildings on any block of land laid out for such purpose, that the area allotted to any building and the open space used in connection with such building shall together be not less than the area for the time being fixed by Proclamation as the proper area to be allotted to such building: And whereas it is desirable that such area should be fixed for the Claremont Road District as hereinafter provided: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the proper area to be allotted do hereby declare that the proper area to be allotted to every building and the open space to be used therewith shall, in the Claremont Road District, be not less than the area of the respective allotments delineated on the subdivisional plan deposited for the time being in

WHEREAS by an Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 11th day of March, 1910, the East Jandakot Drainage District was duly constituted under the provisions of "The Land Drainage Act, 1900": And whereas petitions dated the 17th day of April, 1916, and duly signed were presented to the Governor under the provisions of Section 4 of the said Act, with the view to a portion of the East Jandakot District being constituted and declared a separate Drainage District: And whereas it has been resolved to give effect to such petitions: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby curtail and excise from the East Jandakot Drainage District the area of land described in the schedule hereto, and doth hereby declare such area to be a separate drainage district within the meaning and for the purposes of "The Land Drainage Act, 1900," with the boundaries as defined in the said schedule, and by the name of the Wungong Drainage District

Alteration of Ward Boundaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, alter the boundaries of any Road District or Ward, and transfer portion thereof to another Road District or Ward: And whereas it is desirable to alter and amend the ward boundaries of the Perth Road District, by transferring from Peninsula Ward to Lawley Ward portion of the former's territory, and notice of the intention of the Governor in Council to exercise such power has, in accordance with the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," been duly published in the Government Gazette and served on the said Board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and amend the ward boundaries of the Perth Road District, by transferring from the Peninsula Ward to the Lawley Ward all that portion of the former's territory which is set forth and described in the schedule hereto; to come into force on and from the 1st day of July, 1916.

Schedule.

Alterations of Boundaries of Peninsula and Lawley Wards.

That portion of Swan Location Z lying to the South-East of the Eastern Railway bounded by lines as follows:—

By the Eastern Railway from the North-Eastern boundary of the said location to Guildford Road; thence along the centre of Guildford Road to Stanley Street; thence along Stanley Street to Mitchell Street; thence along Mitchell Street to the Swan River; thence along the right bank of the Swan River to the North-Eastern boundary of the said location; thence along the said North-Eastern boundary to the point of commencement.

2. That portion of Swan Location Y lying to the South-East of the Eastern Railway, bounded by lines as follows:—

The South-Western boundary of the said location from the railway to the Swan River; thence along the right lank of the Swan River for a distance of 602 links; thence along the North-Eastern boundaries of Lots 22. 21, and 20 on Land Titles Plan 3261 to the Guildford Road; thence along the Guildford Road to the centre of First Avenue; thence along the centre of First Avenue to the railway line; thence along the railway line to the point of commencement.

Creation of Westonia Road District and Consequential Alteration to the External Boundary and Re-division into Wards of the Merredin Road District, and also Alteration to the Boundary of the Kellerberrin Road District.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," it is enacted that the Governor in Executive Council may constitute any portion of Western Australia, which is not included in a Municipal District, a Road District with such boundaries and by such name as are specified in such order, and may alter the boundaries of any Road District or ward and transfer portion thereof to another Road District or ward: And whereas it is desirable to:—

- 1. Alter the boundaries of the Merredin Road District, by taking such part of its territory therefrom as is hereinafter described and to create a new Road District thereof, to be called the Westonia Road District, with the boundaries and the constitution of members hereinafter set forth, and to alter the boundaries of the Merredin Road District accordingly.
- 2. Alter the external boundaries of the Merredin and Kellerberrin Road Districts, by transferring from the former to the latter the territory hereinafter described, and to alter the respective ward boundaries accordingly.
- 3. Re-divide the Merredin Road District into wards, as hereinafter described.
- 4. To allot the number of members of the Merredin Road Board to the several wards, as hereinafter set forth: And whereas notice of the intention of the Governor in Council to exercise such power has, in accordance with the provisions of the said Roads Act, 1911, been duly published in the Government Gazette and served on the Boards concerned, in manner prescribed by the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby:—
- 1. Alter the external boundaries of the Merredin Road District, by taking all that territory therefrom as described in Schedule A hereunder and create a new Road District therefrom, to be called and designated the Westonia Road District, to have the territory within the boundaries as set forth in the said Schedule "A" with a Road Board having a constitution of seven members, and the external and ward boundaries of the Merredin Road District are hereby altered and amended accordingly to the extent set forth in the said Schedule "A."
- 2. Alter the external boundaries of the Merredin and Kellerberrin Road Districts, by transferring all the territory desecribed in Schedule "B" hereunder from the Merredin to the Kellerberrin Road District, and the respective external and ward boundaries of the said Road Districts are hereby altered and amended to the extent set forth in Schedule "B" accordingly.

