vided that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare any one or more portions of the State or any one or more localities to be respectively defined in such Proclamation a reserve for Native Game or any particular Native Game: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the portion of the State and localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto shall be a reserve for Native Game.

#### Schedule.

That portion of the Harvey River extending for a distance of two miles upstream from the Harvey Weir.
