Successful appointees must comply with the life assurance provisions of the Public Service Act and Regulations.

THE ROADS ACT, 1911.

Greenmount Road Board.

Special By-laws for regulating Motor and other Traffic to Blackboy Hill Military Camp.

P.W. 5632/16.

WHEREAS by Section 179 of "The Roads Act, 1911," the Board of any Road District is empowered to make, alter, and repeal By-laws for any of the purposes mentioned in the said section: And whereas the Greenmount Road Board is desirous of regulating and controlling the manner in which Motor and other traffic to Blackboy Hill Military Camp shall be carried on within the Greenmount Road Board District: Now, therefore, the said Greenmount Road Board doth, in exercise of the powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby make the following By-laws:—

146. These By-laws shall be in addition to the Uniform General By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of the 3rd January, 1913, and all amendments and additions thereto, and shall refer to all Motor and other vehicles conveying passengers to or from, also those plying for hire for passengers to or from the Blackboy Hill Military Camp, hereinafter referred to as the Camp.

147. The rank or stand for all cars and vehicles plying for hire shall be that part of Innamineka Road, on the South side, starting at the post about five (5) chains West of Woolowra Road, leaving the intersection of Woolowra open; thence in an Easterly direction to Woolowra Road for a width of twelve (12) feet or thereabouts from the kerb or drain, to be known as the "Hire Rank." All cars and other vehicles, after depositing passengers at the Camp entrance, shall immediately proceed therefrom on their journey to the allotted rank, if desiring to wait, unless otherwise ordered by the Traffic Inspector or police officer.

148. All cars regularly plying for hire between Midland Junction, Bellevue, and the Camp shall not charge more than one shilling (1s.) per passenger for any single journey between either station and the Camp,

but outside those places the rate imposed by the Uniform General By-laws or the Local Authority may be charged.

149. No car plying for hire shall wait or loiter except on the stand allotted under these By-laws, and no car or other vehicle shall take its stand on any rank without being thoroughly cleansed at least once a day, as well as being subject to the provisions of No. 67 of the Uniform General By-laws.

150. The Secretary of the Board for the time being is hereby appointed Traffic Inspector under these and the Uniform General By-laws, and any person who contravenes any provision of these By-laws, whether by act or deed of omission, shall on conviction be liable to the following penalties:—For the first offence, not less than five shillings; for the second offence, not less than ten shillings, and for the third offence, not less than fifteen shillings and the forfeiture of his or her registration certificate under these By-laws; but in no case shall the penalty exceed the sum of Twenty pounds (£20).
