WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

And whereas the City of Perth has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been dedicated for a street or way within the Municipality of Perth, be declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date

of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

ALBANY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL BY-LAWS.

WHEREAS by Section 267 of "The Health Act, 1911-15," the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws, and whereas Model By-laws have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the said section, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th November, 1914, which By-laws have been adopted by the Albany Municipal Council, being a Local Health Authority within the meaning of the said Act, and such By-laws have, therefore, become the By-laws of the said Albany Municipal Council, and whereas a Local Authority may under the provisions of the said Act amend its By-laws from time to time: Now, there-

fore, the Albany Municipal Council does hereby amend its By-laws as follows:—

Part IV., Schedule "C" is hereby amended to read as follows:—Fees to be paid for license or registration in respect to the trade of a dairyman or vendor of milk.

(a) Any person carrying on the trade of vendor of milk shall pay an annual registration fee of 2s. 6d.

Part X, Schedule "D" is hereby amended by the insertion at the end thereof of the following:—  
"Bone Manure Depot"—£2.

ROTTNEST ISLAND.

*By-laws.*

PURSUANT to the powers contained in "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," and with consent of the Governor in Council the Rottnest Board of Control doth hereby make the following By-laws, that is to say:—

*Injuring or destroying trees.*

1. No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, remove, or destroy any tree, shrub, plant, or flower growing on the said Island, or cut or remove any dead wood or timber therefrom.

*Injuring the soil or surface or fences, etc.*

2. No person shall cut up, or damage, or disfigure, or interfere with the soil, or turf, or surface of any part of the said Island, or the roads or footways across, around, or over the same, or with any part of the fences, buildings, rock work, watercocks, or seats around or upon the same, pollute or interfere with any ornamental water thereon, or interfere or destroy any birds or animals thereon, in any manner whatsoever.

*Persons misconducting themselves.*

3. No person shall misconduct himself in any way by indulging in any riotous or indecent conduct, or make use of any indecent or improper language, or commit any nuisance on the said Island.

*Remaining overnight on the Island.*

4. No person shall remain on the said Island overnight or frequent the said Island for the purpose of remaining thereon overnight, unless the consent in writing of the Board of Control or of an officer of the Board authorised in that behalf shall have been previously obtained.

*Posting bills.*

5. No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix, or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, stencilled, painted, or otherwise affixed any placard, hand bill, notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, flagging, road, path, or any place whatsoever on the said Island

unless the consent in writing of the Board of Control or of an officer authorised in that behalf shall have been previously obtained.

*Shooting, etc., on the Island.*

6. No person or persons shall shoot or discharge any firearms, or throw or discharge any stone or other missile, or set off any fire balloon, or throw or set fire to any fireworks, or kindle or make any fire on any portion of the Island, unless the consent in writing of the Board of Control or an officer of the Board authorised in that behalf shall be previously obtained.

*Selling goods on the Island.*

7. No person or persons shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, merchandise, or things on any portion of the said Island, unless the consent in writing of the Board of Control or an officer of the Board authorised in that behalf shall be previously obtained.

*Races, etc., on the Island forbidden.*

8. No person or persons shall take part in any racing matches with horses, dogs, or otherwise, nor in any game of polo, or any other game which may by the Board of Control be considered dangerous, or calculated to interfere with the safety or comfort of the general public, or likely to injure the surface of the ground, except on such portions as may be specially set apart for such purposes, and shown thereon by boundary posts; such boundary posts may be fixed and renewed from time to time as the Board of Control may deem necessary.

*Waste litter of picnics to be removed.*

9. Every person who shall at any time play any game, or picnic on the said Island, shall, after the completion of such game or picnic and prior to leaving the ground, collect and remove, or cause to be collected and removed, all waste material, bottles, broken glass, scraps, paper, litter, or rubbish of any kind brought on to or made upon the ground by him.

*Dogs or other animals not to be allowed on Island.*

10. No person shall cause or suffer any dog or other animal to be upon the Island without the special approval of the Board of Control or an officer of the Board authorised in that behalf.

*Permits to land must be obtained.*

11. No person (not being a person exempted under Regulation 15 hereof) shall land on Rottnest Island without first having obtained a permit hereunder, or remain on Rottnest Island longer than authorised by the said permit.

*From whom permits obtainable.*

12. Permits may be granted by any captain of any steamer travelling between Perth and Rottnest Island or Fremantle and Rottnest Island, or any authorised collector or officer of the Board at Rottnest on payment of a fee of sixpence.

*Form of permit.*

13. Every permit shall state the name of such person to whom it is issued, the date of issue, and the time when such permit expires, and no permit shall be transferable.

*Holders of permits.*

14. Every person in possession of a return steamer ticket issued by McIlwraith, McEacharn, & Co., Proprietary, Limited, or by the authorised officers of the Harbour and Light Department, shall be deemed to be a holder of a permit under these by-laws.

*Exemptions.*

15. The following persons are exempted from the provisions of this regulation:—Children under 14 years of age, officials and workmen of the Board, members of the Board, permanent residents, officers of a Government Department (State or Federal), or of the Fremantle Harbour Trust.

*Trespassers.*

16. Any person (not being a person exempted under Regulation 15 hereof), landing at Rottnest Island without first having obtained a permit or, who having obtained a permit remains on Rottnest Island after the

period for which his permit was issued, shall be deemed a trespasser, and shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations.

*Penalty.*

17. Any person who is guilty of any contravention (by act or omission) of any of the foregoing regulations shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20.
