WHEREAS by a Crown Lease under "The Land Act, 1898," registered in the books of the Office of Land Titles as Crown Lease No. 5107/1912, Avon Location 6693, was granted to William Leslie Reid Hall as Grazing Lease No. 2133/68, subject to the reservation to His Majesty the King, his heirs and successors, of the right to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said lands which it might at any time be deemed necessary to resume for roads, tramways, railway stations, bridges, canals, towing paths, harbour or river improvement works, drainage or irrigation works, or quarries, and generally for any other works or purposes of public use, utility, or convenience, and such lands so resumed to hold to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, as of his or their former estate, without making to the said grantee any compensation in respect thereof, so that the lands so resumed should not exceed one-twentieth part in the whole of the land aforesaid, and that no such resumption should be made of any land upon which any buildings should be erected, or should be in use as gardens or otherwise for the more convenient occupation of any such building, without compensation: And whereas it is desirable to resume the land hereinafter described (being a portion of the land granted aforesaid not exceeding one-twentieth thereof) for the purpose of "Public Use" (Water): Now know ye that I, the Governor of this State, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that, in exercise of the power contained in the said Crown Lease as aforesaid, the land described in the Schedule hereto, being a portion not exceeding one-twentieth of the whole of the land comprised in the said Crown Lease was on the 20th day of June, 1917, resumed on behalf of His Majesty, for the purpose of "Public Use" (Water).

WHEREAS by "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," the Governor is empowered to make, repeal, or alter regulations prescribing all matters which by this Act are required or permitted to be prescribed or which it may be necessary or convenient to prescribe for giving effect to this Act: And whereas the Governor acting under the aforesaid Act did, on the 10th day of March, 1915, make the following regulation:—

"Any person desirous of bringing or sending any grapes, tomatoes, lemons, bananas, pineapples, or passiflora fruits into that portion of the State South of the 33rd parallel of South latitude, or desirous of bringing or sending any tomatoes, loquats, apricots, peaches, plums, nectarines, figs, pears, apples, quinces, plantains, pomegranates, bananas, guavas, tacsonias, pineapples, persimmons, grapes, or citrus or passiflora fruits from that portion of the Harvey Road District South of the 33rd parallel of South latitude into any other portion of the State South of the said parallel shall make application to an inspector for approval."

And whereas it is desirable to delete that portion of the said regulation which reads,

"or desirous of bringing or sending any tomatoes, loquats, apricots, peaches, plums, nectarines, figs, pears, apples, quinces, plantains, pomegranates, grapes, bananas, guavas, tacsonias, pineapples, persimmons, or citrus or passiflora fruits from that portion of the Harvey Road District South of the 33rd parallel of South latitude into any other portion of the State South of the said parallel."

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Western Australia, in exercise of the powers vested in him as aforesaid, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby delete and revoke all that portion of the said regulation which reads,

"or desirous of bringing or sending any tomatoes, loquats, apricots, peaches, plums, nectarines, figs, pears, apples, quinces, plantains, pomegranates, grapes, bananas, guavas, tacsonias, pineapples, persimmons, or citrus or passiflora fruits from that portion of the Harvey Road District South of the 33rd parallel of South latitude into any other portion of the State South of the said parallel."

WHEREAS by "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute any municipal or road district a Fire District, and include such district in Part 2 or Part 3 of the Second Schedule to the Act, and may excise from a district any portion thereof: And whereas it is desirable to constitute that portion of the road district of Westonia hereinafter described a Fire District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute that portion of the Westonia Road District bounded on the Southward by the centre of Pegmatite Street, on the Eastward by a line parallel to and distant 2 chains 50 links Eastward from the Eastern side of Jasper Street; on the Northward by the Northern side of Cement Street and including Westonia Lots 33, 34, 49, and 50, and on the Westward by the Western side of Diorite Street between Cement and Kaolin Streets, the centre of Kaolin Street Westward, and a line parallel to and distant 2 chains 50 links Westward from the Western side of Diorite Street aforesaid between Kaolin and Pegmatite Streets a Fire District by the name of the Westonia Fire District, and include the said Fire District in Part 3 of the Second Schedule to the said Act.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and

for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 10216 for Picnic Ground at Moore River, should be placed under the control of the Gingin Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Gingin Road Board, for the purpose aforesaid, as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

