Margaret Go'dfield, and extending East about 12 miles to the West boundary of the Burtville State Forest; thence South about 15 miles; thence West in continuation of the South boundary of the Burtville State Forest to the Eastern shore of Lake Carey; thence Northerly and North-Westerly along the said shore of the lake to a point South of the starting point; thence North to the starting point. - 1. Clauses 71 and 72 as originally gazetted on the 13th day of March, 1914, are hereby repealed, and the following clauses substituted therefor:
- 71. Cars plying for hire shall take their places upon any appointed stands in the order of their arrival, each car on arrival taking up its position at the rear of the rearmost car then upon the stand, and when any car shall be called or driven off any stand, the driver of the car immediately behind such car shall draw the same no to the place thus vacated, and the drivers of all other cars standing in the rear of such car shall follow up in a like manner.
- 72. The taxi-car stand appointed in Hannan Street, on the Eastern side of Maritana Street, shall consist of three sections, the First or No. 1 Section being between the first and second electric light poles East of Maritana Street, the Second electric light poles East of Maritana Street, and the Third or No. 3 Section being from the third electric light pole East of Maritana Street and the Third or No. 3 Section being from the third electric light pole East of Maritana Street and theme Eastwards: Provided that no ways then three (2) are about the conventions. more than three (3) cars shall at any one time occupy the First or No. 1 Section, and not more than four (4) cars shall at any one time occupy the Second or No. 2 Section, and provided further that there shall be a space of at least six (6) feet between each car on such First and Second Sections, and provided further that there shall be a space of at least twenty (20) feet between the rearmost car on the First Section and the first car on the Second Section counting from Maritana Street. On the third section in Hannan Street, and on every other appointed stand for which no special provision is made, a space of at least eight (8) feet shall be left after every fourth car for the passage of foot rassengers, and after every eighth ear a space of alleast eighteen (18) feet shall be left for the passage of vehicles.
