WHEREAS it is desirable that a Royal Commission should be appointed to inquire into and report to me upon the cost of the necessaries of life in Western Australia: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do, by this Commission, appoint you, the said Professor Edward O. G. Shann, E. L. Driver, and E. S. Lazarus Commissioners to inquire into and report to me upon the cost of the necessaries of life in Western Australia, the profits made in their disposal to the public, the effects of the fluctuation of prices during the last three years upon the standards of living of wage earners and other persons, and the methods and conditions of production, importation, and distribution of the necessaries of life in Western Australia, and to submit suggestions as to such methods and conditions, and as to the prices at which such necessaries should be sold, so as to give a reasonable and fair profit to the seller, while protecting the interests of the community: And I appoint you, the said Professor Edward O. G. Shann, to be Chairman of the Commission: And I hereby declare this to be a Royal Commission within the meaning of "The Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902": And I do hereby require you, the said Commissioners, to report to me, with all due diligence, your proceedings under this Commission.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by proclamation, prohibit (*inter alia*) all persons from—

(a) Taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture,

in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of any year: And whereas the "Prawn" is a prescribed species of fish within the meaning of this provision: And whereas by Section 17 of the same Act the Governor may, by proclamation, declare what length and depth of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catching any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, revoke the proclamation of the 20th December, 1916, and proclaim and declare as follows:—

That those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule shall be closed against the taking of "Prawns" by means of any net other than a hand-scoop net (such net not to exceed a total length of nine feet upon either the cork line or lead line) from the date of the publication in the *Government Gazette* of this proclamation until the 31st day of December, 1917, inclusive: And further that any net which does not exceed 25 fathoms in length, and has a mesh throughout the whole of the net of not less than one-half inch, measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact, shall be a lawful net when used or intended to be used for the capture of "Prawns"

in any Western Australian waters except those portions defined in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule.

That portion of the Swan River extending in a West-erly and Southerly direction downwards to its entrance at Fremantle from a line drawn from the Point Walter Jetty (Walter Point) to Point Resolution, and the Swan River and its tributaries extending upwards in a Northerly and North-Easterly direction to its head from the Narrows at Mill Point.

That portion of the Canning River and its tributaries upwards to its head from the Lower Canning Bridge.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13, it is provided that the Governor may, by proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, by this proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, by means of sunk nets or set nets, in that portion of Western Australian waters, defined in the Schedule hereto, as from the date of the publication in the *Government Gazette* of this proclamation until the 31st day of December, 1919, inclusive.

Schedule.

The waters of the Canning River situated between a line drawn from the Northern-most extremity of Coffee Point and the North-Western extremity of Cale Street, and the Lower Canning Bridge.

WHEREAS by "The Postponement of Debts Act, 1914," it is provided that the Governor may, on the advice of a Royal Commission, from time to time by proclamation declare that payment of all debts then due or accruing due within the period mentioned in such proclamation, of the classes specified or of persons of the classes specified in the proclamation, or a specified proportion of any such debts, may, subject to such conditions and exceptions as may be contained in such proclamation, be postponed to a date or for a period to be therein specified: And whereas a Royal

Commission appointed under the said Act has advised that payment of all debts incurred in connection with the farming industry now due, or to accrue due within the period commencing on the publication of this proclamation and ending the 30th day of September, 1917, should be postponed to the 1st day of October, 1917, but subject to the conditions that the crops of the debtors are or were charged or intended to be charged to the Colonial Treasurer or the Industries Assistance Board, under and subject to "The Industries Assistance Act, 1915," and except debts incurred on and after the 1st day of March, 1916, for stores by settlers in receipt of cash advances from the Industries Assistance Board, for stores to be procured by such settlers and debts of settlers in receipt of cash advances for the purposes mentioned in paragraph (c) of Section 9 of the said Act, and not for the purposes mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b) thereof: Now therefore I, the said Governor, on the advice of the Royal Commission, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that payment of all debts incurred in connection with the farming industry now due or to accrue due within the period commencing on the date of the publication of this proclamation and ending on the 31st day of December, 1917, is hereby postponed to the 1st day of January, 1918, but subject to the condition that the crops of the debtors are or were charged to the Colonial Treasurer or the Industries Assistance Board under and subject to "The Industries Assistance Act, 1915," and except debts incurred on and after the 1st day of March, 1916, for stores by settlers in receipt of cash advances from the Industries Assistance Board for stores to be procured by such settlers, and of debts of settlers in receipt of advances for the purposes mentioned in paragraph (c) of Section 9 of the said Act, and not for the purposes mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b) thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Health Act, 1911," the City of Perth, being the Local Health Authority administering the said Act for the Municipal District of Perth, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. The following amendments are made to Part III., "Private Hospitals":—

(a.) Section 5 of Part III. is hereby amended by striking out the words "By-law No. 3," in the last two lines, and inserting in lieu thereof the following words and figures, "By-laws Nos. 3 and 4."

