Resumption of Land in Kojonup Location 2122. PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by a Crown Grant under "The Land Act. 1898," registered in the books of the Office of Land Titles in Volume 522, Folio 120, Kojonup Location 2122, containing 198 acres 2 roods, was granted to Frederick Vincent Wheeler, of Broome Hill, subject to the reservation to His Majesty the King, his heirs and successors, of the right to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said lands which it might at any time be deemed necessary to resume for roads, tramways, raildeemed necessary to resume for roads, tramways, railway stations, bridges, canals, towing-paths, harbour or liver improvement-works, drainage or irrigation works, or quarries, and generally for any other works or purposes of public use, utility, or convenience, and such lands so resumed to hold to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, as of his or their former estate, without making to the said grantee any compensation in respect thereof, so that the lands so resumed should not exceed one-twentieth part in the whole of the land aforesaid, and that no such resumption should be made of any land upon which any buildings should be erected, or should be in use as gardens or otherwise for the more convenient occupation of any such building, without com-pensation: And whereas it is desirable to resume the land hereinafter described (being a portion of the land granted as aforesaid not exceeding one-twentieth thereof) for the purpose of State School site: Now know ye that I, the Governor of this State, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that, in exercise of the power contained in the said Crown Grant as aforesaid, the land described in the schedule hereto, being a portion not exceeding one-twentieth of the whole of the land comprised in the said Grant, was on the 15th day of August, 1917, re-sumed on behalf of His Majesty, for the purpose of State School site.

#### The Schedule.

That portion of Kojonup Location 2122, containing five acres, bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of Kojonup Location 2122 aforesaid and extending 179deg. 54min. 8 chains 32 3/10 links along part of its East boundary; thence 270deg. 6 chains 1 5/10 links; thence 360deg. to the North boundary of said location; thence 90deg. to the starting (Plan 417D/40.)

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any defined portion of the State a Vermin District for the purpose of the said Act, and may specify the boundaries of and assign a name to such district; And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that for every district there shall be a Board, which shall consist of so many members as may from time to time be prescribed by the Governor, and that until the first election of the members of a Board the members shall be appointed by the Governor: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby, by and with the advice and

consent of the Executive Council, constitute the area described in the Schedule hereto a Vermin District for the purpose of the said Act, under the name of the Ashburton Vermin District: And in further exercise of the said powers, His Excellency the said Governor doth, with the advice and consent aforesaid, prescribe nine as the number of members which shall constitute the Board of the said Vermin District, and doth appoint Joseph McCarthy, Henry Twitchin, Samuel Henry Clark, Onslow McKenzie Clark, John Barrett Lennard, Edmund Alfred Burt, Thomas Frederick de Pledge,  ${f Alexander}$ Stuart Cameron, and Robert Mervyn Forrest to be members of the Board of the said Vermin District.

Subject to the provisions of the Public Service Act, appointments may be made at any salary within those limits. Successful appointees must comply with the life assurance provisions of the Public Service Act and Regulations.

BUSSELTON MUNICIPAL COUNCIL. WHEREAS Model By-laws have been prepared in accordwhere A Model By-laws have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Section 267 of "The Health Act, 1911-15," and published in the Government Gazette on the 20th day of November, 1914; and whereas the Busselton Municipal Council, being a Local Health Authority under the provisions of the said Act, did by resolution published in the Government Gazette on the 28th day of May, 1915, adopt either wholly or in part such Model By-laws to be its By-laws; and whereas by the provisions of the Act aforesaid a Local Health Authority may alter or amend By-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Busselton Municipal Council, being the Local Health Authority for the Busselton Health District, doth hereby amend such By-laws by the addition of the following By-law:—

Part 4.—Dairies and Milk Shops.

3a. No person shall carry on the trade of a dairy-

man or vendor:

(a.) Unless he is the holder of a subsisting license to carry on such trade issued by the Local Authority, or

(b.) On any premises in respect of which he is for the time being not registered by the Local Health Authority as hereinbefore provided.

Provided that the foregoing provisions of this By-law shall not apply during the first week in January in any year, in respect of a person who was lawfully carrying on the trade at the end of the preceding year.

