SERVICE AND EXECUTION OF PROCESS ACT,
1901-1912.*Rules of Court.*

IN pursuance of the powers vested in us under "The Service and Execution of Process Act, 1901-1912," we, the Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, do direct and order as follows:—

PRELIMINARY.

Rules to apply to all Courts of Record.

1. These rules, except where the subject-matter or context otherwise indicates or requires, shall apply to every Court of Record of Western Australia.

Interpretation.

2. In these rules—
"The Act" means "The Service and Execution of Process Act, 1901-1912."
"The Register" means "The Australian Register of Judgments."

EXECUTION OF WARRANTS.

Person arrested on Warrant to have time to apply for Discharge, etc.

3. When any person has been apprehended under Section 18 of the Act, and a Justice of the Peace orders him to be returned to the State or part of the Commonwealth in which the warrant was issued, such Justice shall, if so required by such person, make such order respecting the time when such person is to be so returned as in the opinion of such Justice will allow such person reasonable opportunity to apply under the said section to a Judge of the Supreme Court for his discharge or for such other order as such Judge may think fit.

4. A Judge may, on application *ex parte* by or on behalf of such person, make a like order.

ENFORCEMENT OF JUDGMENTS.

Register in Supreme Court.

5. A book, to be called "The Australian Register of Judgments," shall be kept by the Master of the Supreme Court. Such book shall be in the Form No. 1 contained in the First Schedule hereto.

Register in Inferior Courts.

6. A like book shall be kept by the Clerk of every Local Court, and by the officer in charge of the records of every other inferior Court of Record having civil jurisdiction in the State.

Certificate to be Filed.

7. Every certificate of a judgment shall be filed before the same is registered.

Registration to be noted on Certificate.

8. The officer registering any certificate shall note thereon the date of such registration and the registration number.

Notices to be Filed.

9. When any notification is made under Section 26 of the Act a copy thereof shall be filed.

Certified Copy of Certificate Registered in any Jurisdiction.

10. Any person having registered a certificate of a judgment in any jurisdiction of the Supreme Court may obtain from the proper officer thereof a copy of such certificate certified under the hand of such officer and the office seal. The said copy shall have the same force and effect as a certified copy of a judgment of the said Court.

Affidavit of Liability.

11. No execution shall be issued or other proceedings taken upon a certificate registered in any Court unless such execution is issued or such proceedings are commenced within thirty days next after the making of the affidavit required by Section 23 of the Act, or within such further time as the Court or a Judge thereof may order. Such order may be made *ex parte*.

Notification of Proceedings.

12. Every person on whose behalf execution is issued or other proceedings are taken upon any such certificate shall forthwith notify the same in writing to the Master or other proper officer of the Court in which such certificate is registered. He shall also give the like notification of the result of such execution or proceedings.

13. Every officer or person charged with the execution of any writ or other proceedings issuing out of any Court for the execution or enforcement of any judgment registered under the Act shall notify in writing to the Master, Clerk, or other proper officer of such Court the result of such execution or proceedings.

Proceedings, Notifications, etc., to be noted in Register.

14. When any execution is issued or other proceedings are taken, or satisfaction is entered, or any notification is given or received relating to any certificate registered under the Act, a note thereof shall be entered in the Register.

EXECUTION OF WRITS OF ATTACHMENT.

Applications to be upon Affidavit.

15. Every application for leave to execute a writ of attachment under Section 19 of the Act shall be made upon affidavit of the facts. Such leave may be granted *ex parte* if the Judge thinks fit.

FORMS.

Title of Proceedings.

16. Every affidavit or other proceedings under Part IV. of the Act may be intituled in Form No. 3 in the First Schedule hereto.

Forms in Schedule.

17. The forms in the First Schedule may be used with such alterations as the circumstances of the case may render necessary; but any variance therefrom, not being in matter of substance, shall not affect the validity or regularity of the proceedings.

FEES AND COSTS.

Fees.

18. The fees to be paid in connection with the service of the process of the Courts of this State under the Act, and the execution and enforcement by such Courts of the process and judgments of the Courts of other States and parts of the Commonwealth, shall be those set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

Costs.

19. Where proceedings are taken to enforce any judgment, a certificate of which has been registered under the Act in any Court, the same costs shall be allowed as upon similar proceedings to enforce a like judgment of such Court.

20. Every application for an order for the plaintiff's costs of registration and other proceedings under Section 22a of the Act shall be made upon affidavit. Such order may be made *ex parte* unless the Court or Judge otherwise orders. The amount of costs to be allowed under the said section shall not exceed six guineas.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

A.—Fees to be paid in connection with the Service of Process of the Courts of this State.

For service of any process issued out of the Courts of Western Australia, and served in any of the other States, the following fees shall be allowed:—

- (a.) If served by an officer of any Court the same amount as would be paid in accordance with the scale of fees in force for the time being, in the Court whereof such person is an officer, for the service of process issued out of such Court.
- (b.) If there is no such scale of fees, or if the process is served by any other person, the amount actually paid to such person in respect of—
 - (i.) the fee paid for swearing the affidavit of service;
 - (ii.) reasonable and necessary expenses of travelling and sustenance; and
 - (iii.) a fee of 7s. 6d., with an additional 7s. 6d. for each day necessarily occupied after the first day.

When more than one attendance is necessary, but can be made on the same day, no additional allowance is to be made.

Where it is necessary to employ a solicitor to effect such service, in addition to the above allowance, a sum of 21s.

B.—Fees to be paid in connection with the Execution and Enforcement by Courts of this State of the Process and Judgments of the Courts of other States and parts of the Commonwealth.
