Sable Sir William Grey Ellison-Macartney, Privy Councillor, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Pro-clamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, by any specified means of capture, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during specified portion of every year: And whereas it is desirable to revoke paragraph 25 of the Proclamation under the said Act dated the 13th day of December, 1916, prohibiting the taking of fish by means of fishing nets in the waters described in the said paragraph, lawing a profiled town. New theorems, 19th, 1917, 2017. during a specified term: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, revoke paragraph 25 of the said Proclamation, and do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in the waters described in the Schedule hereto, during the period between the beginning of October and the end of April in every year.

Schedule.

The whole of the waters of Hardy's Inlet and the Blackwood River, including its tributaries.

IIIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and Amending Acts for the management of the Dudinin Public Cemetery (Reserve 14995).

BY-LAWS.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Dudinin, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times

and manner therein mentioned.

- 2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the grave-digger.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the ceffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar

of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:-

1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

- 11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.
- 13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.
- 14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.
- 17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.
- 18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.
- 19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.
- 20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.
- 21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.
- 22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.
- 23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.
- 24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of teh remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.
- 25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

Trustees.

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, de-posit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.
31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workmen permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commit an offence against these Bylaws.

33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending

to any grave shall comply with the following rules:

(a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.

(c) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject

to the supervision of the Trustees.
(d) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due

despatch, and only during regulation hours.

34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. Any person who commits a breach of or an of-fence against any By-law may be expelled from the cemetery.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees, held at their office at Dudinin, on the 16th day of June, 1917.

No junior worker with less than three years' experience in a sawmill shall be employed as benchman or dockerman.

2. Classification of Benches.—Benches shall be rated as No. 1, No. 2, No. 3, and No. 4, respectively.

A No. 1 bench means and includes-

- (a.) Any breaking down bench other than one used solely for dividing and spotting logs; and
- (b.) Any other bench capable of taking a saw exceeding 5ft. in diameter; and
- (c.) Any bench which is fed with timber other than spots directly from a breaking down bench used solely for dividing and spotting logs. A No. 2 bench means and includes—

- (a.) Any breaking down bench used solely for dividing and spotting logs; and
- (b.) Any other bench capable of taking a saw over 4ft., but not exceeding 5ft. in diameter.

A No. 3 bench means any bench capable of taking a saw not exceeding 4ft, in diameter.

A No. 4 bench means any bench capable of taking a saw not exceeding 3ft. in diameter.

Provided, however, that in no case shall a bench be rated as lower than a No. 2 bench which takes over 60 per cent. of its timber directly from a breaking down bench. 3. Dockers.—(a.) A main docker means the docker in a mill at which most timber is docked.

- (b.) In mills where the breaking down bench feeds two benches with approximately equal quantities of timber, two dockers shall be rated as "main dockers."
 - (c.) At all dockers the responsible man shall be paid 6d. per shift in addition to
- his rate specified in Clause 1.

 4. Piece-work.—Every employer shall keep a record of the rates paid by him under all piece-work agreements made with workers for work for which no piece-work rate is fixed by this award.

Where a day-work rate is fixed for similar work, the piece-work rate payable under any such agreement shall in no case be less than such as will enable the average worker to earn at least the day-work rate.

All records kept in pursuance of this clause shall be open to the inspection of the union secretary, at all reasonable times, at the nearest office of the employer.

5. Fallers.—(a.) All logs shall be measured at the mill or the bush landing, and with each pay the faller shall be supplied with particulars showing the number of logs, and the measurements of each log included in such pay.

(b.) Should any log be docked such records shall be kept as will enable the faller to identify the log, and the reason for such docking shall be supplied to the faller with his pay.

(c.) Work done in falling trees by order of the bush boss shall be paid for either at the day-work rate for such work or at the piece-work rate for the millable timber

- obtained therefrom, whichever shall be the higher.

 (d.) A faller ordered to cross-cut any log containing less than six loads into two or more logs shall be paid for the time necessarily occupied in so doing at day-work rates.
- (e.) Where head and tail blocks are used trees shall, where necessary, be squarebutted by the faller without extra payment.

(f.) All trees under standard size felled by direction of the bush boss shall be paid for at the rate of 1s. 8d. per load.

6. Holidays. - (a.) The following days, or the days which may be observed in lieu thereof, shall, except in the cases of grooms, feeders, and watchmen, be observed as holidays:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Proclamation Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and Eight Hours' Day.

(b.) Work required to be performed by day-workers other than grooms, feeders,

and watchmen on any of the said days, or on Sundays, shall be calculated and paid for at the rate of time and a half, and, in the case of a guard, with a minimum time

allowance of four hours.

