Biennial Election of the Elective Members of the Public Service Appeal Board.

Regulation restricting Cutting of Timber on State Forest Southern Cross-Jaccoletti.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulation under the provisions of Section 15 of "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1904":—

No person shall, without the special permission in writing of the Minister for Mines or his agent (such permission only to be given where the timber is required for use within the boundaries of the said State Forest), fell, cut, split, or remove any timber growing or standing or burn any charcoal on the area of Crown Land hereafter to be known and distinguished as the Southern Cross-Jaccoletti State Forest, the boundaries of which are described hereunder:—

Southern Cross-Jaccoletti State Forest.—The Crown Lands within a strip of land 20 miles wide, extending

from the Southern side of the Eastern Railway in a South-Easterly direction parallel to and extending ten (10) miles on either side of a line drawn from Southern Cross and passing through Survey Peg H.K. 176 and H.K. 175 and continuing in the same direction to a point ten (10) miles beyond the latter peg to a line drawn at right angles at the extremity of line aforesaid, together with the area bounded on the North by the Southern boundary of the Yilgarn State Forest; on the West by the Eastern boundary of the Corinthia State Forest and the Northern and Eastern boundaries of the Yilgarn Agricultural Area; on the South by the Northern boundary of the Eastern Goldfields railway, and on the East by a line in prolongation South of the Easternmost boundary of the Yilgarn State Forest aforesaid.
