- (a) The published arrangement under which Mr. Nevanas was to take control of the Wyndham Freezing Works, when completed, for a lengthy
- period at a generous rate of commission.

 (b) The withholding of the letter alleged to have been given by the Premier to Mr. Nevanas, and the subsequent telegrams between Ministers, respecting this arrangement, from the select committee which investigated the Nevanas contract.

 (c) The accuracy or otherwise of the evidence given
- to the select committee on this point, and
- (d) Whether such arrangement has been terminated or not.

WHEREAS by "The Postponement of Debts Act, 1914," it is provided that the Governor may, on the advice of a Royal Commission, from time to time by Proclamation declare that payment of all debts then due Proclamation, of the classes specified, or of persons of the classes specified, in the Proclamation, or a specified proportion of any such debts, may, subject to such conditions and exceptions as may be contained in such Pro-clamation, be postponed to a date or for a period to be therein specified: And whereas a Royal Commission appointed under the said Act has advised that payment of all debts incurred in connection with the farming industry now due, or to accrue due within the period commencing on the publication of this Proclamation and ending the 31st day of March, 1917, should be postponed to the 1st day of April, 1917, but subject to the conditions that the crops of the debtors are or were charged to the Colorial Treasurer under and subject to "The Industries Assistance Act, 1915," and except debts incurred on and after the 1st day of March, 1916, for stores by settlers in receipt of cash advances from the Industries Assistance Board for stores to be procured by such settlers, and debts of settlers in receipt of advances for the purposes mentioned in paragraph (c) of Section 9 of the graphs (a) and (b) thereof: Now therefore I, the said Governor, on the advice of the Royal Commission, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do bereby declare that payment of all debts incurred in connection with the farming industry now due, or to accrue due within the period commencing on the date of the publication of this Proclamation and ending on the 31st day of March, 1917, is hereby postponed to the 1st day of April, 1917, but subject to the condition that the crops of the debtors are or were charged to the Colonial Treasurer under and subject to "The Industries Assistance Act, 1915," and except debts incurred on and after the 1st day of March, 1916, for stores by settlers in receipt of cash advances from the Industries Assistance Board for stores to be procured by such settlers, and debts of settlers in receipt of advances for the purposes mentioned in paragraph (c) of Section 9 of the said Act, and not for the purposes mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b) thereof.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has approved of the following amendments to the Regulations of the Education Department, and to the Regulations for Secondary School Scholarships and Admission to Secondary Schools.

AMENDMENTS TO REGULATIONS.

Monitors and Probationers.

Regulation 50 to be amended to read as follows:-50. Candidates who have passed the Junior Examina-tion of the University of Western Australia or some other examination that is recognised by the Department as a satisfactory substitute are eligible, if of the required age, to be appointed as Monitors on probation, but they will be required to sit at the next Monitors Examination for those subjects which are not covered by their University Examination. They will be required to serve at least one month without salary, and will not receive permanent appointments as Monitors until they have completed the required examination.

Candidates who have satisfactorily completed the work of the Ninth Class in a Central School or in any State School in which such a class is formed are eligible for appointment as Monitors, provided that they have passed in English (including Reading), Writing, Arithmetic, History, Geography, and Drawing. Boys must also pass in Algebra and girls in Needlework. Passes in additional subjects will increase the candidate's chance of appointment. ment. Those who have passed in all but one of these subjects may be appointed on probation, on the terms set out in the preceding paragraph.

For candidates who are unable to qualify under the terms of either of the two preceding paragraphs a special monitors' examination will be held by the De-The Syllabus will be published each year in partment. the Circular.

Regulation 51 to be amended to read as follows:-

51. The Head Teacher will be responsible for seeing that the time allowed to Monitors for study is properly allocated, and the work diligently done, and for giving instruction and assistance, unless other arrangements are made by the Department.

Regulation 55, third paragraph, to be amended to read as follows:

The Monitors' Lesson Book must be faithfully posted in accordance with the instructions therein contained. At least one Criticism Lesson should be given each week. Head Teachers must direct and supervise their Monitors' methods of teaching.

Regulation 57—After the word "Monitors" in the fifth line, add "or 'C'."

Regulation 66-Add the following paragraphs:-

A limited number of students may be selected for a three years' course of training. The selection will be made at the end of the first year from those who have successfully completed a full year's University work. Such students will be required to pledge themselves to teach in the schools of the Department for four years after the completion of their training.

At the end of the second year a limited number of these students may be selected for a four years' course, so that they may complete their University Degree Courses during their period of training. Such students will be required to pledge themselves to teach in the schools of the Department for five years after the completion of their training. pletion of their training.

Regulation 67-Add the following paragraphs:-

A student who has been selected for a three years' course of training and has completed his course satisfactorily shall be eligible for appointment on the second grade of salaries prescribed for Assistants with the "B2" Certificate, and shall, for all purposes of classification and reckoning of seniority, be ranked as though he had held the "B2" Classification from the completion of his second year of training.