(c.) Work done by piece-workers by direction of the employer or his representative on any of the above-mentioned holidays or on Sunday shall be paid for at one

and a-half times the ordinary rates.

(d.) Each groom, feeder, and watchman shall be entitled to an annual holiday of two weeks' duration on full pay; provided, however, that should the service be brought to a termination before the worker shall have served the 12 months, the said two weeks' holiday shall be commuted to a holiday of one day for each calendar month's

Provided, further, that in case the worker is dismissed for serious and wilful mis-

conduct the provisions of this subclause shall not apply.

The annual holiday shall be granted at such time during the year as may be mutu-

ally agreed upon between the employer and the worker concerned.

7. Hours.—(a.) The week's work, except in the case of watchmen, guards, grooms, and feeders, shall consist of 48 hours, which may be so arranged as to permit of more than eight hours being worked on each of the first five working days of the week in order to provide for a short day being worked on Saturday.

The hours of work for feed-mixers shall be 48 per week of six days, and may be

specially arranged for.

(b.) The hours of duty for night watchmen shall be during seven days per week from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m.

(c.) The hours for guards shall be regulated by the provisions of the agreement

award for the time being covering locomotive drivers and firemen.

- (d.) A minimum fortnightly wage equivalent to 96 hours per fortnight, exclusive of Sundays, at the minimum rate hereinbefore prescribed shall be guaranteed and paid by the employer to each guard ready and available for work: Provided that this subclause shall not be deemed to create on either side a right to 14 days' notice to terminate the service.
- (e.) Each day's work shall stand by itself: Provided that this provision shall not operate to vary the existing custom so far as haulers and swampers are concerned.

 8. Overtime.—(a.) All work required to be performed by workers on daily wages other than guards and hookmen, outside the hours prescribed by the next preceding clause shall be considered overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and as quarter for the first four hours and time and a half for any time in excess of four hours in any week.

(b.) The payment to guards for over-time worked shall be regulated by the provisions of the agreement or award for the time being covering locomotive drivers and

firemen.

- (c.) Hookmen required to unload logs from rakes during the times indicated hereunder shall be entitled, in addition to their ordinary wage, to the following payment per rake at ordinary rate:—
 - (1.) Payment as for half-an-hour's work if the said work is performed during dinner time, or between knock-off time for the day and 6 p.m.
 - (2.) Payment as for one hour's work if performed after 6 p.m. and before darkness.

(3.) Payment as for two hours' work if performed after darkness has set in, or on Sunday, or the holidays hereinafter mentioned.

9. Lower Duties.—Should a worker, to meet the convenience of the employer, be temporarily transferred to perform a class of work carrying a lesser minimum rate of wage than that at which he is usually employed he shall not during such temporary transfer suffer any reduction in his usual wage.

10. Night Shifts.—Where two or more shifts are worked in any mill one shift shall be deemed to be a night shift, and those employed on such shifts shall be en-

titled to receive 1s. per shift extra.

When a mill is worked by night as well as by day the employer shall, as far as possible, arrange that the worker shall be required to work by night only on alternate weeks.

Payment of Wages.—Wages shall be paid monthly: Provided that workers 11. shall be entitled to a payment on account up to 75 per centum of their earnings at least once a week.

12. Payment to Piece-workers.—(a.) Settlements with piece-workers made monthly: Provided that workers shall be entitled to a payment on account of

their earnings at least once a week.

(b.) If any faller has 25 loads, or in the case of two fallers working together, if any such two fallers have more than 50 loads cut in the bush and not paid for on any pay day, he or they shall be entitled to have the same measured by the employer's bush foreman or representative, and the employer shall, through such foreman or representative, issue to the faller a certificate of the result of such measurement. Upon presentation of such certificate at the nearest office of the employer, the worker shall be entitled to payment forthwith to the extent of 90 per centum of the amount disclosed to be due by such certificate,

(c.) If any sleeper hewer has over one load of sleepers cut in the bush and not paid for on any pay day, he shall be entitled to have the same inspected by the employer's bush foreman or representative, who shall issue to the hewer a certificate certifying the number of such sleepers which in his opinion will pass the inspection of the Forest Inspector. Upon presentation of such certificate at the nearest office of the employer the worker shall be entitled to payment forthwith to the extent of 90 per centum of the sleepers so certified.

13. Payment of Fallers and Hewers on Determination of Employment.—(a.)

When the employment of a faller is determined the employer's bush foreman or representative shall forthwith measure up the timber then cut by him and shall issue to him a certificate showing the result of such measurement, and upon presentation of such certificate at the nearest office of the employer the worker shall be entitled to pay-

ment within four hours of the amount thereby shown to be due.

