ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 4th day of October, 1916.

Present:

The Honourables—The Premier (Senior Member), The Minister for Lands, The Minister for Railways.

WHEREAS by Section 139 of "The Roads Act, 1911," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of "The Permanent Reserves Act, 1899," the Governor may place any Public Reserve under the control and management of a Road Board, and that for the purpose of control-ling or managing such Reserve the Board shall have all the power of a Board of Parks and Reserves appointed under "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," together with the powers conferred by "The Roads Act. 1911'': And whereas it is expedient that Reserve 13151 (Yuna) should be placed under the control and management of the Upper Chapman Road Board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Roads Act, 1911," doth hereby place the said Reserve under the control and management of the Upper Chapman Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, the 4th day of October, 1916.

Present:

The Honourables—The Premier (Senior Member), The Minister for Lands, The Minister for Railways.

W.S. 3297/16. WHEREAS the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage, and Drainage Area was constituted by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," and it is by the said Act provided that the Governor may by Order in Council divide the said area into Storm Water Districts and define the boundaries of such Dis-tricts: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor,

with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby divide the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage. and Drainage Area into four Districts, to be known as the Central Storm Water Districts No. 1, No. 2, No. 3, and No. 4, with the several boundaries as follow, namely:

W.S., S., & D.D. Plan 3070.

CENTRAL STORMWATER DISTRICT No. 1. Description of Boundaries.

Starting from the intersection of Thomas Street and Heytesbury Road; thence Westerly along the centre of Heytesbury Road to its intersection with Campbell Street; thence Northerly along Campbell Street to its intersection with Hamersley Road; thence Westerly along Hamersley Road to its intersection with Hensman Road; thence Northerly along Hensman Road to its intersec-tion with Lawler Street; thence Westerly across the Railway Reserve to a point on the North-Western boun-dary of the Railway Reserve (being the prolongation of the South-East side of Roydhouse Street South-Westerly); thence along said Railway boundary about 2,360 (two thousand three hundred and sixty) feet in a North-Easterly direction to a point on a line being the prolongation Westward on the South side of Hay Street; thence Westward on said line about 500 feet to its intersection with Price Street; thence North-Easterly along Price Street to its intersection with Up ham Street; thence Northerly to the centre of Salvado Road; thence Eastward along Salvado Road to its intersection with Harborne Street; thence Northerly along Harborne Street to a point about 400 feet South of the intersection of Harborne Street and Bournville Street; thence in a North-Westerly direction to the intersection of Bournville Street and Mitchell Street; thence Westerly about 200 feet along Bournville Street to its intersection with a right of way; thence North-erly about 500 feet along said right of way; thence North-Easterly to a point on the South side of Gran-tham Street situate about 200 feet East of Mitchell Street; thence in a North-North-Easterly direction to a point on the Municipal boundary situated at the inter-section of Dodd Street and Gregory Street; thence in a North-Easterly direction to the intersection of Tasman Street with the Municipal boundary; thence East-North-East to the intersection of North Beach Road and Ellesmere Street; thence Easterly along Ellesmere Street to its intersection with Wittenoom Street; thence in an East-North-Easterly direction to the intersection of Hilda Street and Walcott Street; thence East-North-Easterly about 2,100 feet to a point on a line being the pro-duction Northward of the centre of Norham Street; centre of Blake Street to its intersection with Walcott Street; thence South-Easterly along centre of Walcott Street to its intersection with Fitzgerald Street; thence North-Easterly along Fitzgerald Street to its intersec-tion with Rookwood Street; thence South-Easterly along Rookwood Street to its intersection with Guildford Road thence Easterly to a point in the centre of Woodroyd Street situate about 200 feet South-West from the in-tersection of Woodroyd Street and Braeside Street: thence North-Easterly along Woodroyd Street to its in-tersection with Braeside Street; thence East-South-East-erly to a point in the centre of Nanhob Street situate about 400 feet from its intersection with Lawley Cres-cent; thence South-Easterly to a point on the North-East boundary of Location Z about 500 feet South-East of Robinson Street; thence along North-East boundary of Location Z to the centre of John Street; thence North-Easterly along John Street to its intersection with Second (Avenue; thence South-Easterly along Second Avenue to the intersection of the prolongation of the common boundary of Lots 188 and 187; thence North-Easterly along said boundary to centre of right of way: thence North-Westerly along said right of way about 50 foet; thence North-Easterly along common boundary of Lots 218 and 219 to centre of Third Avenue; thence South-Easterly about 50 feet along Third Avenue; thence North-Easterly to common corner of Lots 290 and 259; thence South-Easterly to common corner of Lots 288 and 257; thence along South-East boundary of 288 to centre of Fourth Avenue; thence South-Easterly along centre Fourth Avenue to intersect with prolongation of common boundary Lots 58 and 59; thence North-Easterly along said boundary to centre of right of way; thence South-Easterly along centre said right of way 99 feet; thence along common boundary 49 and 82, and its prolongation to centre Fifth Avenue; thence South-Easterly along Fifth Avenue to its intersection with Carrington Street; thence North-Easterly along Carrington Street to its intersection with the prolongation North-Westerly of common boundary 173 and 131; thence South-Easterly intersection with the prolongation North-Westerly of common boundary 173 and 131; thence South-Easterly to common corner of 170 and 133; thence along South-Easterly boundary of 133 to centre of Tenth Avenue; thence along centre of Tenth Avenue and its prolonga tion in a South-Easterly direction to a point 33 feet North-West of the South-East boundary of Railway Reserve; thence North-Easterly along said Reserve to in-tersection of the centre of Government Road; thence South-Easterly along Government Road to intersect with the prolongation North-Eastwards of the common boun dary of Lots 13 and 14; thence South-Westerly along centre of George Street to its intersection with Ninth Avenue; thence South-Easterly along Ninth Avenue to Avenue; thence South-Easterly along Ninth Avenue to the intersection of a line being the prolongation of the South-East boundaries of Lots 34 and 9; thence along said boundaries to centre of Eighth Avenue; thence South-Easterly along Eighth Avenue to its intersection with Guildford Road; thence South-Westerly along Guildford Road to its intersection with Sixth Avenue: thence North-Westerly along Sixth Avenue about 170 feet; thence South-South-Westerly to a point on the South side of Central Avenue being the common North-ern corner of Lots 406 and 407: thence in a South-Southern corner of Lots 406 and 407; thence in a South-South-Westerly direction passing through the common South-corner of Lots 380 and 564 to the centre of Third Avenue; thence North-Westerly along Third Avenue to its intersection with Railway Terrace; thence South-Westerly along Railway Terrace to intersection of centre of Railway Terrace to intersection of centre of Railway Bridge; thence North-Westerly across said bridge to centre of Railway Parade; thence to common Eastern corner of 55 and 56; thence North-Westerly along common boundary of 55 and 56 to common corner of 55 and 166; thence South-Westerly to point on North-East boundary of Lot 62, being common corner of 61 and 66; thence North-Westerly along common boundary 61 and 62 to centre of Coode Street; thence South-Westerly along Coole Street to its intersection with First Avenue; thence South-Easterly along First Avenue to centre of Railway Parade; thence South-Westerly along Railway Parade to its intersection with North-West boundary Location Z; thence South-Easterly along said boundary to common corner of Lots 5 and 15: thence South-Westerly to a point in centre of Stanley Street situated about 250 feet from centre of Guildford Road; Successful appointees must comply with the life assurance provisions of the Public Service Act and Regulations.


