WHEREAS by "The Electoral Act, 1907," it is provided that new Rolls for any Province or District and new Rolls generally shall be prepared under the supervision of and issued by the Chief Electoral Officer, whenever directed by Proclamation, and shall come into operation at a date to be stated in the same or any subsequent Proclamation: And whereas the Chief Electoral Officer was directed by Proclamation dated the fourteenth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and sixteen, to prepare under his supervision and issue new Rolls for each District: And whereas the new Roll for the Geraldton District has now been so prepared and issued: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby fix Friday, the thirteenth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and seventeen as the date upon which such new Roll for the Geraldton District shall come into operation.

Subject to the provisions of the Public Service Act, appointments may be made at any salary within those limits. Successful appointees must comply with the life assurance provisions of the Public Service Act and Regulations.

# MUNICIPAL BY-LAWS.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 5th April, 1917.

C.S.O. 1918/16; M.P.H. 1511/16.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following amendment of Clause 11 of Part I of By-laws made by the Council of the Municipality of the City of Perth, being the Local Health Authority for the Municipal District of Perth, on the 6th September, 1915.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Health Act, 1911," the City of Perth being the Local Health Authority for the Municipal District of Perth doth hereby order as follows:—

The Health By-laws of the 6th September, 1915, are hereby amended as follows:—

- 1. By adding the following paragraphs to Clause 11 of Part I. of the said By-laws:—
  - (c) On the written application of any occupier the Council may dispense with such occupier providing the receptacle specified in sub-clause (a) and may allow such occupier to provide such bin or receptacle, to be approved of by an Inspector, as may suit his own requirements. The provisions of Clauses 12 and 13 of this part of the By-kaws shall apply to any such bin or receptacle so provided.
  - (d.) The Council shall not grant the dispensation mentioned in Subclause (c) until such occupier has entered into a contract with the Council for the removal of his rubbish on such terms and conditions as the Council may require.
  - (e) If such occupier shall carry on the business of a Fish Monger or a Fish Shop in any such house or premises, in addition to the receptacle or receptacles specified in Subclause (a) he shall cause such house or premises to be provided with as many receptacles for the temporary deposit of fish offal as may be required by notice in writing from an Inspector. Such receptacles for fish offal shall be constructed of 22 gauge plain galvanised iron, 17\(^3\) inches diameter and 17\(^3\) inches deep, \(^3\) inch round iron handle fixed on opposite sides and at a height of 12 inches. The bottom stiffened on outside with two pieces of 1 x \(^1\) ron placed 10\(^1\) inches apart and turned up at ends and rivetted to sides of pan. The upper edge of pan to have 1 inch x \(^3\) wrought iron rim securely rivetted together. The 2 inch x \(^1\) inch inner and the 2 inch x \(^3\) inch outer stiffener to lid to be set at right angles and well rivetted to lid, the outer stiffener to be fitted at each end with 4\(^1\) x \(^1\) x \(^1\) inch cast iron levers and 2 inch x \(^3\) inch wrought iron clips. The rim of lid shall be all round formed to receive \(^3\) inch rubber ring. The bottoms of receptacles to be knocked up and the seams grooved and the bottom, seams, and rivets sweated with solder inside.
    - (j.) The charges more particularly specified in the second column of Schedule "A" hereto are the charges to be paid by the occupier of any premises in respect of the services more particularly specified in the first column of the said Schedule and set opposite to the amount of such charges.
  - (2.) Clauses 12 and 13 of Part I of this By-law are repealed and the following Clauses shall stand and be part of the By-law in substitution therefor:—

Refuse and Offal to be deposited in Receptacles.

(12.) The occupier of every premises shall cause all refuse and fish offal to be deposited in the respective receptacles hereinbefore provided, and such receptacles shall be maintained in a thoroughly clean and efficient condition and in a condition to satisfy the requirements of By-law 11, and he shall, when required by an Inspector, thoroughly cleanse and disinfect every such receptacle.

Receptacles to be kept covered and emptied.

- (13.) Every occupier shall cause any such receptacle to be covered with its lid at all times except when the lid is removed for placing the refuse or fish offal within the receptacle, and at such time the lid shall be immediately replaced. Every such receptacle shall be emptied once weekly or so much more frequently as an Inspector may direct.
  (3.) Schedule "A" to Part I. of this By-law is hereby
- (3.) Schedule "A" to Part I. of this By-law is hereby amended by striking out paragraph (c) and inserting in lieu thereof:—
  - (c.) For the removal of rubbish or refuse receptacles or receptacles for fish offal—1 to 6.
- 2. By adding the following Sections to Part 1 of the said By-laws:—

Keeping of Horses, Cows, Sheep and Goats.

- 30. (a.) "The occupier of any premises shall not allow any horse, cow, sheep, or goat to be loose in any paddock, yard, or other place forming portion of such premises, and the owner of any yard, paddock, or other place shall not allow any horse, cow, sheep, or goat to be loose in any such yard, paddock or place unless and until due provision is made to prevent such horse, cow, sheep, or goat from approaching to within twenty feet of any dwelling or within twenty-five feet of any shop, factory, bakery, or other place where food is manufactured, stored, or exposed for sale.
- (b.) The occupier of any premises to which any such yard, paddock, or other place is appurtenant and in which yard, paddock, or other place any horse, cow, sheep, or goat is kept, and where such yard, paddock, or other place is not appurtenant to any premises, then the owner thereof shall at all times maintain the same in a clean state and condition and shall provide a receptacle of brick, iron, or other impervious material with a close-fitting cover in such yard, paddock, or place, and shall once at least in each day cause all droppings from such horse, cow, sheep, or goat to be cleaned up from such yard, paddock, or place and deposited in such receptacle, and shall at all times, save when in actual use, cause the said receptacle to be covered with such tight fitting cover and shall cause such receptacle to be emptied once in each week or oftener if required by the Inspector, and shall after each emptying cause such receptacle to be cleaned out and shall take such precautions against allowing the breeding of flies as the Inspector shall from time to time direct."
- 3. By adding the following Sections to Part VII. of the said By-laws:—
  - 29. (a.) "Every occupier of premises where meat shall be kept for sale shall cause all such meat to be protected from contamination by flies or dust by one of the following methods:—

(a.) Cause all such meat to be kept in enclosures covered by glass or fine mesh wire gauze.

(b.) Cover all doors and window openings and other apertures on the premises with screens of fine mesh wire gauze and fit all doors so that they are self-closing. Every such occupier shall maintain the fittings provided under this By-law at all times in good order and repair.

## LAND OPEN FOR SELECTION.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that the areas scheduled hereunder will be available for selection under "The Land Act, 1898," and its amendments, on and after the dates set out in said schedule.

Applications must be lodged at the Local Land Office for the district in which the land is situated, and should be lodged on or before the date specified.

All applications lodged before such date will be treated as having been received on that day, and if there are more applicants than one for any lot the application to be granted will be determined by the Land Board. Should any lands remain unselected such will continue available until applied for or otherwise dealt with.

If a Land Board sitting becomes necessary, notice will be given in the Government Gazette and at least one newspaper advising the applicants for the blocks of the date, time, and place of the meeting of the Board, to deal with the matter; but it shall not be obligatory on the Department to give any other notice.

In respect to the drilling stage, a black disc will be displayed on this stage by day on the side upon which approaching vessels are to pass, and by night the side upon which vessels are to pass will be denoted by two green lights placed vertically if the passing side is on the Northern hand of the stage and two red lights placed vertically if the passing side is on the Southern hand of the stage. These lights will be two feet apart, and will be shown from the top of the drilling attachment or approximately 40ft. above water level.