WHEREAS under the powers conferred by the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," the Governor may, by Order in Council, divide any District into Wards, and define the boundaries of and determine the number of members for each Ward: And whereas it is desirable to divide the Dalwallinu Road District into Wards, with the boundaries, names, and number of members to represent each Ward in manner hereinafter appearing: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby divide the Dalwallinu Road District into three Wards, with the names and boundaries set forth and described in the Schedule hereto, and doth declare that the number of members to represent each Ward shall be as set forth in the said Schedule.

Schedule.

North Ward.—Bounded on the North by the North boundary of the District.

On the East by part of the East boundary of the District, from its North-East corner to a point due East of the 87½ M.P. on the Rabbit-proof Fence.

On the South by a line commencing on the East boundary of the District East of the said 87½ M.P. on the Rabbit-proof Fence, and extending West through said M.P. and continuing to and through the 111 M.P. on the No. 2 Fence to the South-East corner of the Victoria Location 5416, and along the South boundaries of Locations 5416 and 6413, and the latter's West boundary; thence along the North boundary of Nugadong A.A. Lot 47, and the North and North-West boundary of Lot 57; thence to the North-East corner of Lot 38 and along its North boundary, part of the East and North boundaries of Lot 39, and the North boundary of Lot 28; thence along part of the East boundary of Lot 25 and along the North-East boundaries of Lots 25 and 24 to a point on the South boundary of Victoria Location 5753 in prolongation of the said North-East boundaries and along the South-East boundaries of Victoria Locations 5753, 5752, and Nugadong A.A. Lots 16, 15, and along the North-East, South-East, and South-West boundaries of Lot 12 and along part of the South-East and West boundaries of Lot 14; thence along the Southern boundaries of Lots 13 and 59 and the North boundary of Lot 1 (Reserve 11156), part of the East and the North boundaries of Lot 2, and the North boundary of Lot 3 and its production West to the District boundary.

On the West by the West boundary of the District from its intersection with the production West of the North boundary of Lot 3 to the North-West corner of the District.—(Two Members.)

Central Ward.—Bounded on the North by the South boundary of the North Ward.

On the East by part of the East boundary of the District from its intersection with the South boundary of the North Ward to the South-East corner of the District.

On the South by part of the South boundary of the District, from its South-East corner to its intersection with the production East of the North boundary of Ninghan Location 1661; thence West along said production and North boundary, part of the East and North boundaries of Location 1662 and the North boundary of Location 1663, part of the East and North boundaries of Location 843, the North and part of the West boundaries of Location 844, the North boundaries of Locations 329, 336, 328, and the East, North, and West boundaries of Location 325, the South boundary of Location 324, the East, North, and West boundaries of Location 321, the North boundaries of Locations 319, 341, Reserve 9422, Melbourne Locations 1920, 1918, part of the East, the North, a West and a North boundaries of Location 1921, a North, an East, and again a North boundary of Location 1284, the North and part of the West boundaries of Location 1924, and the North boundaries of Locations 2676, 2675, and 2674 to the District boundary.

Applicants outside the Public Service are eligible for appointment to the Administrative and Professional Divisions, but are not eligible for appointment to Clerical or General Division vacancies unless they were in the service of a State on 1st January, 1901, or have retired from the service of the Commonwealth or of a State.

Subject to the provisions of the Public Service Act, appointments may be made at any salary within those limits. Successful appointees must comply with the life assurance provisions of the Public Service Act and Regulations.
