WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation constitute and define the boundaries of any water reserve or catchment area for the purposes of the said Act, and may vest such reserve or catchment area in the Minister: Now therereserve or catchment area in the Minister: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby constitute the area described in the schedule hereto, with the boundaries as therein defined, a reserve for the purposes of "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," and do hereby vest the said reserve in the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage.

## The Schedule.

Starting at the North-West corner of Lot 204 (subdivision of Swan Location A4) on East Parade; thence Easterly for 542 links along the North boundary of Lot 204, across the right-of-way to the North-West corner of Lot 201, and along the North boundaries of Lots 201, 200, 199, and 198 to the most Northerly corner of Lot 108, thence cheef South by Foot for 1991 below. Lots 201, 200, 199, and 198 to the most Northerly corner of Lot 198; thence about South by East for 1,291 links along the Easterly boundaries of Lots 198 to 179 to Joel Terrace; thence North-Easterly for 21.8 links to the South corner of Lot 232; thence about North by West for 1,296.5 links along the Westerly boundaries of Lots 232 to 214; thence Westerly for 548.5 links along the Southern boundaries of Lots 214 to 210, across the right-of-way to the South-East corner of Lot 205 the right-of-way to the South-East corner of Lot 205, and along the Southern boundary of Lot 205 to its South-West corner on East Parade; thence about South by West for 21.3 links to the starting point; comprising 1 rood and 18.85 perches, and being a 20-link right-ofway from East Parade to Joel Terrace, North and North-West of Gardiner Street.

WHEREAS by a Crown Lease under "The Land Act, WHEREAS by a Crown Lease under "The Land Act, 1898," registered in the books of the office of Land Titles as Crown Lease No. 5096/1913, Avon Location 13342, was granted to J. F. and S. C. Senior as Grazing Lease No. 4416/68, subject to the reservation to His Majesty the King, his heirs and successors, of the right to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said lands which it might at any time be deemed necessary to resume for roads, tramways, railway stations, bridges, canals, towing paths, harbour or river improvement works, drainage or irrigation works, or quarries, and generally for any other works or purposes of public use, utility, or convenience, and such lands quarries, and generally for any other works or purposes of public use, utility, or convenience, and such lands so resumed to hold to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, as of his or their former estate, without making to the said grantee any compensation in respect thereof, so that the lands so resumed should not exceed one-twentieth part in the whole of the land aforesaid, and that no such resumption should be made of any land upon which any buildings should be erected, or should be in use as gardens or otherwise for the more convenient occupation of any such building, without compensation: And whereas it is desirable to resume the land hereinafter described (being a portion of the land granted aforesaid not exceeding one-twentieth thereof) for the purpose of "Public Use" (Schoolsite). Now know Ye that I, the Governor of this State, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that, in exercise of the power contained in the said Crown lease as aforesaid, the land described in the Schedule hereto, being a portion not exceeding one-twentieth of the whole of the land comprised in the said Crown lease was on the 18th day of July, 1917, resumed on behalf of His Majesty, for the purpose of "Public Use" (Schoolsite).

The Plant Diseases Act, 1914. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is desirable to make Regulations under "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," relating to the introduction into Western Australia of any tree or plant from any State or territory of the Commonwealth of Australia where the insect known as Phylloxera vastatrix is known to exist: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby make the Regulations following, numbered two, that is to say:-

- 1. Any tree or plant introduced into Western Australia from any State or territory of the Commonwealth of Australia where the insect known as *Phylloxera vastatrix* is for the time being known to exist shall be accompanied by a Declaration made by the grower before a Justice of the Peace or before an officer of the Department of Agriculture in the State or territory of origin to the following effect:—
  - (a.) That the tree or plant was grown at a greater distance than 50 yards from any grape vine or root thereof; and
  - (b.) That no phylloxera exists or has existed in the nursery or garden in which the tree or plant has been growing.
- 2. If any tree or plant introduced as aforesaid is not accompanied by such Declaration, an Inspector may order it to be detained in a quarantine ground for such time as he shall consider expedient, and may cause the same to be inspected and disinfected in such manner as he may think fit.
- 3. No person shall be entitled to any compensation by reason of any damage to or destruction of any such tree or plant through the action of any Inspector acting under the Regulations.
- 4. If after the 31st day of December, 1917, any person introduces or attempts to introduce or aids in introducing into the State of Western Australia any tree or plant which ought to be accompanied by such certificate as aforesaid and is not so accompanied, he shall be guilty of an offence and be punishable on summary conviction by a fine not exceeding £25.

