WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1912-13," it is pro-vided that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare any one or more portions of the State, or any one or more localities to be respectively defined in such Proclamation, a Reserve for Native Game or any particular Native Game: Now therefore I, the hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the portions of the State and localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto shall be Reserves for Native Game:-

Schedule.

(1.) Lake Seppings (near Albany).—The whole of the waters of Lake Seppings situate North-East of the Township of Albany, and near Middleton Beach.

Township of Albany, and near Middleton Beach. (2.) Peel's Inlet.—The whole of the waters of the Channel entrance to Peel's Inlet (Mandurah), bounded on the North by a line drawn in an Easterly direction from the Northernmost extremity of the Western point of entrance (at the Bar) to a point on the mainland (the Eastern shore of entrance), and on the South by lines drawn in an Easterly direction from the South-Eastern corner of Murray Location No. 5 to the South-ern extremity of Channel Island; thence to the South-Western extremity of Greery Island, and by its Southern foreshore to its South-Eastern extremity; thence by a line drawn in a North-Easterly direction to a point on the foreshore of the mainland. the foreshore of the mainland.

(3.) Channel Island and Greery Island (Peel's In-let).--The whole.

(4.) Deep River Inlet .- The whole of the waters of Deep River Inlet North of an East and West line drawn from the Southernmost extremity of Nelson Location No. 3560, as shown on Lands and Surveys Plan No. 455/80, ÉI.)

WHEREAS by Section 179 of "The Roads Act, 1911," the Board of any Road District is empowered to make, the Board of any Road District is empowered to make, alter, and repeal By-laws for any of the purposes men-tioned in the said section: And whereas the Melville Road Board is desirous of regulating and controlling the manner in which Blasting operations shall be carried on within certain areas of the Melville Road Board District: Now, therefore, the said Melville Road Board doth, in exercise of the powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby wheth the following By laws. hereby make the following By-laws:-

(1.) No person shall carry on any blasting or use explosives in connection with quarrying, or permit or suffer the same to be done, within that portion of the Melville Road Board District for which deposited sub-divisional plans have been lodged in the Titles Office

and more particularly known as residential areas, unless notice in writing of his intention so to do has been served on the Secretary of the Board.

(2.) Every person, before commencing such blasting operations or before permitting or suffering the same to be done, shall put up one or more notices as may be directed and approved by the Secretary of the Board.

(3.) No person shall carry on any blasting opera-tions or use any explosives as aforesaid, if the Secretary to the Board shall, by notice in writing served on such person, prohibit such operations or use of explosives.

(4.) The Secretary of the Board may, if he deem it expedient, order that the place where blasting operations are being carried on be fenced in such a manner as the Secretary may deem necessary for the protection of persons, stock, or property, and further may order that such blasting operations shall cease forthwith or at a stated time to be specified in such order.

(5.) All previous By-laws by the Melville Road Board in force within the above area of the said district dealing with blasting operations are hereby repealed.

(6.) Any person who shall carry on any blasting operations within the above specified area of the Mel-ville Road Board District or permit or suffer the same to be done without duly observing these regulations, or who shall neglect to carry out or observe the orders of the Secretary to the Board in matters hereinbefore men-tioned, and shall otherwise commit a breach of these Bar here shall on guilty of an offence and shall on con-By-laws, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, on con-viction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).
