The Roads Act, 1911. Queen's Park Road District. Re-Defining the External Boundaries. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Roads Act, 11911," it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council re-define the boundaries of any Road District: And whereas it is desirable to re-define the boundaries of the Queen's Park Road District: And whereas due notice of the intention of the Governor in Executive Council to exercise such power has, in accordance with the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," been duly published in the *Government Gazette* and served on the Boards concerned, in the manner prescribed by the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," and all other powers therein him enabling, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the Queen's Park Road District in manner set forth and described in the schedule hereto:—

Schedule.

Bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the Southern side of the Lower Canning Bridge with the left bank of the Canning River, and extending Eastward along the said Southern side of the Lower Canning Bridge to the Eastern side of Road 124; thence North Eastward along the latter to the Northern side of Road 123; thence Eastward along the said side of Road 123 to the North-West boundary of Canning Location 65; thence North-Eastward along to North-West boundaries of Canning Locations 65 and 328, the South-East side of Marlborough Street to the South-Western side of the Perth-Albany Road; thence Northward along said side of road to a point opposite the intersection of the Eastern side of the Perth-Albany Road with the Northern side of Welshpool Road; thence Eastward and North-Eastward along the said Northern side of Welshpool Road and the North-Western side of Brookman Road to the North-Eastward along said North-Eastern side of Prospect Street; thence South-Eastward along said North-Eastward and South-Eastward along said North-Eastward and South-Eastward along side North-Eastward and South-Eastward along system Street Street is the North-Eastward south-Eastward south-Eastward along system Street Street is the North-Eastward south-Eastward south south-West boundary of Loc 197 of Cannin boundaries of said Lot 97 to the North-West boundary of Lot 94; thence North-Eastward along the North-West boundaries of Lots 94, 95, and 96; thence South-East-ward along the North-East boundaries of Lots 96, 70, and 69; thence North-Eastward along the North-Western boundaries of Lots 336, 335, and 334, South-Eastward along the North-Eastern boundaries of Lots 334, 339, 340, 341, and 342 to the South-Eastern side of Road 248 (Guildford Road); thence South Westward and Southward along said side of Road 248 to the Northern side of Welshpool Road; thence Eastward along the latter to a point in prolongation North-Westward of the North-Eastern boundary of Canning Location 315; thence South-Eastward along the North-Eastern boundary of said Location 315 to the North corner of Lot 64 of said location; thence South-Westward along the North-Western boundary of Lot 64 and Canning Locations 286, 316, and 6, and the South-Eastern side of the Nicholson Road Bridge to the left bank of the Canning River; thence along said left bank of the Canning River to the starting point.

"The Metropolitan Water Supply, WHEREAS by Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909, '' it is provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from the operations of certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby exempt the reticulation works as hereinafter described from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Area No. 31, Perth. Contract No. 230.

Description of Proposed Works.

Reticulation sewers constructed of 6in. and 9in. diameter stoneware pipes, with all manholes, inspection shafts, and other apparatus connected therewith.

Lines 1, 2, 3, 4, commencing at M.H. No. 1737 in Norfolk Street; thence North along Norfolk Street about 300 lin. feet Westerly between Fitzgerald and Norfolk Streets; about 1,450 lin. feet.

Lines 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10. Along R.O.Ws. between Farmer, Angove, Fitzgerald Streets and East side of Lot 9, Farmer Street, and Lot 7 off Angove Street; a total distance of about 3,450 lin. feet.

Lines 11, 12, from Line 1 in Venn Street, between Monmouth and Fitzgerald Streets and Venn and York Streets; about 850 lin. feet.

Line 19, from Venn Street to York Street between Monmouth and Walcott Streets; about 550 lin. feet.

Amendment of Regulation No. 199a.

Lights when under way .- Open boats, sailing yachts, and lighters of less than 28 tons net registered tonnage, and all fishing boats, when under way, shall not be obliged to carry the coloured side lights; but every such boat and vessel shall in lieu thereof have ready at hand a lantern with a green glass on one side, and a red glass on the other side, and on approaching to or being approached by another vessel, such lantern shall be exhibited in sufficient time to prevent collision, so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side nor the red light on the starboard side.

A vessel which is being overtaken by another shall show from her stern to such last-mentioned vessel a white light or a flareup light.

(1.) Materials of external walls of buildings with-3 in the prescribed area of the Road District must be built or brick or stone or artificial stone, wood, or iron, or other material approved by the Board, and such materials must be sound and subject to the approval of the Survevor.