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any defined portion of the State a Vermin District for the purposes of the said Act, and may specify the boundaries of and assign a name to such District: And Whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that for every district there shall be a Board which shall consist of so many members as from time to time be prescribed by the Governor, and that until the first election of the members of a Board the members shall be appointed by the Governor: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, constitute the Kellerberrin Road District a Vermin District for the purposes of the said Act, under the name of the Kellerberrin Vermin District, and with boundaries in every respect identical with the boundaries of the said Road District: And in the further exercise of the said powers His Excellency the Governor doth, with the advice and consent aforesaid, prescribe eight as the number of members which shall constitute the Board of the said Vermin District, and doth appoint George McLellan, Caleb William Massingham, John Valentine Folerton, Harry Arthur Stanes, William James Jacka, William Clarence Brown, Albert Edward Cornwall Prowse, and Hambly Maynard Growden to be the members of the Board of the said Vermin District.

WHEREAS certain moneys are provided for the destruction of wild dogs; And whereas it is desirable that the payment of such moneys be regulated: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Western Australia doth hereby make and enact the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- 1. Certificates for bonus for the destruction of wild dogs in those portions of the State not being within the district of a Vermin Board may be granted by persons appointed for that purpose under the hand of the Chief Inspector under "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," to an amount not exceeding 10s. per scalp in the South-Western Division of the State, and 5s. per scalp in all other parts of the State: Provided that the Minister may, at his discretion, increase the latter bonus to 10s. per scalp.
- 2. Wild dog scalps shall consist of the tail and two ears with strip of skin connecting them. No other evidence shall be recognised.
- 3. Every wild dog scalp shall be handed to a person appointed under Regulation 1, and such scalp shall forthwith be destroyed by fire in the presence of a third party. Both parties shall sign a certificate that the said destruction has been carried out in the manner aforesaid.
- 4. The bonuses will be paid out of the moneys appropriated for this purpose by orders drawn upon the Department of Agriculture, and issued to the payee by the persons appointed as aforesaid.
- 5. For each wild dog scalp which any Vermin Board appointed under "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," has paid a bonus of 10s. or upwards, the Department of Agriculture may refund to such Board out of moneys appropriated for that purpose a sum of 5s. when such bonus was paid outside the South-Western Division of the State, and a sum of 10s. when such bonus was paid within the South-Western Area.
- 6. For any Vermin Board or Road Board to obtain a refund a statement in writing certified by a member of the Board and the Clerk or Secretary, whichever the case may be, must be sent to the Chief Inspector under "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," giving the names and addresses of the persons to whom bonuses have been paid, the place where scalps have been destroyed, the number of scalps paid for to each person, the date of payment, the amount paid, and the amount claimed from the Department.

Bonus for Destruction of Wild Dogs.

- Bonuses for the destruction of wild dogs within the district of any Vermin Board shall be paid through the Board of the District in which the wild dogs are
- 34. Wild dog scalps must be handed to a clerk or a police constable or a member of the Vermin Board, who shall in the presence of another member of the Vermin Board or police constable or some one appointed for that purrose under the hand of the Chief Inspector under "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," totally destroy such scalps by fire.
- A scalp shall consist of the tail and two ears with strip of skin connecting the ears. No other evidence shall be recognised.
- 36. The Board may grant for every wild dog scalp such bonus as to the Board may seem meet.

- (g) Service in Grade III. shall count from the date at which a teacher was appointed to a position with a minimum of £300.

If a mistress is placed in charge of a department, her salary shall be—Grade III., £240 to £260; Grade II., £270 to £290; Grade I., £300.

Promotion from one grade to another shall be made as provided in section (d) above.

- (a) No one shall be eligible for classification as a Senior Assistant unless he possesses either a University Degree or the Department's 'A' Certificate, and has a record of at least six years' good service as teacher under the Department. Only a limited number of assistants will be promoted to this class.
- (b) Salaries—Men: Grade III., £250 to £270; Grade II., £280 to £300; Grade I., £310 to £340. Women: Grade III., £220 to £240; Grade II., £250 to £270; Grade I., £270.
- (c) Annual increments of £10 shall be given within

- each grade, if provided by Parliament.

- (e) Teachers may be promoted to Grade II. after three years' good service in Grade III., and to Grade I. after three years' good service in Grade II.
- (d) The date from which service shall count for those already on the staffs shall be determined by the Department for each individual case.
- (e) Teachers who hold University Degrees may, if their teaching skill and experience are considered to be adequate, be placed in Grade II. at any time.

#### IV.—First Assistants.

A Master appointed as First Assistant in schools with an average attendance of over 300 shall receive an additional £40, and, in schools with an average attendance of over 150, an additional £30.

A Mistress appointed as First Assistant shall receive, in schools with an average attendance of over 300, an additional £30, and, in schools with an average attendance of over 150, an additional £25.