2. The following amendments are added to Part VII. of the said By-laws:—

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, the North Fremantle Municipal Council doth hereby make and publish the following By-law No. 12a:—

BY-LAW No. 12a.

1. Every person applying for a license to hawk shall submit for the approval of the Town Clerk the cart, dray, wagon, barrow, truck, or other vehicle proposed to be used for such hawking purposes, and obtain the approval in writing of the Town Clerk for the use thereof; and no licensed person shall, without the like approval, use for hawking any other vehicle, or any approved vehicle after making an addition thereto or alteration thereof, without first having obtained the sanction of the Town Clerk to such alteration.

2. Every person licensed shall have exposed to public view, while hawking, on his licensed vehicle, truck, pack, or basket, his name and licensed number, and the words "licensed hawker" painted in legible and conspicuous Roman letters not less than one inch in length and of

corresponding width, and no person hawking shall be allowed to stand in any street or thoroughfare without first obtaining the leave of the Council.

3. The Council may from time to time, as it shall deem expedient, prohibit hawking in any street or streets or other places within the North Fremantle Municipality, and every licensed hawker shall immediately, on demand, deliver up his license for the purpose of having indorsed thereon the name of such street or streets or other places in which hawking has been prohibited.

4. The Town Clerk may, in his discretion, refuse to grant a renewal of any hawker's license, and in so doing shall not be compelled to give to such person any reasons for such refusal.

5. No unlicensed person shall, within the North Fremantle Municipality, hawk goods, or shall expose any name on any vehicle, pack, or basket purporting to be the name of a licensed person, and every licensed person who shall omit to show to any inspector or other officer of the Municipality or police constable, on demand, his license for hawking, or shall neglect to have painted on his licensed vehicle, pack, or basket, the name, number, or words aforesaid, or fail to keep them legible and conspicuous, or shall, without the approval of the Town Clerk, use any other vehicle than that which has been approved by him, or use such approved vehicle after making an addition thereto, or alteration thereof, without first obtaining the like approval, and generally every person offending against any provision of this By-law, shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Every hawker's license granted by the Town Clerk shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in the Schedule hereto.

7. The Council of the North Fremantle Municipality doth hereby prohibit any person from carrying on the trade or calling of a hawker of fruit, fish, vegetables, or any article of merchandise within the North Fremantle Municipality, unless he be duly licensed in manner aforesaid.

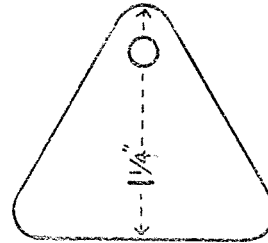

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of and prescribed the following regulations numbered 1 to 5 under the provisions of "The Dog Act, 1903," to come into operation in every Municipal and Road District throughout the State on and from the 1st day of January, 1918:—

1. All regulations previously made under the Act shall be and are hereby repealed as from the 31st day of December, 1917.

2. These regulations shall come into operation and have the force of law in every "District" throughout the State on and from the 1st day of January, 1918.

3. The registration label required by Section 9 of the Act for the year 1918 shall be a flat piece of metal of the size and shape shown at foot hereof, with a hole whereby it shall be affixed.



4. All dogs must have the registration label as prescribed by these regulations securely affixed to a collar and worn round the neck.

5. Any person applying for a license at the lower fee prescribed by the Act for a dog or bitch *bona fide* kept within the meaning of Section 4 of the Dog Act to be employed in tending cattle or sheep shall furnish a statutory declaration as required by "The Evidence Act, 1906," that such dog or bitch is so *bona fide* kept and employed in so tending cattle or sheep, and in the absence of any such declaration the higher fee prescribed by the Act shall be paid.