A student who has been selected for a four years' course of training and has completed his course satisfactorily shall be eligible for appointment on the maximum salary prescribed for Assistants with the "B2" Certificate, and shall, for all purposes of classification and reckoning of seniority, be ranked as though he had held the "B2" classification from the completion of his second year of training.

Secondary School Scholarships.

- 1. Scholarships, not exceeding fifty in each year, are annually offered for boys and girls attending Government or other efficient schools. Ten of these Scholarment or other efficient schools. Ten of these Scholarships will be of the value of £20 per annum. The remainder will entitle the holders to receive a grant to defray the necessary expenses incurred in the provision of books, provided that no such extra grant shall exceed £3 per annum, and to have their entrance fees paid by the Department on sitting for the Junior Examination in the third year, and for the Leaving Certificate Examination in the fifth year of their Scholarships. Scholarnation in the firth year of their Scholarships. Scholarship holders living at home may also receive a grant to defray their necessary travelling expenses, provided that their homes are at a greater distance than two miles from the school. The winners of these Scholarships must attend Secondary Schools approved by the Department. If the winner of a Scholarship resides at such a distance from an approved school that it is necessary for him to become a hogyler or to live away. necessary for him to become a boarder or to live away from home, an additional allowance of £30 per annum will be given.
- 2. The Scholarships will be tenable for three years in the first instance, but may be renewed for a further period of two years if the industry and success of the scholar are considered to warrant such an extension.
 - 3. A candidate for these Scholarships must—

 (a) Be over twelve years old on the last day of the year in which the examination for the Scholarship is held, and not more than thirteen years old on 31st October of that year.

- (b) Have attended one or more of the Government or other efficient schools of the State for at least two years immediately preceding the day mentioned in (a), and have made not less than three hundred half-day attendances (unless prevented by illness) in such school or schools during his last year.
- (c) Produce a certificate of industry and good conduct from the Head Teacher of the school last attended.
- 4. The Scholarships are awarded upon a competitive examination conducted by the Education Department
- 5. A number of Scholarships, not exceeding one-fifth of the total number offered, will be reserved for pupils from country schools, provided that candidates of sufficient merit present themselves. A school with an average attendance of over 200 shall not be deemed a country school for the purposes of this section.
- The conditions upon which the Scholarships are tenable are-
 - (a) That the successful scholar shall, at the commencement of the first term following the award of the Scholarship, become a pupil at a Secondary School approved by the Minister. The Minister may require that the school be inspected.
 - (b) That he shall continue to attend such school, and at the end of each term obtain from the authorities of the school, and forward to the Education Department, a certificate stating that his conduct, progress, and attendance have been satisfactory. Full particulars of attendance, of success in study, and of promotion, if any, must be given. If an unfavourable report is received, or if at any time his conduct be disorderly, or immoral, the Scholarship may at the disorderic of the the Scholarship may, at the discretion of the Minister, be forthwith cancelled.
 - (c) Payment will be made to the parent or guardian.

 The cost of the necessary books, up to £3, may be deducted and paid to the Principal of the school.
- 7. The examination will be on the following subjects:-
 - (1.) English (300 marks).—The paper will be designed to test the candidate's powers of understanding the language and of using it freely and correctly. It will include Composition and questions on simple Grammar and Analysis of Sentences.
 - (2.) Arithmetic (200 marks).—The ordinary course of Arithmetic as prescribed for classes not higher than the sixth in State Schools.
 - (3.) History (100 marks).—Outlines of British istory. Text-books such as "A Brief Survey of History. British History,'' by G. Townsend Warner (Blackie, 1s. 6d.), or the series by Lay (Macmillan's), will give sufficient material. A number of alternative questions will be set.
 - (4.) Geography (100 marks).—The Geography of the British Empire, with special attention to Australasia. Simple Physiography as prescribed for classes not higher than the sixth in the State Schools. A number of alternative questions will be set.
- The examination will be held in such centres as shall be fixed annually by the Department.
- 9. Schools desiring to be included on the list of approved Secondary Schools at which these Scholarships are tenable must apply to the Department for inclusion. The Minister must be satisfied that the school possesses suitable premises and equipment and is adequately staffed; and that it provides a five years' course of instruction beyond the primary stage, leading up to a standard not lower than that of the Leaving Certificate in such a number and range of subjects as the Minister may deem adequate.

Admission to Secondary Schools.

The examination for admission to Secondary Schools will be identical with that for Secondary School Scholarships. Candidates must be over 12 and under 131/2 years on the last day of the year.

A candidate who succeeds in gaining admission may, if he resides at such distance from an approved school that it is necessary for him to become a boarder or live away from home, receive an allowance of £30 per annum.
