Change of Title of Inspector General of Forests.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to repeal Regulation No. 13 made under "The Abattoirs Act, 1909," and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th day of September, 1916, and to approve of a Regulation as follows, which shall have effect in lieu thereof:—

Fees and Charges.

13. (1.) The fees and charges set out in the following Scale A shall be paid and collected from all owners of stock for the use of the abattoir when space is allotted and the stock are slaughtered by slaughtermen employed and paid by the owner of the stock:—

Scale A.

Cattle, 3s. per head.
Calves up to 60 lbs., 7d. per head.
Calves from 60 to 150 lbs., 1s. 3d. per head.
Calves over 150 lbs., 3s. per head.
Sheep (including goats), 5d. per head.
Lambs, 5d. per head.
Pigs to 80 lbs., 1s. per head.
Pigs from 81 to 120 lbs., 1s. 3d. per head.
Pigs from 121 to 150 lbs., 1s. 8d. per head.
Pigs from 151 to 200 lbs., 2s. 3d. per head.
Pigs over 200 lbs., boars and stags, 3s. 9d. per head.

(2.) The fees and charges in the following Scale B shall be paid and collected from all owners of stock when stock are slaughtered and dressed by Government employees:—

Scale B.

Cattle, 3s. per head.
Calves up to 60 lbs., 1s. per head.
Calves from 60 lbs. to 150 lbs., 2s. per head.
Calves over 150 lbs., 3s. per head.
Sheep (including goats), 5d. per head.
Rams and stags, 10d. per head.
Lambs, 5d. per head.
Lambs (backset), 8d. per head.
Pigs from 11 lbs. to 40 lbs., 1s. 6d. per head.
Pigs from 41 lbs. to 80 lbs., 2s. per head.
Pigs from 81 lbs. to 120 lbs., 2s. 6d. per head.
Pigs from 121 lbs. to 150 lbs., 3s. 6d. per head.
Pigs from 151 lbs. to 200 lbs., 4s. per head.
Pigs over 200 lbs., boars and stags, 7s. per head.

Scale B is fixed on the following conditions, which shall have effect when stock are slaughtered by Government employees and subject to that scale of charges:—

(a.) All viscera and offal (except as hereinafter provided) shall be the property of the Government.

Such viscera and offal shall be deemed to include:—

(1.) the horns, reed fat, heart fat, stinkings, trimmings, tripe-trimmings, hair tips, guts, gut fat, scalp, and lungs of all cattle;

(2.) the trotters, caul fat and lungs, and all viscera (except the fry) of sheep, lambs and goats;

(3.) all viscera (except the pluck) of pigs.

(b.) The head, feet, tail, heart, liver, tripe, and caul fat of cattle, and the fry of sheep, lambs, and goats, and the pluck of pigs shall be the property of the owner if removed within eight hours after slaughter, but, if not so removed the same shall be the property of the Government, without compensation to or redress by the owner.

(3.) No claim to be made in respect of the blood of any slaughtered animal.

(4.) The above charges include inspection and branding fee of the Health Authority. Any fees payable for inspection by the Commonwealth authorities to be paid by the owner.

(5.) The following charges shall be payable by the owner in respect of all stock brought in for slaughter from the saleyards or elsewhere, while such stock are awaiting slaughter:—

Cattle, calves, and pigs, 1d. per head per day.
Sheep, lambs, and goats, 1d. per score or part thereof per day.

No charge will be made for the first 24 hours.

(6.) The following charges shall be payable by the owner for the supply of food and water, pending

slaughter, to such stock as shall not be fed and watered by the owner, namely:—

Cattle (including calves), 1s. per head per day or part of a day.

Sheep, lambs, and goats, 2d. per head per day or part of a day.

Pigs, 6d. per head per day or part of a day.