(2.) All main walls of brick or stone must have a thickness of not less than as prescribed below viz.:-(a.) If the wall does not exceed 25 feet in height,

- it shall be 8½ inches thick. (b.) Over 25 feet but not exceeding 40 feet, 13
 - inches thick below the topmost storey, and 8½ inches thick for the rest of its height.
 - (c.) Over 40 feet, 171/2 inches thick for the height of one storey, then 13 inches below the top-

most storey, and then 8½ inches thick. (3.) The party walls of brick buildings must have parapet walls with a damp-proof course at level of flashing and a capping of one to one cement mortar, and finished off with a pure cement wash, to level off flashing.

(4.) In the case of a terrace of shops and dwellings or of dwellings only, the front room and that imme-diately behind it may be built to the full width of the allotment or tenement. All other rooms must have a clear space on one side of at least 4ft. 6in. in the clear between the dividing line of such tenement and the external walls of such rooms for the free admission of air and light. There must be nine feet in the clear between the external walls of every pair of such constructed terraces, and all windows and ventilators must be opened on to the light and air space there provided for. No two or more dwellings or business premises will be permitted to have any yard or buildings in common save and except when in occupation of the same tenant or occupier.

(d.) If any external wall or enclosure be at any time hereafter taken down or otherwise demolished for the height of one storey, or for the space equal to onefourth of the whole surface of such external wall, then every part thereof not built in the manner and of the several materials by these By-laws directed for external walls must be taken down, and the same must be rebuilt in such manner and with such materials for and in all respects as by these By-laws directed for external walls hereafter to be built within the prescribed area of the Road District, and it shall be within the power of the Secretary or Building Surveyor to enforce the rebuilding of same.

In reference to the component parts thereof, every part of such party wall must be built of sound bricks or stone, or of such bricks and stone together, laid in with mortar and cement, and in such a manner as to produce solid work; and as to the woodwork which it may be desired to connect with party walls of any it may be desired to connect with party walls of any building, the bearing ends of wooden beams, breast-summers, girders, trimming joists, and the ends of partition heads and sills, and the bearing ends of the main timbers of any roof, and wood bricks, may be laid into the substances of a party wall, but no such beam, breast summer, girder, joist, partition, head, or sill, nor any part of a roof, being wood, nor any wood bricks; must be laid or placed within two inches of the centre of any party wall, and no other woodwork of any kind must be laid into, placed upon, or driven into any part of the substance of any party wall; but if any part of the substance of any party wall; but if

the ends of the timber be carried in iron shoes or stone corbels, then such iron shoes or corbels must be built into the wall at least one-half of the thickness of such wall; and the top of every such party wall must be finished with one course of sound hard bricks, set on edge in good mortar or cement, or by a coping of any other properly secured and sufficiently waterproof and fireproof covering.

Roofs, etc.

With regard to the roof, flat, or gutter of any building, any or every projection therefrom, and also balconies and shop-fronts, they must be so arranged and constructed and so supplied with gutters and pipes so as to prevent the water from dripping on to or running over the public way, and all such rain pipes, eaves, and gutters are to be made of metal.

Rooms.

6. (1.) With regard to rooms in any part of any building in reference to height thereof, every room used, or intended to be used, for the purpose of habitation must be at least the height of 10 feet from floor to ceiling, with the exception of scillions, which must be nine feet high in respect to new buildings, and eight feet high in respect to buildings already erected.

(2.) Every room used for the purpose of habitation or for the assemblage of people for any purpose whatever, shall be well and properly ventilated to the satisfaction of the Surveyor or the Board, by the insertion of air bricks below the floor, and by openings in the sleeper walls, also by ventilators in the ceiling or at the top of the walls thereof, according to the size of such walls. No room shall contain less than 600 feet of air space when finished.

Breastsummers.

7. All breastsummers shall be either of iron or approved wood, and to be loaded to one-third only of their breaking weights.

Fire-places.

8. Every fire-place constructed of iron shall be lined with brick or stone built to a height of three feet from the level of the fire rest, and not less than $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches thick, and the hearth of every such fire-place or chimney must be laid and bedded wholly on brick or stone or other incombustible substance; such hearth must consist of a slab or slabs of brick, tile, stone, or slate, iron, or other proper and sufficient substance at least 12 inches longer than the opening of the chimney when finished, and at least 18 inches in front of the arch over the same.

Wood and Iron Buildings.

9. The external walls of all wood and iron buildings must be built at least 4ft. Gin. from the dividing boundary of the property upon which the building is being erected and the adjoining property. The inside walls shall be of lath and plaster, metal, T. and G. jarrah, or other material approved by the Board.

Temporary Buildings.