3. Re-divide the Merredin Road District as so altered and amended into six wards, with the boundaries as set forth in Schedule "C."

4. Allot the number of members of the Merredin Road District to the several wards, as set forth in the said Schedule "C." To come into force as from the first day of July, 1916.

SCHEDULE "A."

WESTONIA ROAD DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by a line commencing at the intersection of the Rabbit-proof Fence with the North boundary of the present Merredin Road District, and extending East along part of the North boundary of said Merredin District.

On the East by part of the present boundary of the Merredin Road District to the 25-Mile peg on the Rabbitproof Fence.

On the South-West by the Rabbit-proof Fence to the

8-Mile peg thereon.
On the Westward by a line extending from the said 8-Mile peg along the Eastern boundary of Reserve 14661 and Yilgarn Location 6, and onward from its North-East corner for a distance of about 250 chains; thence East about 140 chains, North about 250 chains to a point East of the Extension of the South boundary of Reserve 9473; thence West to the latter's South-East corner; thence North and West along the East and North boundaries of said Reserve 9473; thence Northward along the Rabbit-proof Fence to the South side of road which forms the Southern boundary of Yilgarn Location 3; thence East and North along the South and East sides of such road; thence continuing North to the North-East corner of Yilgarn Location 3; thence by the North boundary of Yilgarn Location 3 to the Rabbit-proof Fence; thence again Northward along the Rabbit-proof Fence to the starting point.

SCHEDULE "B."

All that area contained in part of townsite of Baandee being Reserve No. 9608 and the Recreation Reserve No. 13872, and situate South of the Eastern Goldfields Railway.

SCHEDULE "C."

MERREDIN WARDS.

No. 1, Central Ward.

The Central Ward comprises the whole of the territory within the boundaries of the present Merredin Townsite (including Reserves 14873, 2914, 13138, and 11434)—Two Members.

No. 2, East Ward.

Bounded on the North by all that part of the North boundary of the Road District East of the Nungarin Ward.

On the East by part of the East boundary of the Road District to the centre line of the Eastern Railway

On the Southward by a line along the centre of the Eastern Railway Reserve to the Eastern boundary of Central Ward.

On the Westward by part of the Eastern boundary of the Central Ward; thence by a line along the centre of surveyed road, passing Northward through Reserve 2914 and Locations 15212 and 13170; thence North-Westward along the South-Western boundaries of Locations 15208 and 15206, inclusive; thence Northwards along the Eastern boundaries of the Nungarin Ward— One Member.

No. 3, Nungarin Ward.

Bounded on the North by part of the North boundary of the Road District.

On the East by a line in prolongation North of the centre of road, passing along the East boundaries of Locations 14153 and 14148; thence South alongside line to its intersection with a line along the centre of road, along the South boundary of Location 14147; thence East along said line to a point in prolongation North of the West boundary of Location 14146; thence in a general Southerly direction along the West boundaries of Locations 14146 to 14124 inclusive, the South boundary of the latter, the Eastern boundaries of 14122 to 14102, included, the latter's Southern boundary, the Eastern boundaries of Locations 14101, 14100, 14099, and 14098, and its prolongation to the Northern boundary of Location 14200, the Northern, North-Eastern, and South-Eastern boundaries of the latter and the South-

Eastern boundary of Location 14195, the Eastern boundaries of Locations 14181, 14207, and 14185, and Reserve 10463, the Eastern boundaries of Locations 3831 to 14198 inclusive, part of the latter's South boundary; thence due South to the North-West corner of Location 15200; thence East along the latter's North boundary; thence South along the centre of road which forms the East boundaries of Locations 15200 to 15175 inclusive, the Eastern boundaries of Locations 15176 to 15178, the latter's East boundary to East boundary of Location 15211 inclusive, to the centre of the Dowerin-Merredin Railway Reserve.