(b.) When the employment of a sleeper hewer is determined the employer's bush foreman or representative shall forthwith inspect the sleepers cut by him and not paid for, and shall issue to the hewer a certificate certifying the number of such sleepers which in his opinion will pass the inspection of the Forest Inspector. Upon presentation of such certificate at the nearest office of the employer the worker shall be entitled to payment within four hours to the extent of 90 per cent. of the sleepers so certified, and to payment of the balance (if any) due to him as soon as such sleepers are passed by the Forest Inspector.

(c.) The foregoing provisions of this clause shall not apply when from any cause the whole of the fallers or sleeper hewers engaged in connection with any mill cease

work in a body.

14. Supply of Shovels.—Navvies and fettlers shall be supplied by the employer with shovels: Provided that when a worker requests a new shovel he shall return the old one, and, provided also, that he shall return his shovel when his employment is determined.

15. Powellising Employees.—Workers engaged in stacking, unloading, loading, or moving powellised timber, or in mixing solution or cleaning out the vats, to be paid at the rate of 9s. 9d. per day while actually employed on that work.

16. Recognition of Union.—(a.) The employers shall officially recognise the appli-

cant union.

(b.) The employers, in the employment of their workers, shall not discriminate against members of the union, nor in the conduct of their business do anything with a view of directly or indirectly injuring the union.

All workers shall work together in harmony.

17. Rents.—The employer shall not during the currency of the award either directly or indirectly increase the rents of the huts or houses now occupied by the workers in or about the mills, nor shall he deprive the worker of any privilege hitherto

enjoyed by him.

Čamps.--Where portable tents, such as those used at Mornington bush camps, 18. are provided for bush workers other than hewers, the labour necessary to shift camp shall be supplied by the employer. In other cases the bush worker, other than hewers, shall be entitled to payment at his ordinary rate of pay for the time he is occupied in shifting camp; with a minimum of four hours' pay. The amount due to a pieceworker under this provision shall in the absence of mutual agreement be calculated on the average of amounts earned by such piece-worker during the three pay periods imme-

diately preceding.

19. Sanitary. -No rate shall be charged by the employer for the use of earth closets, now provided at the mills for the convenience of the workers during working Where sanitary service or removal of rubbish or both is or are being carried out by the employer no increase in the charge at present imposed on the workers shall be made, other than is reasonably sufficient to make such service or services self-

supporting.

20. Stores.—Where the employer supplies the workers with stores and supplies the prices charged shall not on the average be more than 10 per centum above the prices generally current in Perth for articles of a similar description and quality sold in like quantity.

A current price list of the stores, groceries, ironmongery, and standard lines of drapery on sale shall be kept available for the use of customers in a conspicuous place

in each store, setting forth the price of each such article on sale therein.

21. Stoppages.—All saws shall be changed in the employer's time, and any delay or stoppage occasioned by changing saws, repairing belts, breakage of machinery, or other cause shall be counted as working time and paid for: Provided that if any delay or stoppage occurs and a signal be given allowing workers to leave their work for at least half-an-hour the worker shall not be entitled to payment for time lost, and in that event the men shall resume work on the signal being given for the purpose.

22. Travelling Time.—(a.) Navvies shall be entitled to full pay for time occu-

pied in travelling from their camp to work.

(b.) A worker called upon to work away from his home station shall be entitled to payment at ordinary rates for the time necessarily occupied in travelling to and from his work.

23. Truck Loading.—When big sleepers are being loaded two men shall be employed when tailing up.

24. Turning Sleepers.—When sleepers are required to be turned as if for inspection by a Forest Inspector whilst being loaded by piece-work the loaders shall be entitled to receive the turning rate, in addition to the loading rate for such sleepers.

Time Sheets.—Time sheets shall be provided for guards to enable them to

sign on and off duty daily.

26. Under-rate Workers.—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed, may be employed at a lesser rate of wage to be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the applicant union, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to such secretary, stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon application of such worker after 24 hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall if he so desire be heard by the magistrate upon such application.

After having made application to the secretary, and after lodging the application to the magistrate, and pending the decision in either case, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed by the employer at the proposed reduced wage.

The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for six calendar from the date thereof and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall be again fixed in the manner prescribed at the instance of the said secretary.

The secretary may, by writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of any such application before a magistrate.

27. Locality.—This award shall have effect over that portion of the State comprised within the South-West Division, as described in "The Land Act, 1898," except such portion of the said division as is comprised within a radius of fourteen miles

from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

28. Term.—This award shall be binding upon the above-named applicant and respondents for the term of three years from its date: Provided that, at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date, the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.