10. With regard to the granting of permission for the erection of temporary buildings, special permission may be granted by the Board for a period to be stated for the erection of temporary buildings; all the walls may be of wood or iron.

Verandahs and Balconies.

11. (1.) Awnings or verandahs to be erected over the footpaths are to be in accordance with the drawings and specifications approved of by the Surveyor and adopted by the Board. The minimum height is to be 8ft. 6in. clear from the footpath, and the posts must not be less than 5in. x 5in. if in jarrah. The verandah must be painted and kept in repair to the satisfaction of the Secretary or Surveyor, who shall have the power to order such repairs to the verandahs generally as he may deem necessary. In the event of neglect, or of the Surveyor necessary. In the event of neglect, or of the Surveyor observing the necessity of removal or repair, such must be commenced within seven days of the receipt of notice from the Secretary or Surveyor, and must be completed within 14 days of such notice, or otherwise the verandahs will be removed at the expense of the owner or occupier, to be recoverable from him in a summary manner before Justices.

(2.) Balconies.—Verandah posts must be not less than 6in. x 6in. jarrah, two feet in ground, with a sole plate to be in one length equal to the extreme length

of the balcony, of 9in. x 2in. jarrah. A top plate not less than 9in. x 2in. oregon or jarrah. Bearers not less than 6in. x 3in. oregon, not more than 4ft. 6in. apart. Joists not less than 4in. x 2in. with 1ft. 6in. centres. Floors T. and G. 1sin. thick. Verandah posts not less than 4in. x 4in. Rafters not less than 4in. x 2in. Top plate not less than 6in. x 2in. All plates to be bolted to the posts. The floor of balconies shall not be less than 10 feet from surface of footpath.

(3.) No balcony supported wholly from cantilevers or corbelled out from the wall will be permitted unless specially authorised in writing by the Board.

Contractors' Sheds.

12. Nothing in these By-laws shall prevent any contractor or builder erecting a temporary office, sheds, or workshops of wood or iron on any building site during the building operations, provided that special application must be made to and permission granted by the Secretary or Surveyor.

Chimneys-Domestic and Factory.

13. Every chimney-shaft or flue hereafter built, raised, or repaired, must be carried up in brick or stone work all round at least four inches thick to a height of at least three feet above the highest of such portion of roof, flat, or gutter adjoining thereto, measured at the point of junction. As to any chimney-shaft (except that of a steam-engine, brewery, distillery, or manufactory), the brick or stone of such shaft or flue must not be built higher than eight feet above the slope or flat or gutter which it adjoins, measured from the highest point of junction, unless such chimney-shaft shall be built of increased thickness, or be built with and bonded with another chimney-shaft, or be otherwise rendered secure. As to the chimney-shaft for the boiler furnace of any steam engine, or for any brewery, distillery, or manufactory, such shaft may be erected of any height so that it be built in such a manner and of such strength and dimensions as shall be satisfactory to the Secretary or Surveyor upon special application made and approved in each case.

Chimney-pots.

14. As to earthen or metal chimney-pots, tubes, funnels, or cowls of any description whatever.—If such pot, tube, funnel, or cowl be higher than four feet above the brick or stone work of the flue upon which the same shall be erected, then it must be fixed 12 inches at the least into the brick or stone work of the flue on which it shall be placed, or otherwise fixed to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.

Power to Surveyor to Enter and Remove.

15. When anything shall have been done or omitted to be done in contravention of these By-laws, it shall be lawful for the Surveyor or Secretary, at his discretion, to enter on the premises and remove or cause to be removed any buildings or other things which have been erected in contravention thereof, or to do or cause to be done any act or thing which should have been done in pursuance thereof, and the cost of such doing shall be borne and paid by such owner or other person in addition to any penalties to which he may be liable in respect thereof under these By-laws or Regulations.

Bench-marks, etc.

16. All survey levels, bench-marks, or other marks denoting the same shall be carefully preserved, and any person removing, altering, or obliterating or causing or permitting same to be removed, altered, or obliterated shall be liable to a penalty of $\pounds 10$, and to pay all costs incurred in replacing or restoring same.

Mutual and Parapet Walls.

17. All walls erected within two feet of the boundary of allotment must have parapet walls with copings, the walls in every case being carried up as per By-law No. 88.

Cornices, etc.

18. No cornice or other ornament shall project beyond the alignment of the street more than 18 inches, and must not be lower than 15 feet above the level of the footpath.

Cellars and Lights.

19. No cellar will be allowed under the pavement of the street, and authority for fixing prismatic or other lights on the pavement must be obtained in writing from the Board before being fixed.

Earth-closets.