On the South-Westward by a line along the centre

of the Dowerin-Merredin Railway Reserve.

On the Westward by the Western boundary of the Road District-Two Members.

No. 4, Totadgin Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the South-Eastern boundary of the North-West Ward, part of the West, South, and part of East boundaries of Central Ward, and the South boundary of the East Ward.
On the Eastward by part of the Eastern boundary of

the Road District.

On the Southward by part of the South boundary of the Road District.

On the Westward by the Eastern boundary of the South-West Ward—One Member.

No. 5, North-West Ward.

Bounded on the North-Eastward by a line along the centre of the Dowerin-Merredin Railway Reserve, being the South-Western boundary of the Nungarin Ward.

On the Eastward by part of the Western boundary of the East Ward and part of the North and West boundaries of the Central Ward.

On the South by the centre line of the Eastern Railway

On the West by part of the Western boundary of the Road District-One Member.

No. 6, South-West Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by the West and South boundaries of Reserve 13872, the West, South, and East boundaries of the Baandee Townsite and the centre line of the Eastern Railway Reserve.

On the Eastward by a line being the centre of road along the Eastern and Southern boundaries of Nungarin A.A. Lot 2, the Eastern boundaries of Nangeenan A.A. Lots 49, 48, and Locations 8918, 11281, and 19448, the East and part of South boundaries of Reserve 1313, the Western boundaries of Locations 18253 to 18075 inclusive, 17084 to 17083 inclusive, and the North-Western boundaries of Locations 17085, 16941, and 16940.

On the South and West by parts of the Southern and Western boundaries of the Road District-Two Members.

ATTENTION is drawn to the following Regulations under "The War Precautions Act, 1914-15."

Protection from distress, etc., of means of livelihood, etc., of female dependants of soldiers.

Inserted by Statutory Rule No. 15 of 1916, dated 2nd February, 1916, and amended by Statutory Rule No. 88 of 1916, dated 10th May, 1916.

Regulations above referred to.

47A. (1.) No person shall under a bill of sale, or writ of execution or other process issued by a Court, or by way of distress or under the provisions of a hire-purchase agreement made prior to the 1st day of June, 1916, seize or take possession of—

(a.) any chattels which are used by any female dependant of any member of a force raised for service beyond Australia to support or assist in supporting herself or any of the family of such member; or

(b.) any furniture or wearing apparel belonging to any such member or female dependant; provided that if the furniture and wearing apparel belonging to such member and his female dependants exceed in value £50, any articles may be seized and taken possession of under due authority of law if the articles remaining are not less in value than £50.

- (2.) If any person contravenes the provisions of this paragraph, he shall be guilty of an offence against the Act.
- (3.) For the purpose of this paragraph "female dependant" shall mean any female who is wholly or partly dependent for her support upon the pay of a member of a force raised for service beyond Australia.

Allotment of soldier's pay and separation allowance not to be assignable.

Inserted by Statutory Rule 106 of 1916.

- 47B. (1.) In this Regulation "allottee" includes any person to whom an allotment from the pay of a soldier enlisted for service during the present war has been made and any person entitled to a separation allowance in respect of a soldier.
- (2.) The right of any allottee to receive allotments of pay or separation allowance shall be incapable of assignment whether absolutely or by way of pledge or mortgage or otherwise.
- (3.) Any such assignment made prior to the making of this Regulation shall as from the making of this Regulation be void.
- (4.) Any person who, and the manager or other responsible officer or employee of any corporate body which, accepts any such assignment shall be guilty of an offence against the Act.
- (5.) Any allottee may demand the return of an allotment certificate from any person who claims to hold it by way of assignment, and any such person who after demand fails to return such certificate to the allottee shall be guilty of an offence against the Act.
- (6.) If any officer whose duty it is to make payments on behalf of the Department of Defence has reason to believe that any person holding an authority to receive allotments of pay or separation allowance on behalf of an allottee, is an agent for or is collecting such allotment of pay or allowance on behalf of any person claiming the same by way of assignment, the officer may refuse to pay to the person holding the authority.
