WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Pearling Act, 1912," it is made lawful for the Governor to close any portion of a pearl-shell area and to prohibit the gathering, collection, or removal of any pearls or pearl-shells within or from the portion so closed, for a specific period: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the whole of that portion of the Sharks Bay Pearl-shell Area known as Broadhurst Bight, comprising the waters from Cape Lesueur Northwards to Cape Peron with a width of two (2) miles from high water mark and known as No. 1 Section, West of Peron Peninsula, shall be closed, and that the gathering, collection, or removal of pearls or pearl-shells within or from the portion so closed shall be prohibited: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby directs that the above-mentioned portion of the said Pearl-shell Area shall be closed, and that the gathering, collection, or removal of pearls or pearl-shells within or from the portion so closed shall be prohibited for a period of one (1) year from and including the 14th day of October, 1917.

KALGOORLIE ROAD BOARD.

WHEREAS under the provisions of “The Health Act, 1911-15,” the Local Health Authority may make By-laws and may amend any By-laws so made; and whereas the Kalgoorlie Road Board is a Local Health Authority

under the provisions of the said Act; now, therefore, the said Road Board under the provisions of the said Act doth hereby amend its By-law No. 10, published on page 3078 of the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd August, 1912, by the addition of the following paragraphs:—

- (h.) The occupier of any premises shall not allow any horse, cow, sheep, or goat to be loose in any yard or place unless and until due provision is made to prevent such horse, cow, sheep, or goat from approaching to within twenty feet of any dwelling or within twenty-five feet of any shop, factory, bakery, or other place where food is manufactured, stored, or exposed for sale.
- (i.) The occupier of any premises whereon a horse is kept shall provide a stable constructed of approved materials, but paved with impervious materials, and it shall not be at any less distance than twenty-feet of any dwelling house nor less than fifty feet from the milking shed or milk room of any dairy.