20. Under no circumstances must any earth-closet be built nearer to any dwelling or shop than 20 feet. In cases where the back line of allotment abuts on a right of way which runs alongside of other premises, the closets must not be placed nearer to the side of the right-of-way that forms the side line of another property than 34 feet for a distance of 75 feet from the street line off which the right-of-way runs.

Plans.

21. All plans of buildings and alterations must be examined and approved by the Board, and such approval certified to on the original drawings.

To prevent Damage to Footpaths or other Board

Property.

IN pursuance of the powers and provisions in, under, and by virtue of "The Roads Act, 1911," and amend-ments thereof, the Kalgoorlie Road Board makes and ordains that the following By-laws for the general regulation of street and footpaths and traffic thereon, and for the safety thereof, be enforced and observed:-

1. No person shall remove or cause to be removed from one part of the District to another, or from out-side the District to any part within the district, any building without the consent in writing of the Secretary or other officer appointed by the Board first had and obtained.

2. The application for the consent mentioned shall be made to the Secretary of the Board 48 hours before it is proposed to remove any building, setting forth the full particulars of the building proposed to be removed, the place from which it is to be removed and where it is to be deposited, also the proposed route by the person proposing to remove or cause to be removed such building.

3. In the event of such consent to the removal as aforesaid being given, a sum of (£2) two pounds shall be deposited at the office of the Board as a security for any damage that may be done to any road, street, rightof-way, or footpath, and in the event of any damage as aforesaid being done, the whole or any part of the sum so deposited may be retained by the Board to cover the cost of repairing and making good such damage.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 7 of 1916.

Between Perth, Fremantle, and Suburban Bread Carters' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and H. C. Moore ; H. F. McSorley ; Currie and Murray ; J. A. Naylor ; S. Milne ; Theo. Hansin ; Robinson and Smith ; and W. McKinley, Respondents.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the Industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

AWARD.

1. *Hours of Labour.*—Fifty-four hours of labour, inclusive of the time necessary for stabling and loading, but exclusive of the time occupied for meals, shall constitute a week's work, except for the week during which any holiday occurs, when the week's work shall consist of forty-five hours.

2. Commencing Time.—The day's work shall be deemed to commence at the time the bread-carter arrives at his employer's premises, and to terminate when he finally leaves them for the day; but the hour of commencing shall not be before 6 a.m. on any day.

3. Overtime.—Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-quarter for all time during which the bread-carter is engaged in excess of the fifty-four hours per week; or in excess of forty-five hours during a week in which any holiday occurs.

4. Wages.--The minimum rate of wage to be paid to a bread-carter shall be three pounds per week.

5. Wages payable weekly .-- Wages shall in all cases be paid weekly.

6. *Meal Time.*—A bread-carter shall be allowed for meal time a period of not more than one hour per day.

7. Holidays.—There shall be no reduction of pay in respect of the statutory monthly holiday, nor in respect of Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, or Eight Hours' Day, which days shall be observed as holidays. Provided, however, that the holiday on Eight Hours' Day is granted conditionally on an agreement being arrived at between the operative bakers, the bread-carters, and the employers. Failing such an agreement then the day following Eight Hours' Day shall be observed as a holiday and shall be paid for. Any bread-carter called upon to work on Good Friday or Christmas Day shall, in addition to his weekly wage, be paid at double time rate for work done on those days.

8. Sunday Work.—Sunday work shall consist of attendance on horses only. A breadcarter required to do Sunday work shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half for the time he is engaged in such work.

9. Board or Lodging.—Except in the case of parent and son, a bread-carter shall not board or lodge with his employer or on his premises.

10. Shortages.—A bread-carter shall not be held responsible for shortages in money or bread unless notified by the employer or his authorised servant in respect of same within twenty-four hours of such appearing in his delivery book or bread book.

Sunday and holidays shall not be calculated in reckoning the twenty-four hours

11. Time and Wages Book.—A time and wages book shall be kept at each bakery, which shall show the name of each bread-carter, the time he starts and finishes work each day, the number of hours worked, the amount of overtime worked, the wages paid, and the worker's signature for same.

The employer and the worker shall be jointly responsible for the proper posting of the book daily.

The book shall be supplied by the Union and shall be open to inspection by the representative of the Union during working hours.

12. Shipping Trade.—The provisions of Clause 2 hereof, as to starting time, shall not apply to deliveries to ships at Fremantle.

13. Nothing in this award shall in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker below the rate actually received by him at the date hereof.

14. Term.—This award shall come into operation upon the date hereof, and shall continue in force for a period of three years.

15. Area.—This award shall apply to the locality comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office, Perth.
