WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the said State made and passed in the fourth year of the reign of His late Most Gracious Majesty King Edward the Seventh, No. 26 (Act No. 51 of 1904), intituled "The Local Courts Act, 1904," the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to order that Courts to be called Local Courts shall be held at such places as he thinks fit: And whereas it is deemed expedient to establish a sitting of a Local Court at Westonia, once in every month: Now therefore

Subject to the provisions of the Public Service Act, appointments may be made at any salary within those limits. Successful appointees must comply with the life assurance provisions of the Public Service Act and Regulations.