## Survey Fees.

Department of Lands and Surveys 1073/17. Perth, 17th August, 1917.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under Section 161 of "The Land Act, 1898," and its amendments, of the Regulations on the Section 1898, and the Section 1899, and tions applying to Survey Fees set out hereunder, in lieu of those published in the Government Gazette of the 3rd August, 1917:-

- The cost of survey of land shall be in accordance with the scale set out in the First Schedule hereto.
- 2. Except as hereafter provided, where land is selected under Parts V. and VI. of "The Land Act, 1898," the cost of survey, with interest, shall be payable by instalments as set out in the Second Schedule hereto.
- 3. The cost of survey of land purchased by direct payment under Section 57 of "The Land Act, 1898," with interest shall be payable by instalments as set out in the Third Schedule hereto.
- 4. The cost of survey of land purchased under Section 60 of the said Act with interest shall be payable by instalments as set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto.
- 5. The cost of survey of land selected under Part VIII. of "The Land Act, 1898" (Homestead Farms), with interest shall be payable by instalments as set out in the Fifth Schedule hereto.
- 6. (a.) Except as hereafter provided, no application for land under Part V., VI., or VIII. of "The Land Act, 1898," shall be approved, if such land is not surveyed before selection, until the land applied for has been surveyed, classified, and valued.

(b.) On such survey and classification, the applicant may at any time within thirty days, or such extended period as the Minister may allow, from the date of such approval, by notice in writing, served on the Under Secretary for Lands, withdraw his application, and in such cases he shall be entitled to a return of the deposit on account of purchase money or the homestead farm office fee, as the case may be, but shall not be entitled to a return of the instalment on account of the cost of survey. Provided that if the application is not so withdrawn, the applicant shall, at the expiration of such period of thirty days, or such extended period (if any), be deemed to have agreed to purchase the land applied

for at the price fixed by the notice of approval.

(c.) The Minister may, in his discretion, approve of applications before survey, in special cases where the delay in survey and classification in view of the isolation of the land applied for, or other sufficient reason, would cause hardship or inconvenience to the applicant.

1N pursuance of the powers conferred by Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the City of Perth doth hereby order as follows:—

1. The following amendments are made to By-law No. 29:-

- (a) Section 3 of the said By-law is hereby amended by adding after the word "carrier," in the second line, the word "cycle."
- (b) Section 4 of the said By-law is hereby amended by adding the word "cycle," after the word "wagon," in the second line.
- (c) Section 9 of the said By-law is hereby amended by adding after the word 'license,' in line 7, the following words: 'and that in respect of any license granted after the thirty-first day of July in any year the fee payable for such year shall be one quarter of the annual fee for such license,' and Section 49 of the said By-law is hereby amended by adding the same words at the end of such section.
- (d) Subsection (c) of Section 17 of the said Bylaw is hereby amended by eliminating the figures "20," and inserting in lieu thereof the figures "15."
- (e) Section 22, Subsection (b) of the said Bylaw is hereby amended by eliminating, in line one, the following words: "that portion of," and by eliminating, in line two, the following words: "specified in the last preceding clause."

- (f) Section 33 of the said By-law is hereby amended by adding after the word "letters," in the ninth line of such section, the following words: "circle or other mark either white or black."
- (g) Section 35 of the said By-law is hereby amended by adding the following words to the said section: "the identification numbers, unless otherwise authorised by the Traffic Inspector, shall only be used on week-days between the hours of 6 a.m. and 8 p.m. The manufacturer or dealer, or some person in the employ of such manufacturer or dealer, The manufacturer or dealer, or some shall at all times be in attendance with any motor vehicle on which any identification number is being used. If any such motor vehicle to which an identification number issued under this section of the By-law is attached is used in contravention of the provisions of this section, the manufacturer or dealer and/or the person so using the car shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence under this By-
- (h) Clause 41 of the said By-law is hereby amended by adding the following words: "if any smoke, offensive vapour, offensive noise or smell is allowed to be emitted from any motor car, motor cycle, motor wagon, motor carrier, or engine, so as to be an annoyance or danger to the public, the owner or driver of any such motor vehicle shall, except such emission shall arise from a temporary or accidental cause, be guilty of an offence under this By-law."
- 2. The following clauses shall be added to the Bylaw:-

82. All persons or all owners of any vehicle licensed under this By-law are hereby prohibited from parting with or lending any license issued to them personally or in respect of any such vehicle.

83. If the owner of any motor vehicle licensed hereunder sell such vehicle during the currency of the license, he shall forthwith report in writing to the Council the fact of such sale, together with the full name and address of the buyer.

84. The number plates specified in Clauses 33 and 34 to be fixed and kept on motor cars, motor wagons, motor carriers, motor cycles and bicycles, where such motor cars, motor wagons, motor carriers, motor cycles and bicycles are licensed by any Local Authority other than the Council, and are used, driven ridden, or impelled within the municipality, shall comply in all respects with the By-laws from time to time in force in the district of such Local Auth-

3. Schedule "A" to the By-law is hereby amended by adding the word "cycle" after the word "wagon," the first line of the said Schedule.

4. The following Schedule shall be added to the By-

law:-
